

Cross Country Season At Halfway Point

The 1993 cross country season has just about reached the halfway point with only a little more than four weeks until the state championship meet at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa October 30th. Jenks will host their Trojan Review on the state course October 8th which will give teams a chance to preview the course which was the same

one used last year.

With another eleven or twelve meets contested over the past two weeks the team rankings are getting a bit easier though it is certainly staying tight at the top of the 5A boys rankings with Norman taking a double whammy at the UCO/Lake Arcadia Challenge when their top ranked Joey Donnelly was soundly beaten by Enid's Chance Rush and the Edmond Memorial Bulldogs bit them for the team title 60-71. Rush gets his turn at the top of the individual rankings while Jenks, following a strong performance at the Holland Hall Invitational II gets the nod in the team rankings. Hopefully we will get a chance to see this group head to head at the OSU Jamboree Saturday, October 2nd.

5A girls certainly aren't hard to figure out—Bartlesville has bashed overybody on the planet with the only question at the moment being: where does everybody else fit? Jenks' Carissa Nix and Shawnee's Natalie Mann haven't met yet and are both undefeated against 5A competition but Mann has been impressive in her OBU and UCO (new course record) wins and has not been beaten by anybody yet this season while Nix dropped a race against Cascia Hall's three-time state 3A champion, Natalie Gray, last week at the Holland Hall Invitational II. They should meet up at OSU this weekend along with just about

everybody else.

The 4A girls class got a lot tougher last week with the still not official word that the new Edmond North team has been placed in this class. At press time there was still no official confirmation from the Oklahoma State Secondary Schools Activity Association which has the final say on class assignments. There is a rule that allows a school without seniors to move down one class and this is apparently what will permit Edmond North in 4A in spite of attendance figures that put them in 5A.

With Edmond North in 4A their girls certainly have to be placed at the top. They

It has been a very exciting cross country season so far and promises to be even better as the season progresses. I'm getting a great response on meet reports even though it isn't completely 100%. Lack of information from the far reaches of the state make it difficult, at best, to do a fair ranking in the two smaller classes but I can only use what hits my desk. Don't forget to remind meet directors to send complete results ASAP. I will use at least the top 20 and it helps for ranking purposes to have the full results even if I don't have space to use them all.

The Meet of Champions is now official and will be held Saturday, November 6th, on the Oklahoma State University course the week following the State Championship Meet at

Oral Roberts University in Tulsa.

For those coaches, fans, parents and athlete's that would like a preview of the Meet of Champions you might sneak down to Stillwater Saturday October 2nd when the OSU Cowboy Jamboree will be held on the same course. This is one of the oldest (if not the oldest) cross country races in the state and the format puts all classes together in one race. I know that most of the top teams in the state will be their and it will be an opportunity to see some of the very best from every class compete at the same time.

Another great meet to watch will be the Razorback Invitational which is held at the University of Arkansas' golf course October 16th. Close to 15 Oklahoma teams will join some of the best teams from Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri and Texas on one of the most challenging courses in the

area.

I'm getting a better return on TEAM REPORTS and it is getting a little easier to do the class rankings that appear elsewhere in this issue but if you are a coach and still haven't sent your TEAM REPORT, please do so--there are still three more issues to come covering the balance of the season and they are very important to our coverage of regional and state meets.

There are over 10 meets covered in this issue again and they are the main source of information used in the rankings. I know that I have left runners out and misplaced others and I hope that those that notice these errors would be kind enough to let me know so that I can continue to improve the rankings. I still like to remind everyone that these rankings are only for fun and that we are all happy that the runners themselves get to decide the real results at the end of the season.

The first issue of <u>Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS</u> was mailed to just about every coach in the state and I'm still encouraged by the response. However, I know there are many parents and athletes still out there that haven't had the opportunity to see or read their own copy and I'd like to remind my subscribers that it is their responsibility to spread the word. I'm happy to send a free copy to anyone that hasn't had a chance to see one and I encourage coaches to let me have the names and addresses of those they think might be interested.


had a solid win over the best of the rest at OBU including 5A girls power Moore. But last year's 4A state champion, Bishop McGuinness has started moving up with two wins by freshman Ashley Boothe and the return of defending state champion Jessica Hoke to the lineup. The Irish, along with Durant, can be expected to give Edmond North plenty of competition for the state championship. North's Megan Toole hasn't lost to a 4A competitor yet with wins over Boothe and Durant's Courtney Moody so she gets the top individual spot in 4A.

The Irish boys have held on to the top spot in 4A boys since the beginning of the season and the defending state champions hope to do it again though runnerup Guthrie is going to do everything they can to reverse the outcome. Guthrie's Justin Bumgardner has held the top spot all season and hasn't been beaten by a 4A runner yet though Northeast's Cornelius Mason and McGuinness' Clay Axton are nipping at his heels.

3A rankings aren't all that tough to figure, at least at the top. Nothing new here as the incredible Plainview girls and Marlow boys keep their iron-fisted grip on the top spots and hold down second to each other as well. Cascia Hall's Gray hasn't met Plainview's Sarah Harvey yet this year but has been impressive so far, beating Jenks' Nix last week at Holland Hall and since she is the three-time defending champion and beat Harvey last year, she gets the top spot until she gets beaten. Marlow's Junior Minson keeps his spot on top of the boys rankings and if the Outlaws and Indians have anything left after beating each other up at state they should be right at the top in the Meet of Champions.

Getting enough results to make 2A rankings is really a two-fold problem--not enough class only competition and meet reports that don't go deep enough to include the small school competitors that finish behind the larger class division runners. Any input from coaches in this class is welcome even if it is only about your own runners. With that aside it looks like Sequoyah Tahlequah stands on top in both boys and girls divisions with Velma-Alma's Crystal Fuller and Elmore City's Casey Langdon holding down the top individual spots. This is still a very wide-open class and the Trojan Review race at Oral Roberts October 2 should give a better indication of where everyone stands.

Don't forget that these team and individual rankings represent <u>only</u> our best guesses from the information we've received up to press time and we hope that no one gets offended if they feel left out or misplaced—just let us know so we can make it better next time.

Duncan Invitational Haliburton Recreation Area 9/25/93

DUNCAN--The weather was perfect for a cross country race here September 25 but the previous days' rain left the beautiful course around the Haliburton Recreation Area a muddy trail which had runners slipping a sliding their way through a true cross country experience.

No surprises in the small school divisions as Plainview and Marlow traded first and second again with the Outlaw boys and Indian girls taking home all the top hardware. Plainview's Sarah Harvey had the top girls' time of the day with a 13:05 over the muddy 3,300 meter course while Marlow's Junior Minson added another trophy to his collection with a 17:24 5k.

In the large school division the Bishop McGuinness girls gave notice that they are back, handing Durant their first 4A loss of the season 34-45. Irish freshman Ashley Boothe was the top individual finisher with a 13:28 with Durant sophomore Courtney Moody in second at 13:32.

On the boys side the Irish didn't fare so well as the Eisenhower boys claimed first and second in a photo finish won by Brian Powell who just barely out-leaned teammate Eric Hatcher at the line for the win in the day's best time of 17:11. Ike went on to claim the team title over McGuinness 36-63.





In Our Mailbag


Dear Sir:
