# 1994 High School Track Preview 5A--4A--3A By John Hoke, Editor

It is going to be a long and unpredictable two months until the regional and state championship meets in May but that is then and this is now and everybody seems to want some guesses. So, based on TEAM REPORTS (the few that have been returned), indoor meets and known returning champions and placewinners I'm going out on a limb and getting the season started off with some "off the wall" rankings for classes 5A, 4A and 3A. It was impossible to know what members of the second through sixth relay teams were returning so I had to group for feeling about their strengths. The next issue will venture into even darker waters and try to predict 2A, A and B.

5A Boys


B. T. Washington claims the top spot on the strength of their double event winner--and one of the best in the nation--Demetrius Birch who took the 100 and 200 dashes last year. Washington also returns all of their state championship 4x100 relay team and 400 dash champion Chris Pike. Norman definitely has the ability to challenge with two returning champions, 800 meter man Jeremy Thayer and high jumper Pat McCabe. Placewinning hurdler Terry Blackshire will also be back for the Tigers as well as 3200 meter placewinner Joey Donnelly.

Enid and Jenks both return one champion with seniors Chance Rush--3200--and Brian Young--1600. Shot putter Aaron Tracey from Choctaw and long jumper Jermaine Birdow from Lawton are the only other returning champions. Putnam City, Eisenhower, Putnam North and Edmond Memorial follow in that order each with a few placewinners back.

5A Girls

The Norman girls were impressive in their indoor victory at the Myriad February 11th and that is what gives them the nod over crossstate rival Jenks though they lack any returning champions while Jenks returns 3200 meter champ Carissa Nix. There is not much else to go on for the rest of the team rankings but Union has the only returning double winner in Lucretia Mays who took the 100 dash and long jump. The only other returning champion is Eisenhower discus thrower, Vicky

Most of these teams, boys and girls, will be clashing at Jenks or Ardmore next weekend so

TEAM REPORTS were mailed out in January and so far I haven't gotten a very good response, especially from the big schools. I can't emphasize enough how important these are to putting out an accurate and timely publication. Besides correct spellings and accurate schedules these forms give me the class year of our athletes which is very important to college coaches looking for recruits. I get several calls a week wanting this information and if I don't have a TEAM REPORT I probably can't answer their questions. So, coaches, please get your TEAM REPORT back to me ASAP!

Along these same lines, I'm going to be sending reports to the national TRACK & FIELD NEWS and they want as much information as possible, including whether times are hand held or fully automatic and wind information. The state of Oklahoma always has some athletes that will be producing marks that qualify them for national recognition and it is important that this information be available.

I attended the Track Coaches Indoor games at the Myriad and was very impressed by the way the meet was run. Unfortunately I didn't do so well myself, managing to ruin most of my shots of the meet and get only marginal quality on the ones that came out. Wish me better luck for the rest of the season. I do hope that next year we are allowed to have an official indoor state meet and an expanded competition schedule.

I'm encouraged by the number of subscriptions coming in but a bit dismayed by the response from the 375 schools that sponsor at least one track team. With OTAFN being the only place some of these athletes might see their name in print I would hope that the coaches or the school libraries would have a subscription. I truly enjoy putting this publication out but I definite need the support of all the schools with track teams in the state in order to continue publishing.

look for some more informed guesses in the next issue.

**4A Boys** 

The new Edmond North has the advantage of being a 5A school but getting to compete as a 4A team for one year. This should make for a pretty powerful force in this class but look for perennial powers John Marshall and Ardmore to contend for the top honors as well.

Chickasha high jumper Steve Alexander is back to defend his state title no other returning champions have been identified.

**4A Girls** No doubt about who's on top here. The John Marshall Bears are the most successful track program in the state and would probably win any class they were put in. The Bears return the state's only triple winner, Talea Wisby, a junior, who captured the 100 hurdles, 300 hurdles and the long jump last year. They also return double winner Jameka Roberts who ran away with the 400 and 800.

The real fight here will be for second place with McGuinness and Ardmore duking it out again. Ardmore was hard hit by graduation but McGuinness returns double winner Jessica Hoke who took the 1600 and 3200 last year as well as a second to Roberts in the 800. The rest of the pack will be looking to break into the top three with the only other returning champions (we know of) being Duncan high jumper Jamie Battles. With Edmond North dropping into 4A out of the sky with 5A high jump champion Megan Toole, look for them to find their way into the top five.

3A Boys A real lack of information at this point makes it difficult to pick this class but, from information gleaned from TEAM RE-PORTS, it looks like the top three will remain the same this year: Okmulgee, Idabel and Weatherford. Plainview sits in fourth with returning 100 dash champion Cody Lawson and there are a few other possible returning champions that haven't been identified yet.

3A Girls

It isn't hard to pick the top team here with powerhouse Plainview returning double winner Sarah Harvey, 1600 and 3200, as well as 400 winner Leah Norton and 800 winner Lacey Sanford. They also return all members of their championship 3200 relay team. Vinita gets the nod for second followed by Marlow Idabel Millwood, Elk City, Okmulgee and Purcell, who moved up from 2A with double winner Julie Hodge in the 100 and 200 dashes. Hodge had the fastest 100 dash time in the state meet out of all classes last year. Purcell also returns 2A double champion Julie Clements, who won both the discus and shot put as a freshman

Tecumseh 100 hurdler, Tiyah Ryan, is the only other returning champion identified at this point.

### Oklahoma Track Coaches Association Indoor Games

#### Myriad Convention Center Oklahoma City 2/11/94

OKLAHOMA CITY-Norman High School won both the 5A boys and girls titles in the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association Indoor Games (unofficial state indoor championships) held here in the west exhibit hall of the Myriad Convention Center February 11th. Norman displaced last year's double winner, Edmond, which suffered a three-way split in their school system this year.

The fabulous John Marshall Bears were the most dominant team in the meet, capturing the 4A girl's title with 156.5 points and nine individual and relay champions including six (of 13) best of meet performances. Bear junior, Talea Wisby, won four individual events (55 Hurdles, 55 Dash, Long Jump and 200 Dash) with best overall performances in the 55 Hurdles, 55 Dash and Long Jump.

Edmond North won the 4A boy's division, knocking off defending champion John Marshall, while Idabel took the 3A boys title (no 3A girls).

Due to a schedule conflict with ice hockey in the main arena, the meet was held in the west exhibit hall this year which allowed flat track events to be held simultaneously with the oval events. Though spectator seating was not the best most coaches were pleased with the layout and the ability to run all the events in the limited time frame allowed. The board track is a banked 160 meters with eight lanes and was used by the Myriad when the NCAA conducted their indoor championships here many years ago.

There were no triple winners of individual events but there were nine double winners with three of them posting best of meet performances in both events: Owasso's Shawn Creason, 55 dash, 200 dash; Jenks' Carissa Nix, 3000 run and 1600 run; John Marhall's Mike Calhoun, 400 dash and Triple Jump.

Other double winners were:

5A Boys--Larry Digby, Putnam North, 1600 and 3000. 5A Boys--Terry Blackshire, Norman, 55 Hurdles and Triple Jump. 5A Girls--Shari Northington, Del City, 55 and 200. 4A Boys--Cornelius Mason, Northeast, 3000 and 1600. 4A Girls--Sarah Harvey, Plainview, 3000 and 1600. 3A Boys--Shane Gonzales, Fairview, Long Jump and Triple Jump.

All events were hand timed.






