State Championship Preview

The frost is on the pumpkin so it must be time for another cross country state championship meet with this year's race at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa promising to be a real barn burner. The full schedule as well as regional results are inside this issue which is also serving as the official program for the championships.

Three individual champions are back to defend their titles as well as two previous winners. Cascia Hall's senior Natalie Gray is seeking an unprecedented fourth title in 3A while Jenks' senior Brian Young is looking to repeat as 5A boys champion after finishing second as a sophomore. Sophomore Jessica Hoke from McGuinness will be on the line to defend her 4A title though she has missed most of the season due to injuries. Plainview senior Michelle Goode won in 1990 as a freshman and Beaver senior Amy Herchock won as a sophomore in 1991. Both will be in the field for the 1993 championships.

None of the defending champions have managed to go unscathed through the season and only Young is going into the meet with the number one ranking which he won back from Enid's Chance Rush in the east regional last week. Gray was beaten by Plainview's Sarah Harvey, last year's runnerup, at the Jenks Trojan

CC Review Oct. 8 and is ranked second. Hoke, ranked fifth, was third at the Trojan Review, one second behind number one ranked Courtney Moody of Durant, last year's runnerup, but the 4A girls' field is very tight through the top five or six with Claremore's Annie Forsberg and Hoke's McGuinness teammate, freshman Ashley Boothe, both capable of winning the title also.

Jenks stands a chance of having two individual winners with both Young and junior Carissa Nix holding the top individual rankings. Nix hasn't lost to a 5A competitor yet this year with Shawnee's Natalie Mann her closest competition so far. Guthrie's Justin Bumgardner has held the top spot in 4A all year but hasn't had to run again number two, Northeast's Cornelius Mason, who won the west regional impressively last week.

Marlow's Junior Minson has held the top spot all season in 3A boys but can be expected to be challenged by fast improving Jason Jones of Santa Fe and Dickson's Mark Lampkin. In the 2A divisions Big Pasture freshman Becki Johnson has steadily improved all year and won the west regional with east regional winner Tara Overstreet expected to be right there with her at the state meet. If I don't have a TEAM REPORT on file I probably can't answer their questions so please, at least let me know who the seniors are on your teams.

I have really enjoyed getting to know the high school coaches this season and I hope to get to know them all in the years to come. I'm short staffed and can't make it to every meet, consequently my photographs will center around where McGuinness is competing, at least for the time being but I'm happy to use any good action shots that are fully identified and I will gladly return them when I'm through.

The next issue of Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS will contain complete coverage of the state championships including photographs and will preview the Meet of Champions being held for the first time this year at Oklahoma State University November 6th. The top three teams and top 15 individuals in each division from the state meet will be invited to compete in this race which should be one of the best races of the season. ingo's Vince McClain gets the top spot on the boys side by virtue of his west regional victory over Lindsay's number-two ranked Charles Cameron.

In the team races, Norman takes back the number one ranking in 5A boys from Jenks after an outstanding performance in the west regional. Coach Pat Lenington's Tigers have not been at full strength since early in the season when they traded two-point victories with Jenks. But don't count coach John McGinnis' Trojans out yet; they are going to be highly motivated to capture a record-setting sixth straight team title and with the meet on their home course, anything can happen.

Though the Moore girls finally seemed to get their act together in winning the west regional the only question in the 5A girls' division will be Bartlesville's margin of victory. Coach Mike Adair's Bruins have won ten straight meets this year and couldn't be faulted for looking ahead to the Meet of Champions next week when they will get to go head-to-head with the awesome Plainview Indians, the hands down favorite in the 3A division and considered by most observers to be the best girls team in the state, period.

In the 4A division McGuinness hopes to become only the third school in the state history to repeat as both boys and girls champions, a feat only accomplished by Edmond and Jenks. The Irish of coach David Morton have held on to the double number one ranking since the Trojan Review but they face stiff challenges from the Guthrie boys and Edmond North's girls. The Irish girls definitely have a dynasty in mind with only one senior in their top seven though an equally young Guthrie team will be gunning for them next year. Morton, the Meet of Champions director, will also be hoping to take home some hardware from Stillwater next week.

Not intending to slight the competition, but the toughest thing for the Plainview girls is just making the team which almost guarantees an All-State jacket. Coach Jerry Naylor has his eye on the future as well with no end in sight to the talent on his squad. The Marlow Outlaws of coach Jimmy Brackeen have dominated the 3A boys division all year and have designs upon a top three finish in the Meet of Champions which will pit the top three teams of each division against each other November 6th at Oklahoma State University in Stillwater.

There hasn't been a clear favorite in the 2A divisions all year but with Lindsay dropping down from 3A coach Clark Cameron's team gets the top boys spot while Beaver returns to the favorite's roll in the girls race after edging Velma-Alma by three points in the west regional.

West Regional Purcell Golf Course 10/23/93

PURCELL—It was a beautiful day for cross country, sunny and cool, here Saturday, October 23rd for the West Regionals. The top six teams and 20 individuals in each division qualified for the state meet next Saturday, October 30th, at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa.

Norman's Joey Donnelly had the fastest time of the day on the boys' course with a 15:36 clocking while leading his Tigers to a comfortable 5A team victory over Eisenhower, 40-67. Shawnee's Natalie Mann claimed the fastest girls' time of the day with an 11:40 for the two-mile circuit while the Moore girls showed they are a force to be reckoned with as they grabbed the 5A team title over Shawnee, 38-77.

McGuinness continued their domination of the 4A division, taking both team titles with nine runners in the top ten of both races. Freshman Ashley Boothe took top individual honors in the girls' race while Northeast's Cornelius Mason cruised to the boys' individual title.

In the 3A division the Plainview girls notched the lowest score of the day as they stormed to another team trophy behind the 1-2-3 punch of Sarah Harvey, Lacey Sanford and Emily McCulloh. The Indians scored 16 points to runnerup Marlow's 52. On the boy's side the outcome was reversed with the Outlaw boys winning the team trophy behind the top individual performance of Junior Minson.

In the closest team race of the day the Lindsay boys edged Keyes by one point, 48-49, for the 2A boys' title with their own Charles Cameron winning the individual title. For the girls, Big Pasture's freshman, Becki Johnson, took the individual crown while Beaver edged Velma-Alma 34-37 for the team title.

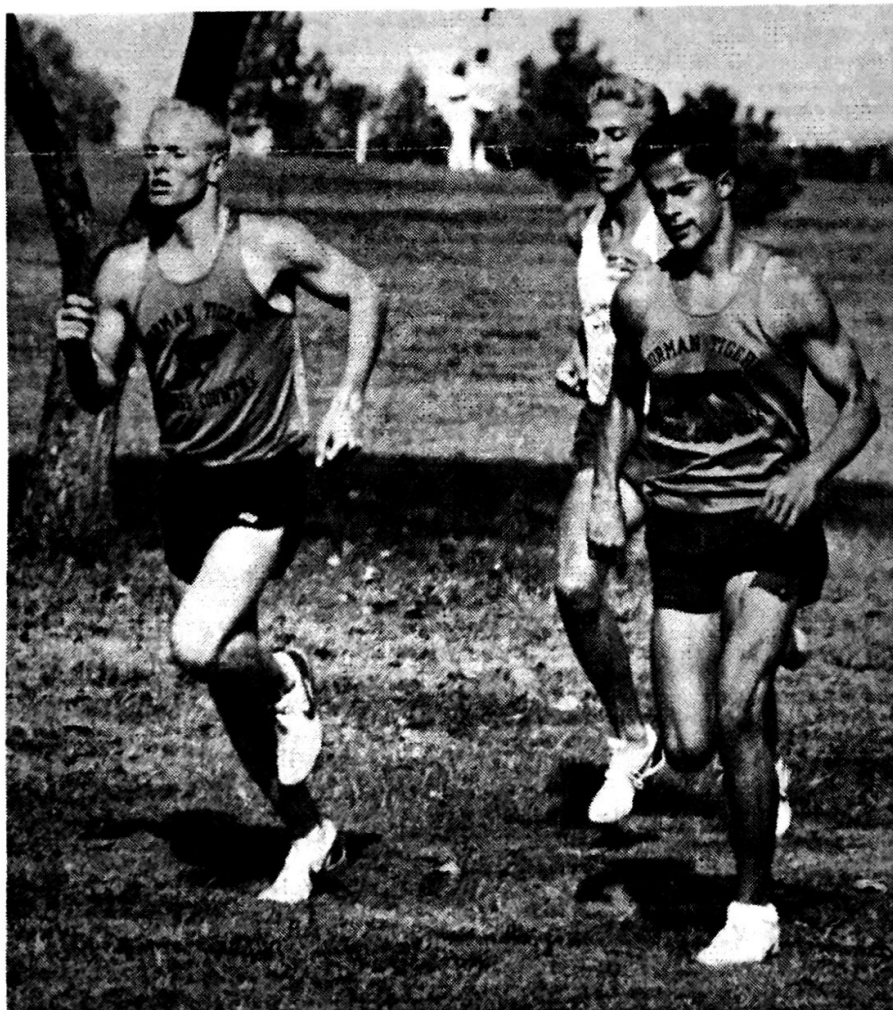

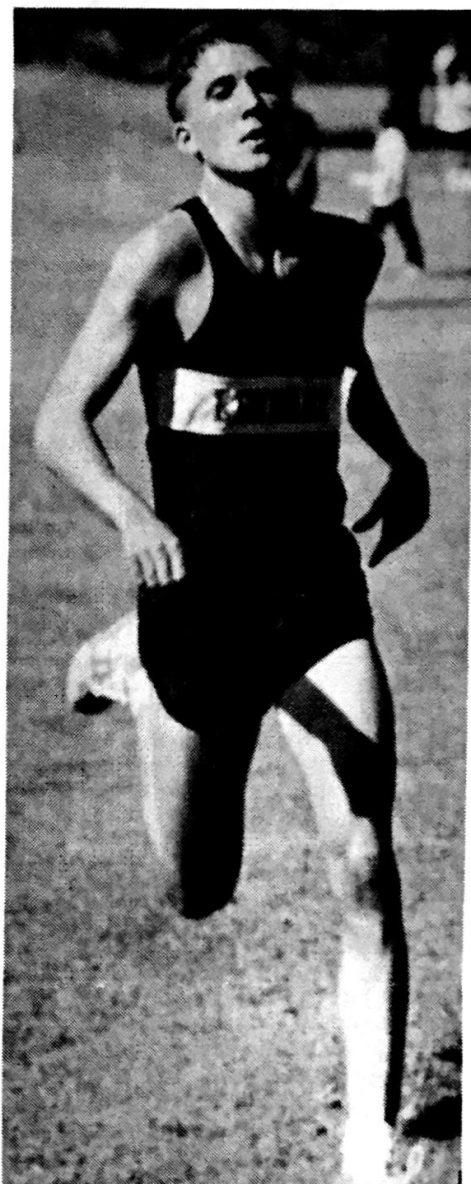

Oklahoma Secondary School Activities Association History

The beginning of the Oklahoma Secondary School Activities Association dates back to the year of 1911 when some of the state's most prominent educators met and began to draw up rules that would produce a degree of fairness for competition between schools. The first playoff that led to a state championship was boys' basketball in 1918. A state championship for girls was established in 1919.

The association of high schools grew steadily during the early years of this century. By 1925 a full time secretary was employed. In 1927 Mr. Lee K. Anderson was selected to serve as the first full time executive secretary. Mr. Anderson served in this capacity for forty years. Mr. Leo Higbie succeeded Mr. Anderson in 1967 after working as his assistant since 1947. Mr. Claud White was employed by the O.S.S.A.A. in 1967, became the executive secretary in 1972 and retired in 1986. Ivan Evans was named as an interim executive secretary during the first six months of 1987. In June of 1987, Mr. H. J. Green assumed the duties of the executive secretary and served until January 1991. After employment with the association for eighteen and one-half years, Bill Self was selected as executive secretary and now serves in that position.

The early years of the O.S.S.A.A.'s history were primarily devoted to establishing eligibility rules and conducting state championships in basketball. The late 1930's and throughout the 1940's and 50's, the association's athletic responsibilities grew to include all the sports being offered to boys in Oklahoma's high schools. Girls' sports were primarily limited to girls' basketball in the state's smaller schools and tennis, golf and swimming in the larger

schools. By 1967, thirty-eight state championships were being conducted in eleven sports.

The expansion of the O.S.S.A.A. was ignited in the 1960's by two events. In 1961 the O.S.S.A.A. was changed from an athletic association to an activities association. This change brought music, speech, debate and drama competitions under the jurisdiction of the O.S.S.A.A. The 1960's also saw the expansion of girls' athletics to equal the opportunities that were available to boys. With the addition in 1989 of academic bowl competition and competitive cheerleading, the O.S.S.A.A. will crown 88 state champions in 22 different areas. Over 40,000 school age men and women participate in the state's athletic programs and over 30,000 participate in the nonathletic programs.

Management of the O.S.S.A.A. is vested in a thirteen member board of directors elected by the membership. This board is made up of high school principals and school district superintendents. It operates under the rules set forth in the O.S.S.A.A. constitution.

The executive secretary and his staff are charged with the responsibility for coordinating, supervising and regulating all activities sponsored by the O.S.S.A.A. Each assistant is responsible for meeting with advisory committees and proposing rule changes and adaptations to the board of directors. In addition, plans must be made and arrangements coordinated for the various tournaments and playoff games that are held across the state. Also falling under responsibilities, each assistant, as well as Mr. Self, work with local coaches, administrators and game officials to keep them abreast of rule changes.

The O.S.S.A.A. is a private, non-profit organization. Funding for each program is provided by participation fees, paid by the local school district, and gate admission charged to the public at the playoff tournaments.

Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival Fayetteville, Ark. 10/16/93

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark.--Jenks' Brian Young captured the top individual honors in the annual Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival held here at the University of Arkansas golf course October 16th. Conditions couldn't have been much worse as an all-night downpour made the course a muddy swamp with rain continuing to fall through most of the morning's races.

Jenks' Carissa Nix finished second in the girls' race with McGuinness taking a close second place in the team race, only four points behind Springfield, Mo. Kickapoo. The Jenks boys also took home second place hardware, finishing second to national power McCullough, Texas.

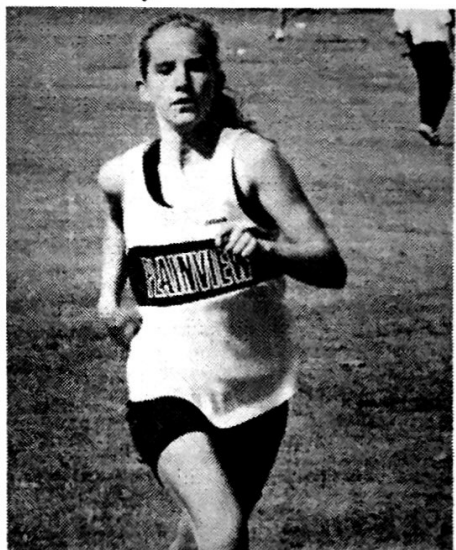

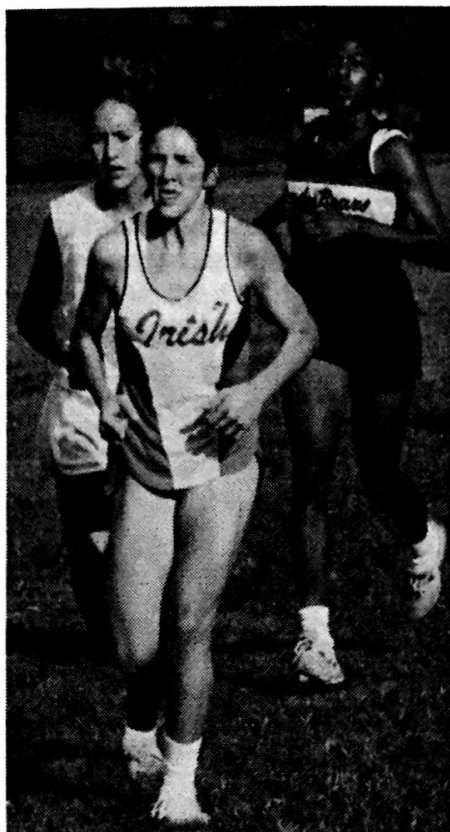

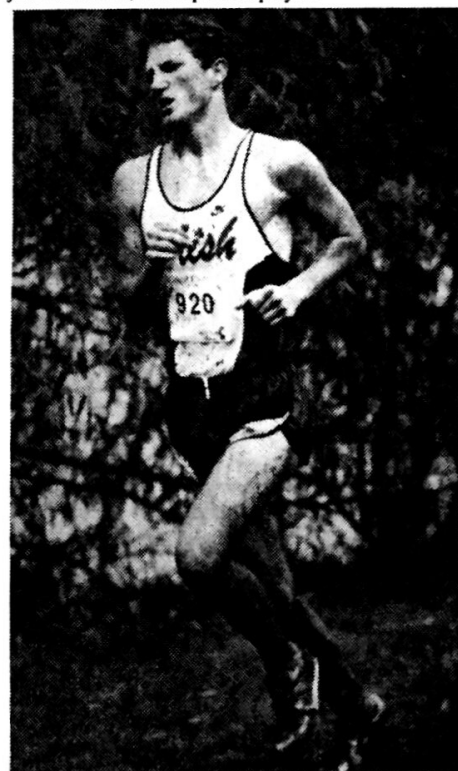
