Chile Pepper Festival-College Division

Prairie Grove, Arkansas

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark.--It was a great day for cross country racing on the historic Prairie Grove Battlefield here as Arkansas' number one ranked team lost for the second time this season in the pre-NCAA 8,000 meter cross country race October 1st.

The Hogs, losers to Kansas earlier in the season, were beaten by number three ranked Georgetown, 90-97, in the first-ever race on the Prairie Grove course which will be used for the NCAA Division I Championships November 21st.

Oklahoma State had an outstanding performance with Jon Wild and Patick Kiptum finishing second and fourth, respectively, to lead the Cowboys to a fourth-place finish in a field which featured 21 of the nation's top teams.

The Arkansas Alumni finished third with 118 points and the Cowboys scored 125 to outdistance Northern Arizona with 149.

The University of Oklahoma paced 14th with 439 points and The University of Tulsa finished 18th with 473.

Blinn College's Godfrey Siamoisye won the individual title by 20 seconds over Wild with a 23:47 and Kiptum finished only four seconds down on Villanova's Louie Quitana.

In the women's race, top-ranked Arkansas managed to overcome a 1-2 finish by defending NCAA champion Villanova to win the title, 72-88. Wisconsin (92), Georgetown (123)

Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival

Prairie Grove Battlefield
Fayetteville, Ark.

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark.--Oklahoma runners took top honors in both races in the tough Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival held here on the Prairie Grove Battlefield October 1st. The scenic course—a Civil War battlefield site being used for the first time—was very tough, winding through the woods and fields and up and down steep hills—it will be the site for the 1994 NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships November 21st.

Oklahoma girls dominated the field with Jenks' freshman, Kelli O'Rourke, winning the race by pulling away from McGuinness sophomore, Ashley Boothe, in the last 400 meters. It was the first meeting of the season between the two runners who were both undefeated in state competition prior to this race. Oklahomans accounted for 18 of the top 20 individual places.

O'Rourke led her Trojan team to a narrow, four-point win over the Irish, 75-59, with Marlow in third with 126 points.

In the boys race, Holland Hall's Parker Fleming pulled back to the leaders after falling back late in the race and then surged to a four-second victory over Mike Pitts of Springfield Central (Missouri). Oklahoma boys did not fare as well as the girls with Fleming the only state runner in the top ten. Jenks' Michael Pense and Jeff Reid came in 11th and 12th, one second apart but Eisenhower's Welton Jefferson, at 14th, was the only other Oklahoma boy in the top 20.

In the team races the Oklahoma boys captured six of the top ten spots, led by Jenks in fourth followed by Marlow, Little Axe and Eisenhower in fifth, sixth and seventh.

On TRACK

This is the last issue prior to regionals and the next issue will contain regional results and the state meet preview. I can't believe the season is almost over but you know what they say about how time flies when you're having a good time.

I attended the Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival (and ran in the 10k event) in Fayetteville, Arkansas, a couple of weeks ago and it was really a great experience. The course has been set up on an old Civil War battlefield at Prairie Grove and will be the same course used for the NCAA Division I Cross Country Championships on Monday, November 21st.

It is a very challenging course that favors the power runners since you seem to either be going up, down or around a tree. It is also very spectator-friendly and would make a great opportunity to see the nation's very best compete for the national championship--I know I'm going to be there!

Girls coaches need to be ready to nominate seniors for the Coaches All State selections. Nominations are open to coaches who are members of the Oklahoma Girls Track Coaches Association and the nominees are senior girls who do not finish in the top ten at the state meet (unless there are not enough other seniors).

The Junior High State Cross Country Championships that were held October 8th at Woodson Park in Oklahoma City were a big success with more than 300 runners competing. Meet organizer Jimmy Brackeen of Marlow should be commended for putting on a real quality race. The course was lined with parents, coaches and fans and the competitors really got a taste of what state meet competition can be.

With the state meet coming up in a couple of weeks I would like to suggest that the OSSAA consider qualifying eight teams from each regional instead of just six. The extra four teams could easily be absorbed by the course at Oral Roberts and it would give that many more kids the opportunity to experience the challenge of state championship competition.

Also on the subject of state competition--there has been some interest in adding another class since so many schools have been adding cross country. If you want to see this happen you need to voice your opinion to the members of the cross country advisory board (listed at the right). They will meet after the state meet to make plans for next year.

The individual rankings seem to be getting harder to do each week with many competitors trading places back and forth at each meet. Actually, this means that the regionals should really be interesting next week and, thankfully, the final ranking will be up to the athletes themselves as they hash it out on the course at Oral Roberts. With some of the state newspapers using the rankings on a weekly basis I have had the opportunity to talk to quite a few coaches and fans which is what I like. Please feel free to let me know how you feel about the rankings, especially if I've left someone out.

See you at the regionals.

The University of Tulsa Names Redwine Coach

TULSA--Two weeks following his Silver Medal performance in the 800 meters at the Goodwill Games, Stanley Redwine was named as cross country and track coach at The University of Tulsa.

Redwine comes to Tulsa after serving as a longtime assistant coach under legendary John McDonnell at the University of Arkansas. Redwine's name has been synonymous with Arkansas Razorback track for the last 14 years. He was a four-time All-American for the Hogs while a 600 and 880 yard runner from 1979 to 1983, then coached two years as a graduate assistant and has since been the sprints and hurdles coach the past nine seasons. Arkansas has won nine straight national championships and 22 titles since 1984 in track and cross country.

While an athlete at Arkansas Redwine played a key role in their back-to-back Southwest Conference Triple Crown Championships as well as the school's first-ever SWC Outdoor Track Championship. He ranks on Arkansas' top 10 list in seven events and has the second fastest outdoor 800 meter time in school history (1:46.13).

Redwine has compete internationally since 1983 and has been clocked with a personal-best 1:44.78 in the 800 meters in international competition. He was a member of the World Championships Track team in 1985, '87, '89, '91 and '93. He earned Bronze Medals in the 1983 and 1987 Pan American Games. Redwine advanced to the finals at the 1980, '84, '88 and '92 Olympic Trials. Perhaps his most prestigious victory was his 56.2 in the 500 yard dash seven years ago at the Millrose Games.

Redwine, 33, and his wife Jacqueline, have three children: Crysta, 11, Stanley Jr., 8, and Alexa, 4.

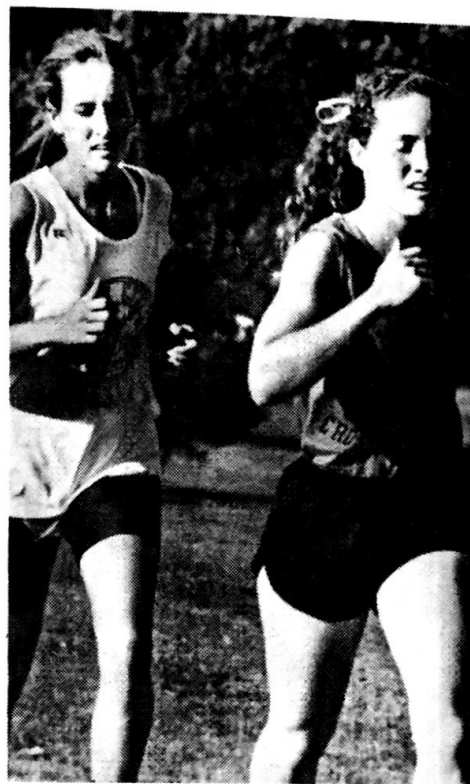
