

1994 5A-4A State Meet

CHOCTAW--The big schools' 1994 State Track Championships got underway here at Choctaw High School Friday May 13th and finished up Saturday May 14th with team and individual champions crowned in two classes, 5A and 4A.

The weather varied from warm and cloudy to hot and sunny with only a few moments of rain actually falling during the meet though there was substantial rain prior to both days' events. Sprinters's times were hampered by the wind and the distance races had to deal with the heat and humidity.

Choctaw High School's new eight-lane track was pronounced an excellent facility by coaches and participants and also served as the site for the 3A-2A meet the previous weekend. There is a good chance that one or both of these meets will return next year.

5A Boys Tigers Take 5A Boys

The Norman Tigers put together a well-balanced team effort, capturing four individual events and placing well in all relays, to out-distance runnerup Enid, 91-83 for the 5A Boys state championship, the sixth state championship for coach Pat Lenington who has been at Norman's head coach since 1965.

B.T. Washington's Demetrius Birch was the meet's high point scorer, as well as for all the boys' state meets, with 31 points. He won the 100 meter dash and ran on the winning 400 meter relay team and took second in the 200/400 meter dashes.

Norman's Terry Blackshire captured both the hurdle events while Enid's Chance Rush was a double winner in the 1600/3200 meter runs.

One of the most anticipated events of the meet was the 3200 meter relay which saw Putnam City edge Norman 7:47.07 to 7:47.15. The time was good for a state meet record but fell short of the state record

Another great opportunity for our elite athletes is the Great Southwest Classic which will occur in Tempe, Ariz., May 28th. Two teams of our best will be competing there again this year (also listed in this issue) and you can look for results in the special summer track issue in July.

Two of the state's most successful coaches announced their retirement in the past few weeks and they will leave some awfully large shoes to fill. Plainview's Elvin Sweeten and Jenks' John McGinnis have stepped down at two of the state's top programs. Good luck to their successors.

This is the last issue for many subscribers and renewal notices will go out shortly--as a bonus for renewing you will get the summer track issue in July so don't delay, renew now. Cross country season is just around the corner with the first regular issue of the season set to be out near the 1st of September so don't take a chance on missing any of these issues.



which is 7:46.9 set by Guthrie in 1985. Putnam City's team was comprised of Daniel Phillips, Chris Tripplett, Billy Miller and Ben Pittman.

The only other meet record fell when B.T. Washington's 400 meter relay team ran a 41.21 to take .01 seconds off their own record set in the prelims in 1984.

5A Girls Hornets Win Third Straight

Booker T. Washington's 1600 meter relay team came through in the state meet's final event. The Hornet's trailed Union by four points going into the 1600 meter relay but scored 12 as they finished third to capture their third straight Class 5A girls' state championship in a row, defeating runnerup Union 92-84.

Coach Greg Nash's Hornets were the only 5A-4A pre-meet favorite to come away with a first-place trophy which he credited to their strength in the relays where they won two and placed third and fifth in the other two.

Three girls scored double victories: Union's Leslie Schlegel in the shot/discus and teammate Lucretia Mays in the 100/long jump; and Shawnee's Natalie Mann in the 1600/3200. Mays was the only girls to break a state meet record, sailing 19-7 in the long jump to eclipse the old mark of 19-4.5 set by John Marshall's Leah Kirklin in 1988.

Mays was also the only 1993 champion to repeat--in both the 100 and long jump-while Mustang's three-time 1600 meter champion, Kim Winter, fell to Mann and discus champ Vicki Moore of Eisenhower finished third.

The Norman girls ran an outstanding 3200 meter relay in the first final of the meet, turning in a season-leading best time of 9:37.90. The team was comprised of Sherry Horton, Brandi Kappel, Stephanie Adams, and Andrea DeLozier.

4A Boys Demons Destroy the Field

Duncan's Demon boys made it look easy, leading from start to finish in the Class 4A boys meet, outdistancing second-place teams (tied) Edmond North and John Marshall, 102-56. Edmond North had been a season-long favorite but had slipped to only slight favorites following regional competition. Coach Jim Beckhams' Demons' title was their third in four years.

In the concluding 1600 meter relay Douglass was disqualified for stepping off the track and even though John Marshall won the race anyway, Edmond North gained enough points to tie the Bears for second.

Duncan nabbed only two individual event wins and one relay but scored in all two other relays and eight individual events.

Double event winners were Douglass' Detrick Marsh, who took both the 100 and 200 meter dashes, and Northeast distance specialist, Cornelius Mason, who added the 1600 and 3200 meter run golds to his fall cross country gold.

<u>4A Girls</u> Lady Tigers Nip Bears

Though it was forecast as a close race, the Ardmore Tigers' victory over perennial 4A girls' state champion, John Marshall, has to be rated as the upset of the state championship series. Coach Clyde Ellis' Bears had won 17 of the past 18 championships and were in the driver's seat headed for another when injuries suddenly put the title up for grabs prior to regional competition.

And grab it they did as Coach Lee Ann Muskgrove's Tigers assaulted the meet, grabbing victories in two relays and placing second and third in the others to score 122.33 points to the Bears' 116. Ardmore scored in 13 of 16 events with 12 qualifiers and what has to be scary for the rest of the class is that they return 10 of 11 point scorers.

Two meet records fell on the opening day as Ardmore's Shana Dowdy tossed the shot 41-10 to eclipse the old mark of 41-6.5 by Tiffanie Selmon of Douglass in 1989 and the McGuinness 3200 meter relay team of Lori Greenlee, Ashley Boothe, Kim Keaton and Jessica Hoke bettered the old mark of John Marshall in 1987 of 9:43.45 with a 9:42.70.

Andrea Bell of McLain bettered the 300 meter hurdles' record with a time of 44.35, topping the old mark of 44.94 by John Marshall's Drake in 1987.

McGuinness freshman Ashley Boothe was the girls' only double winner, taking both the 1600 and 3200 meter runs.

John Marshall junior Jameka Roberts was the only repeat winner, taking the 800 meter run for the second straight year





State Championships

At Choctaw Class 5A Boys
