

State Championship Preview

Here it is state meet time again and the season comes down to just one more race. All the hours and miles of practice through the summer and fall are in the bank and now is the time to cash them in for the chance of a medal or team victory.

The top teams and individuals will be covered below and the full rankings are elsewhere in this issue which is again serving as part of the official program for the state championships at Oral Roberts University October 29th.

It has been a tough season and only one of six defending champions is returning to Tulsa with the number one ranking--Northeast senior Cornelius Mason in 4A boys, who is undefeated this season. Buffalo senior, Mark Levings, has been steadily climbing up the 2A boys rankings but is still one from the top as has Little Axe junior, Craig Blanchard in 3A boys.

Two-time champion Jessica Hoke, McGuinness junior, will be back to defend her 4A girls title but still has not fully recovered from missing most of last year's competition in cross country and track. Jenks senior, Carissa Nix, also missed track season due to a stress fracture but will be hoping to help the Trojans claim the 5A girls title. 2A champ Ashlea Barby, Laverne sophomore, was ranked number one all season but got hurt late. Her status will be vital to the Tigers' title hopes.

Seven of the eight team races look to be almost too close to call with some major upsets looming on the horizon. It is going to be down to the wire, so let's get started.

2A Girls

This is going to be a wide open race with any one of four or five girls capable of winning the individual title. Defending champion Ashlea Barby, Laverne sophomore, had a great season going, holding the number one ranking up until she turned an ankle at Alva. She had a tough day at the west regional and finished 11th. The west was won by Canton's Mylissa Seifried with Velma-Alma junior, Crystal Fuller in second.

In the east, Kansas senior Amy Armer, a two-time 1600/3200 double winner on the track, has been looking awesome but finished second to Tahlequah freshman, Amanda Davis, by four seconds, just nosing out Pioneer-Pleasant Vale senior Tara Over-

On TRACK

This issue of Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS is again serving as part of the official program for the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association's Cross Country State Championships being held at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, October 29th. Full results will be in the next issue. If you are reading this and are not already a subscriber, it is time to become one.

The top runners and teams are covered thoroughly in this issue in the state meet preview that begins on page one and the individual and team rankings elsewhere. But, even though they get noticed the most, these runners aren't really the heart of cross country.

A lot of attention gets paid to the highest ranking individuals during the season but no single runner can win a team victory by himself or herself.

The unsung heroes of cross country are the fourth through seventh place runners that put in the same miles in training and run the same races, usually finishing out of the medals, but doing well enough to bring home the trophy. Watch for them! These are the boys and girls who will make the difference between winning and losing. Down in the trenches, this is where the final battles are fought and team titles are won or lost. Pass a runner you get a point--it's worth two if it's your main competition. Get passed and you might lose by a point.

This is what makes cross country so exciting. It's not over until it's over. Not until after the fat lady sings and the team points have been refigured. Nobody goes home after the individual winner has crossed the line--the race is still on and it is up to the foot soldiers to decide the victor. In the end they hand out seven medals to the team winners and every one of them counts.

I had a lot of help with the final individual and team rankings for this issue and I want to thank all the coaches that took the time and effort to return the ballots I sent out last week--it sure made my job easier. I also want to thank Larry Young of Jenks for sending the excellent East Regional photographs--I hope he becomes a regular contributor.

While on the subject of rankings: they make great conversation during the season as long as nobody takes them too seriously and I'm always grateful that they real final ranking takes place on the cross country course at the state meet.

The O.S.S.A.A. cross country advisory board will be meeting next week and this is where the process of changing and improving the sport begins. The members of this board are listed in this issue and they want to know what you think regarding the issues facing us. Don't expect improvement to happen if you won't take part in the process.

Some of the issues up for discussion will be the addition of another class below 2A; changes in regional alignments and number of regionals; state and regional start times; number of teams qualifying for state from regionals; all-star competitions; and anything else you want them to consider. This is our sport. Speak up!

street at the line. Others to watch are Nikki Lanie, Wakita, and Sara Kee, Beaver senior.

In the team race Velma-Alma rates a very slight favorite on the strength of their regional win with either Lexington or Laverne very capable of taking home the first-place trophy. If Barby has a better race it will even be tighter. Tahlequah Sequoyah has an outside chance but even a win by Davis will probably not be enough.

2A Boys

Velma-Alma senior, Zac Johnson, has simply destroyed his competition this year and with his closest competition to date-eight seconds at Jenks-Davenport junior, Daniel McKinney being disqualified at regionals, he looks like a sure thing. However, defending champion Mark Levings, Buffalo senior, may have a different idea, as he has steadily progressed up the rankings ending up second after his west regional second place finish to Johnson.

Other strong contenders include Inola senior, Randy Pifer, east regional champ; Hydro's Jared Black; and Tahlequah Sequoyah sophomore, Jarrod Mooney.

This will be another tight team race with west regional Lindsay getting a slight nod over perennial 2A power, Tahlequah Sequoyah, winner of the east regional. Chisholm is not far back in third and if the leaders falter could step in to fill the spot. After that it is just about anybody's guess.

3A Girls

Nobody has challenged Plainview junior Sara Harvey in this class this year and it is certainly time for her to stand on top of the podium after finishing second two years in a row to four-time winner Natalie Gray of Cascia Hall.

The battle in this race will be for second and there is no shortage of candidates including two outstanding freshmen: Grove's Carly McCulley and Marlow's Leah McCauley. Marlow senior Chrissy Guild has a habit of being at the front of any race along with Elgin junior, Kelleigh Sanders. Jones junior, Cathleen Baumeister, has had a good season also and can be expected to be a contender.

The big news in the team race is that the Indians are not invincible, dropping a two-point decision to the Outlaws in the west regional for their first 3A loss in over three years. This could be one of the tightest races of the day with Grove hoping to play spoiler one way or another but look for the Indians to pull it together and take one more state championship trophy home.

4A Girls

Alone at the top of this class is McGuinness sophomore Ashley Boothe, who hasn't had a close race in Oklahoma this season. Her only loss was to 5A Jenks' Kelli O'Rourke at the Chile Pepper in Arkansas. Everybody else will be duking it out for second with Guthrie sophomore Brandi

East Regional

O'Brien Park Tulsa 10/22/94

TULSA--The Enid Plainsmen pulled off the upset of the day, knocking off defending state champion Jenks by one point, 38-39, in the 5A boys East Regional held here at O'Brien Park October 22nd. The Plainsmen were led by individual winner Jason Wolfe, who turned in the fastest boys time of the day with a 16:28 over the muddy course. The Trojans were missing their number two runner, Michael Pense, who was sitting this one out while recovering from a muscle pull suffered in the Frontier Conference meet.

The Little Axe boys served notice that they are finally ready, taking the 3A title behind the 1-2-3-4 punch of defending state champion Craig Blanchard, Ralph Dumas, Brandon Lewis and Jeremy Johnson, and matching West Regional winner Marlow's low score of 18.

Guthrie was the only team to capture both boys and girls titles, sweeping the 4A division with individual winners in both races as well. Brandi Woodard notched the fastest girls time of the day with a 12:17 with teammate Nicole Monroe in second at 12:45. The Bluejays scored 43 points to surprising runnerup Nathan Hale's 64, led by triplets, Brandy, Amy and Melissa Bratton.

For the boys, Santon Jones took home the gold with a 17:01 with Poteau's James Derosa in second at 17:09 while the number one ranked 'Jays easily outdistanced runnerup Claremore, 21-56, putting five runners in the top ten.

In the 2A boys division Tahlequah Sequoyah had a tough battle with Chisholm before taking the boys title 45-53 with Prague in third with 66. Inola's Randy Pifer was the individual winner with the Indian's

Jarrod Mooney in second and Prague's Shawn Hicks third.

Lexington was an easy winner over Tahlequah Sequoyah, 37-67, for the 2A girls title with the Indian's Amanda Davis a surprise winner over Kansas' Amy Armer and Pioneer-Pleasant Vale's Tara Overstreet.

Grove dominated the 3A girls race with freshman standout, Carly McCulley taking the individual win while leading her team to a 22-86 margin of victory over Little Axe.



MIDWEST CITY-In a preview of two of the top match-ups coming up at the state meet the underdogs won one and the top dogs won the other in the West Regional held here on a beautiful, sunny (too warm) day at Regional Park October 22nd. The once invincible 3A Plainview girls fell to arch-rival Marlow, 32-34, while number one ranked Velma-Alma knocked off Laverne, 68-73.

It was the first loss to a 3A team--the only other to Bartlesville last year in the Meet of Champions--in at least three years for the Indians who were the victims of a steadily improving Outlaw team. 


