1996 O.S.S.A.A. State Track & Field Championships By John Hoke

CHOCTAW--All four defending team champions were favored to repeat in the 1996 Secondary Schools Activities Oklaĥoma Association's 1996 Class 5A and 4A State Track & Field Championships held here at Choctaw High School May 10th and 11th. Both boys team steamrolled to their second straight titles but the girls races were tight and hampered by disqualifications as two new teams stepped up on the podium at the end of the meet.

The weather was good--cool and cloudy on Friday with a brief downpour during the girls 3200 meter run and warm and sunny (and windy) on Saturday. Here are the highlights: 5A Boys

Edmond North was the pre-meet favorite to repeat as champions but trailed Edmond Memorial by 24 points after the first day of competition. Coach Steve Patterson's Huskies came back on Saturday, going 1-2 in the 100 and 200 meter dashes and capturing both the 400 and 1600 meter relays to win by 32 points over runnerup Norman.
Sand Springs' Michael Cliff-who basically ran

as an independent during the season for the Tulsa Track Club-was the meet's only double winner, taking the 1600 and 3200 meter runs essentially unchallenged. Cliff, who had posted the season's fastest times in both events, improved his times to 4:20.26 and 9:31.15 respectively.

Successfully defending their 1995 titles were Putnam City West's Rhoshod Browning in the 300 meter hurdles and Moore's Matt Anderson in the shot. Both are seniors.

Edmond North's senior Frank Johnson and junior Terrance Wakefield went 1-2 in the 100 meter dash and then traded places to go 1-2 in the 200 meter dash. Both ran on the winning 400 and 1600 meter relays. Senior Ben Schadegg won the high jump and was the Huskies only other champion.

5A Girls

Jenks was favored to repeat as team champions and were celebrating their apparent victory after the concluding 1600 meter relay when Jamaican junior Sophia Surgeon spiked the baton ecstatically after anchoring the Trojans to first place. Norman had put themselves in position of being able to win it all if they beat Jenks in the final event and did just that after the Trojans relay team was disqualified for throwing the baton, giving Norman the team title 112-104 over Jenks.

Coach Pat Lenington's Tigers had fought hard to be in a position to win, scoring 56 points on Friday--13 more than their meet total of 43 in 1995--and picking up another 56 points on Saturday while watching the Trojans build momentum with

As I have said in the past, I think the opportunity for post-season competition is something that should be pursued diligently by the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association, as it has been for the past few years. There is a lot more work in putting these teams together than most coaches realize and more coaches need to get involved in seeing that this tradition continues.

Summer U.S.A. Track & Field and A.A.U. meets are coming up with several already completed. I would like to see a lot more kids involved as well as coaches and masters athletes. I plan to compete again myself and am looking forward to seeing many of you at the track this summer. Results--all that we receive--will be printed in the summer wrap-up issue at the end of August.

The Oklahoma Track Coaches Association's annual summer clinic will be held in July again. All coaches should take the opportunity to attend to keep themselves up-to-date on the latest track and cross country techniques and participate in the business of the OTCA.

Summer running camps are a great way for individuals and teams to get mentally and physically prepared for the upcoming cross country season. I have been involved in taking teams for the past four years and it has been a valuable experience for the kids every year. If you are interested in attending a camp and need some information you can give me a call at my office (405-843-9992) and I'll be glad to help.

Cross country runners should start their fall program in June to give themselves plenty of time to adapt to the heat and mileage. Start slow and try to stay on grass or a soft surface. Mileage increase should be no more than 10% a week. Every year there are way too many girls that get injured--cross country is the highest injury sport for girls in the nation--mainly because they are not prepared for the mileage and intensity required when the season gets here and eventually hurt themselves trying to catch up too hard or too fast. Coaches: give your athletes a written summer program to get them prepared and check up on them during the summer to see if they need any help or guidance.

Double winners were Enid's Denistra Miller (long jump/100); Bartlesville senior Jennifer Fontenot (200/400); and B.T. Washington's Andrea Bell in both hurdles. B.T. Washington multiple winner, junior Kim Schumpert, lost a court battle and was declared academically ineligible following her double regional win (100/200). Schumpert was the high point scorer in the 1995 State Meet.

Yukon senior Keely Dean repeated her 800 meter win with the fastest time in the state this year at 2:15.8.

4A Boys

Defending champion Altus led from start to finish, outpointing runnerup Carl Albert by 46 points to give coach Jeep Johnson his second straight state title. The Bulldogs didn't need the help they got the first day from a very questionable disqualification in the 3200 meter run which gave senior Brian Whitlock the win over McGuinness junior Taylor

In spite of no complaints from the runners, officials upheld the disqualification of Styron for cutting in on a runner in the middle of the 8-lap race. Whitlock came back on Saturday to take the 1600 meter run, leading from start to finish, giving him his third gold medal of the meet (1600/3200/3200 relay).

Altus won four individual events and two relays,

totalling 124 points.

MacArthur's Virgil Maddox was the only other individual double winner, capturing the 100 and 200 meter dashes. Altus junior Chauncey Raiden defended his 400 meter title and Duncan's Jeff Curtis won back his 110 meter hurdle title after last winning it in 1994.

4A Girls

This was the closest team race of the meet with four or five teams staying in contention all the way up to the final event when three teams were still vying for the title. Eventual winner Northeast had to sit on the sidelines while runnerup Northwest Classen and third-place McGuinness attempted to catch the Vikings with points in the 1600 meter relay.

Coach Ron Miller's Vikings were cheering for Duncan since a win by McGuinness would have given the Irish the title, 77-76, or a win by the Knights would have created a first-place tie, 76-76. Northwest led for almost the whole race but was caught in the final 100 meters by Duncan's Amonica Wiggins to give the Demon's the win.

Northeast won only one event--the 800 meter relay-but got points from seven of 11 qualifiers. Two-time winner Ardmore false started in the 400 meter relay and eliminated themselves from contention after being tied for the lead on the first

Guthrie junior Brandi Woodard had a spectacular meet, capturing three individual titles (800/1600/3200) and only narrowly missing out on a fourth in the 3200 meter relay where McGuinness senior Jessica Hoke held her off in the final leg to give the Irish a one-second victory and their only gold of the meet.

Ardmore senior Shana Dowdy was a double winner in the shot/discus and broke her own '94 meet record in the shot to go along with the discus meet record she set last year. Northwest Classen's Aisha Gordon was the only other double winner, taking the 200 and 400 meter dashes.

Altus junior Shavanta Sneed set a new meet record in winning the 100 meter dash in 11.93, breaking the 11.99 record she shared with Gordon after the prelims on Friday. Tulsa Kelley's Elizabeth Bashaw successfully defended her long jump title with a leap of 17-11.

Ford Mastin who has coached at Prague High School since 1982, has been named head track coach at Oklahoma Baptist University.

"Ford is an excellent fit for our track program for a number of reasons," said Dr. Norris Russell, OBU Athletic Director. "He has been around OBU and Shawnee for a long time. He's the kind of young man that we want to lead our program. He is a very committed Christian and he is committed to the welfare of our program. We are very excited that coach Mastin will be leading our team into the 21st century."

Mastin, whose Red Devils finished third in the 2A state track meet earlier this month, will succeed Glen Stone, who is retiring at the end of this season after five years at the helm.

Mastin is a 1977 graduate of OBU and returns to the Shawnee university with an armload of credentials.

Mastin was Oklahoma Track Coach of the Year and the USA Track and Field representative of Olympic development in Oklahoma in 1994; regional Track Coach of the Year in 1991 and 1993; and has served as the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association's director of indoor state championships.

"This is the fulfillment of a dream," said Mastin. "This is a special place. I think God's hand was in this. I think all the awards that I have were given to me to allow me to be in this position."

While at Prague, Mastin coached the Red Devil's to a state runner-up finish in 1987. His teams have been regional champions seven times, conference champions 11 times and academic state champions four times.

He has coached two Olympians, six All-Americans, two state meet record holders, 13 All-Staters and three honorable mention high school All-Americans.

While at OBU, he lettered from 1973-77 and captained the team his senior season. He was selected Most Valuable Athlete in 1977.

Prior to coaching track, cross country and football at Prague, Mastin was assistant track and head cross country coach at Texas Christian University from 1978-80 and athletic director, teacher and coach at Happy Hill Academy in Glen Rose, Texas, from 1980-82.

He holds a master's of divinity degree from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and a master's of education degree from East Central University.

Mastin and his wife, Terri, have two children, Linsey and Trevor.




