

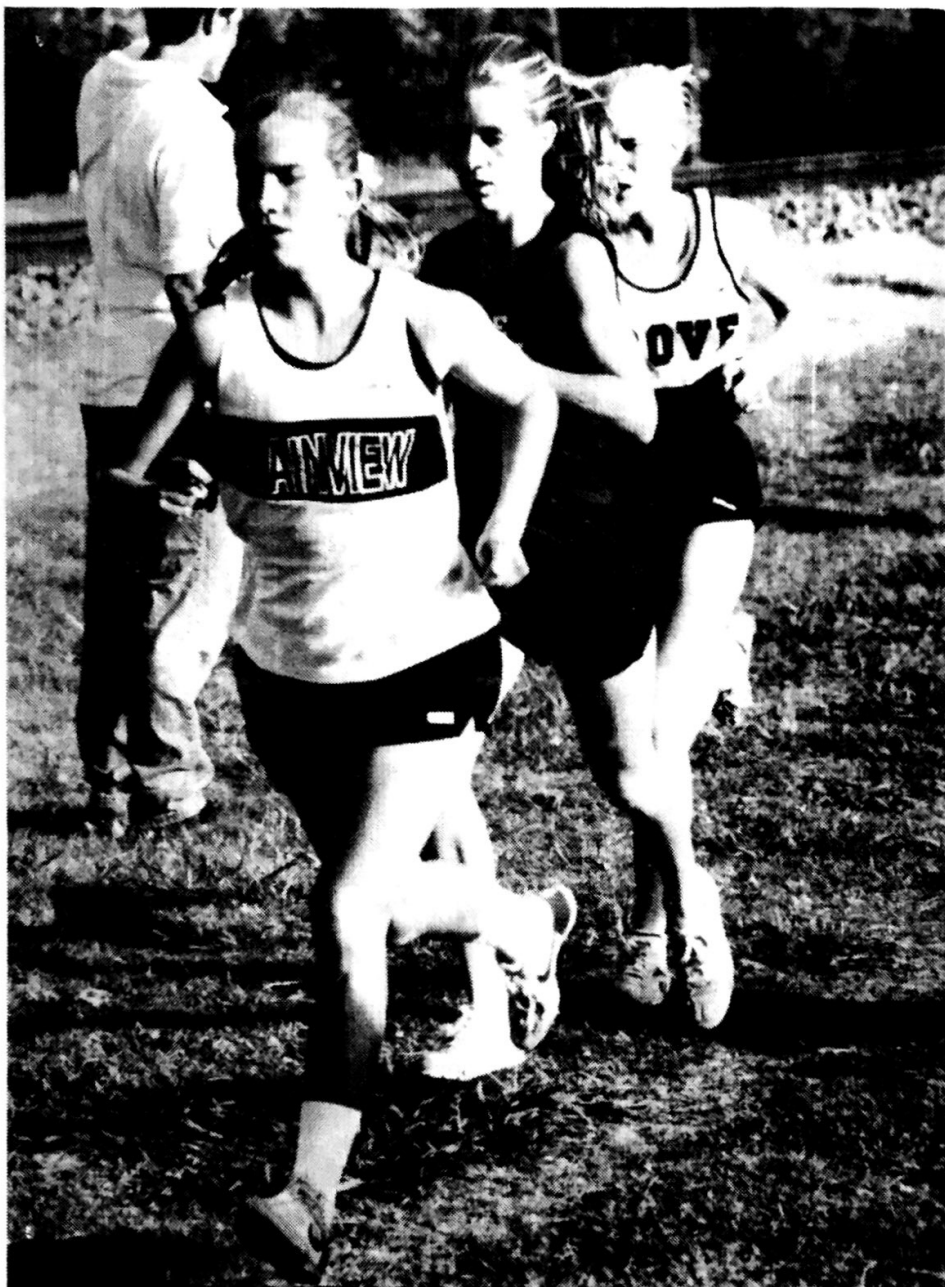

Mid Season Review

There are about 20 meets reported in this issue which will be the last one before the pre-state meet issue October 27th. With the state meet only about two weeks away the team and individual races have really come into focus.

There were no real big surprises in the pre-state meet on the Duck Pond course in Norman, October 5th. It is a power runner's course but surprisingly fast--watch out for errant spectators. The Plainview girls gave notice that they are back in the hunt for another 3A title by beating season-long favorite Grove while the Little Axe boys signalled their strength by edging Plainview for second behind heavy favorite Dickson in 3A boys.

Jenks and McGuinness pulled off double win with their number one ranked squads though the Trojan girls struggled a bit to beat Norman 97-11' and no runners in the top ten. The Trojans got All-Stater Renee Ahlgren back this week and the Irish got defending state champ, Ashley Booth back as well to heavy sighs of relief in both camps.

In the 2A divisions the Velma-Alma girls were awesome in dominating the field and were easily the best girls team of the day while Hydro took the boy title in a race confused by the field (except champion Mylo Miller of Velma-Alma) getting off course.

Individually there weren't any big surprises either with the top runners pretty well identified by the current rankings. Defending champs had their day with Plainview's Sarah Harvey claiming the best girls time with an 11:44 while Edmond Memorial's Mark Thompson the boys, edging teammate Jeremy Buhl at the line for a 16:43. Dickson's David Lampkin ran away with the 3A race in 16:51.

Other meet highlights:

Cowboy Jamboree--A disappointing turnout due to schedule conflicts was depressed further when defending champ McGuinness girls were not notified of the races being combined and missed altogether. Thompson won the boys race while Victory Christian sophomore Tasha Lance took the girls--disappointed that she didn't get to go against the Irish. Great weather though. Edmond Memorial won the boys and Stillwater the girls.

Dog Pack Run--Norman edged Guthrie for the girls title while Midwest City took the boys. The Bluejays Brandi Woodard was the individual girl winner with Santa Fe's Jason Jones the boys.

Tahlequah Invitational--Eastern teams duked it out here with the Jenks boys winning handily while the Trojan girls had to struggle to win over Grove Grove's Carly McCulley and Jenks Jeff Reid were the individual winners.

Watonga Invitational--Hydro was impressive in winning the boys behind sophomore Walt Ginn while Canton took the girls with Wakita's Nicol Lanie the individual winner.

On TRACK

Only two more weeks until the state meet at the OU Duck Pond in Norman which last hosted this meet in 1991. It's always hard to believe that the season goes by so fast but here we are on the verge of the regionals and state meets again. This is the last issue prior to regionals and the next issue will contain full regional results and the state meet preview.

Results came in exceptionally well for this issue, the only problem I can complain about is that meet directors are not listing enough places. When a competition takes at least five athletes per team to participate and finish it doesn't seem to make sense to only report the top five or ten individuals. This is also making it difficult to rank everyone that deserves it in the second half of the top twenty runners. Let's keep after meet directors to take the extra bit of time necessary to give these athletes the recognition they deserve by listing at least 25 places in the results.

Post-season competition opportunities are pretty limited in cross country but many athletes would like to continue to compete for a few weeks while they are in top condition. This year the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association is again sponsoring an open USAT&F dual with Arkansas in Fayetteville, Arkansas, November 11th. More information on this dual elsewhere in this issue--last year's was a big success. Also, the AAU and USAT&F both have state meets that lead to a national meet in early December. Unfortunately we didn't have information on the USAT&F state meet at press time since they were trying to resolve a scheduling conflict with the Oklahoma vs. Arkansas dual. The AAU meet is set for November 4th and there is contact information in the schedule in this issue. Some of our top runners may also be interested in the Foot Locker regional which is held in Kenosha, Wisconsin over Thanksgiving. Give me a call if you are interested in this meet and I'll pass the information along.

The second annual Junior High State Cross Country Championships were held at Woodson Park in Oklahoma City October 7th and were again a resounding success. Over 300 runners competed in four races with the top teams and individuals taking home extremely nice awards. Next year meet organizer Jimmy Brackeen of Marlow plans to have a large and small school division which should make it even better. The weather was perfect and there was a large contingent of parents and fans on hand to enjoy the real spirit of cross country.

I'll be attending the Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Prairie Grove, Arkansas again this year--my sixth year in a row--along with at least 15 of Oklahoma's top teams. This is really one of the premier meets in this region and is becoming a great tradition with our state's best. It is also a chance to get to see some of the nation's best college teams and even try your own hand (or feet) at racing on the same course. Needless to say, it is also a beautiful drive at this time of year with the fall colors at their peak. Maybe I'll see you there.

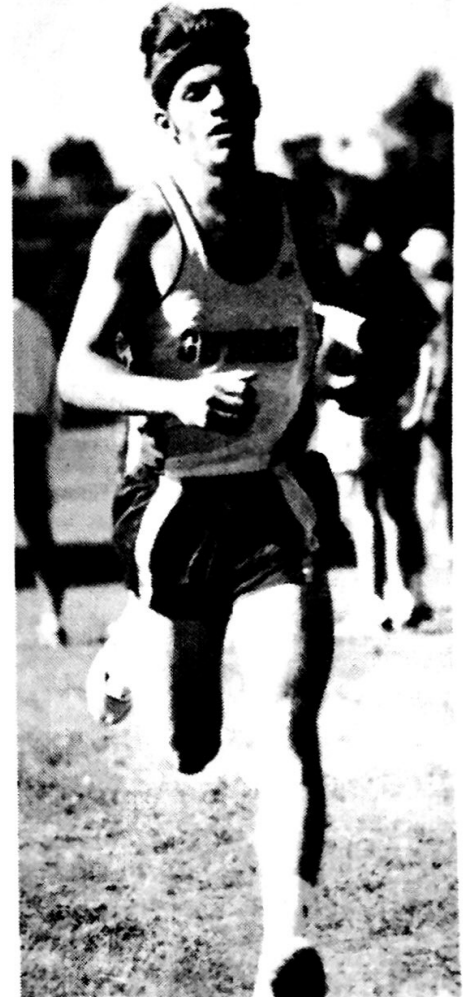

Prior to the final pre-state meet ranking the rankings are an attempt to reflect what has happened rather than predicting what's going to happen. Input is encouraged from coaches, parents and fans.
