

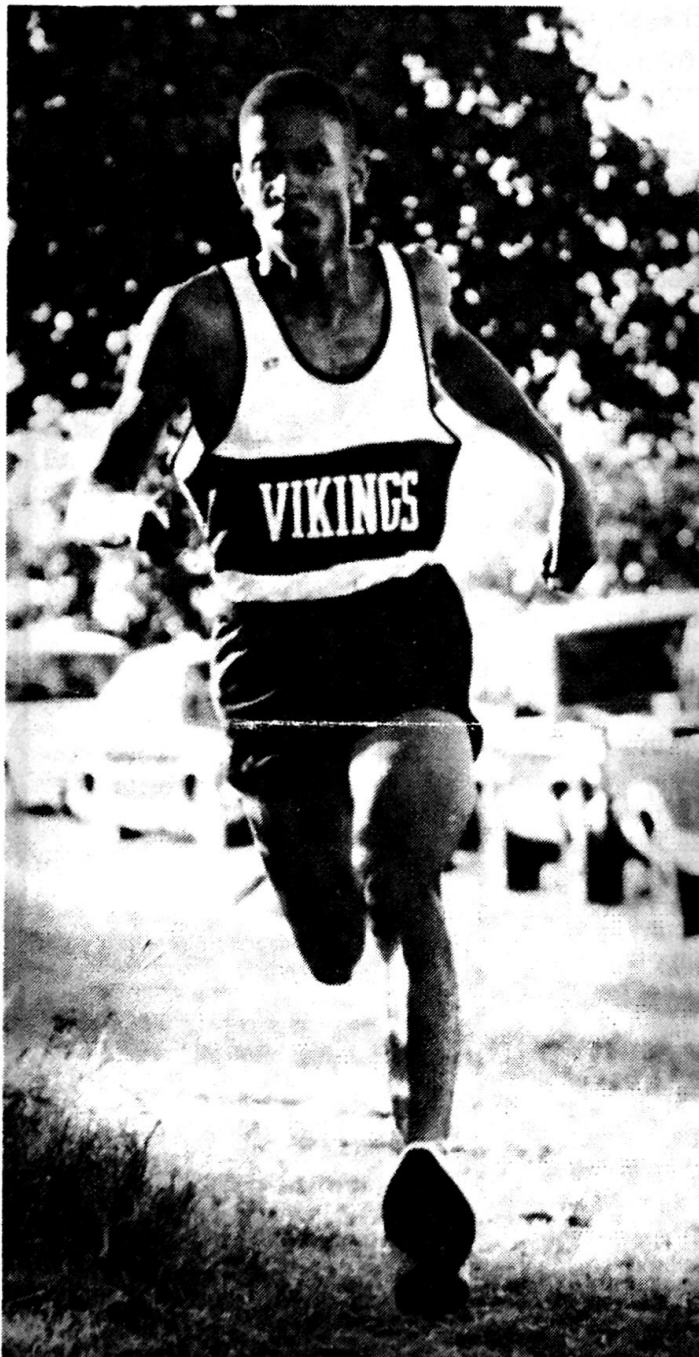

Marlow was a double winner, taking both 2A-3A boys and girls team titles. The Outlaw boys scored a perfect 15 again, led by individual winner Jarrod Lovett while the girls barely squeaked by Grove, 32-34.

Guthrie captured both 4A titles with Brandi Woodard taking top individual honors and Northeast's number one ranked Cornelius Mason won the 4A individual boys crown.

In the 5A divisions the Edmond North girls were victorious as were the Enid boys. Norman's Sherry Horton was the top girl.

On TRACK

Getting to the Starting Line

It only happens once in a while but when you show up for a race and have forgotten something important it never fails to ruin your day.

You train diligently for every race, get a good night's sleep and eat the right things so to avoid the trauma of something important forgotten, don't take your last-minute preparations for granted.

To avoid these situations, make a checklist. Use it to pack a bag full of everything you may need before, during and after your race. It is a good idea to set aside a permanent race bag and keep a supply of most of what you'll need already packed away.

Here's a sample checklist to use:

Shoes: Pack two pairs. Most cross country runners need racing shoes and training shoes. Even if you race in your training shoes, pack a second pair so you'll have dry footwear after the race.

Extra shoelaces: someday, sometime you're going to tie your shoelaces one last time and snap them.

Inserts: Put orthotics, insoles, heel lifts and other devices in your race shoes or bag.

Socks: Two pairs. One to race in and another so you can have a dry pair to wear after the race.

Bra or jock: You won't need both and some don't wear either. But if you do, make sure you pack 'em.

Racing uniform: Make sure you have the correct team uniform and that it is the same one that the rest of the team has. Horror stories of being disqualified for the wrong uniform are true.

Warmups and post race clothing: Pack the warmups you will wear before and after the race. Also pack extra T-shirts, sweatshirts, socks, etc., so you'll have a dry set of clothing after you finish.

Hot/cold weather items: If the weather is hot and sunny, you may want to pack some sunscreen and a hat to keep the sun off your head. In cold weather, you'll need to pack gloves, a hat or ear band, tights and a long-sleeved T-shirt. Remember that these items must match your teammates if they are worn as part of the race uniform.

First-aid/comfort kit: Always pack extra toilet paper. Also pack petroleum jelly for your feet, inner thighs and nipples to prevent blisters and chafing. You may want to put some on your face in cold, windy weather to protect against windburn. Pack Band-Aids, gauze, tape and any medicines you are accustomed to taking, i.e., aspirin, Tylenol, antihistamine, asthma inhaler, etc.

Drink/food: Pack water to drink 10 to 15 minutes before the start and bring additional drinks and food for after the race.

Locker room necessities: Bring a towel to dry off with even if you won't have access to a locker and shower. If you will, pack a lock and soap.

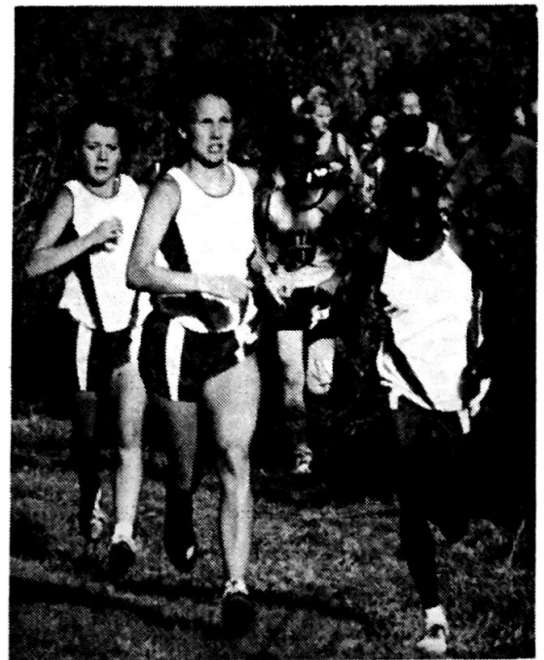

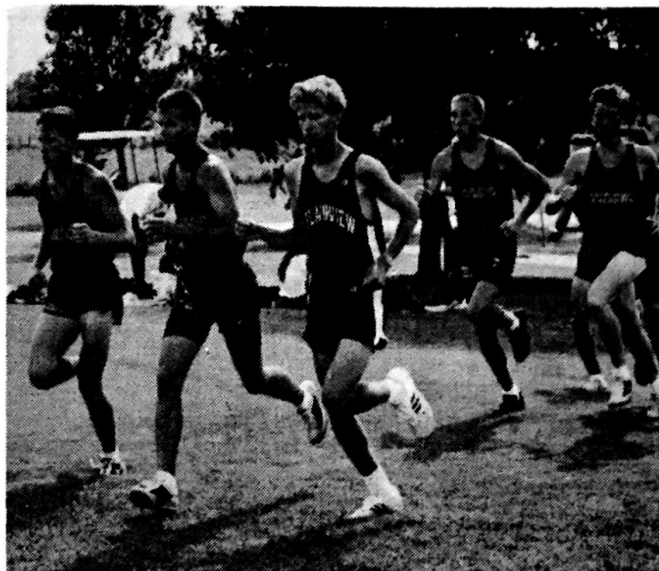
