# Cross Country State Championship Preview

It's the end of October and the season's first frost has just arrived so it must be time for the 1995 Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association State Cross Country Championships. This year's meet is being held on the Duck Pond course at the University of Oklahoma in Norman and starts at 12:00 noon on Saturday, October 28th.

The top teams and individuals will be covered below and the full rankings are elsewhere in this issue which is again serving as part of the official program for the championships. Full results will be in the next issue which is scheduled for November 15th.

As always, it has been a long and tough season since the opening meets in August and only one of four defending champions is coming into the state meet undefeated though all four have held onto the number-one ranking.

Dickson sophomore, David Lampkin, and Edmond Memorial junior, Mark Thompson, have held the number one spot all season in 3A and 5A boys, respectively, but only Lampkin had an unblemished record. Thompson lost early to Eisenhower's Welton Jefferson but avenged that lost quickly and has been on a mission to repeat since.

Plainview senior Sarah Harvey—3A champ after being runnerup two years—has lost twice to Elgin's Kelleigh Sanders but gets the number one spot on the strength of her season. McGuinness junior Ashley Boothe, the 4A champ, missed much of the season due to a nagging hip injury but was back in form at the west regional, beating two-time champion teammate Jessica Hole, one of three former champions in the field this year.

Little Axe's Spud Blanchard, 1993 3A boys champion as sophomore, returned to action in the east regional but missed the rest of the season due to a back injury. Laverne's Ashlea Barby, winner of the 2A girls race in 1993 as a freshman, is also back.

At least five of the eight team races are close enough to want to hedge your bets but someone has to be the favorite, so here they are:

5A Boys

Jenks and Edmond Memorial traded wins early in the season but the Trojans have pretty much dominated things since then. They were solid winners in the pre-state meet at Norman and look like a solid favorite to win their eighth straight team title. The Bulldogs, led by Thompson and number-two ranked senior Jeremy Buhl, may have other ideas, along with Ponca City, led by junior Chad Nieman and freshman Paul Paschal, and they will certainly be doing their best to be there at the end. Midwest City has developed a team out of thin air to head the rest of the pack.

Last year Jenks won the title without a runner in the

This is a peak experience and I suppose it's hard for someone that has not experienced it to understand. It may be different for other people--as a matter of fact, it probably is--but this is one of those times that can be remembered forever. It can be exhilarating or depressing, you can feel in control or out of control, the anticipation can almost kill you and when its over you're as limp as a rag. I love it. It teaches our young athletes about life and its challenges, joys and disappointments. Can't wait for another one!

The Oklahoma vs. Arkansas dual has turned into a quad. Set for Saturday, November 11th in Rogers, Arkansas (near Fayetteville), Kansas and Missouri athletes have been invited to make this a great opportunity for our runners to show their stuff in a great regional meet. Coaches Barry Klein, Little Axe and Dave Morton, McGuinness, have been handling the details and all is set for a super meet. Start time is 3:00 p.m.

I attended the Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Prairie Grove, Arkansas two weeks ago and it was all that I expected, again. This is a beautiful area of the country, especially at this time of year, and it is cross country at its best. The weather cooperated with cool temperatures and sunny skies and the course was just about as scenic as you can get.

There was good food after the race and the awards were held promptly. The only thing I can complain about is the awards for the high school divisions. Since Oklahoma has a silly law about accepting merchandise (T-shirts) as prizes the Oklahoma winners were given cheap medals instead. I would hope that the organizers would realize that, since Oklahoma runners take home most of the awards, they should change them to something more appropriate next year. This is definitely a race that should be on everyone's calendar.

Since I've climbed up on the soap box I guess I'll take the opportunity to address one more thing that I think needs to be changed in Oklahoma and that is the distance that the girls compete at. Most of the rest of the states have girls run 5 kilometers (3.1 miles), as do the boys. Both the A.A.U. and U.S.A. Track & Field hold age group competitions for girls and boys and in all cases they run the same distances. Younger athletes may run shorter distances but they are still the same for both sexes.

I have been told that this notion does not sit well with the small schools in the state but I would hope that we would come to realize that this simply penalizes our girls when they are looking to compete in college. I know that we were just about the last state to drop six-on-six basketball so maybe it's time to come out of the dark ages and let the girls run the same distances as the boys.

I haven't used this space to plug subscriptions to the Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS lately so maybe it's time to do it now. If you are reading this as part of the 1995 O.S.S.A.A. Cross Country State Championships and are not a regular subscriber there is a subscription blank on the back. The next issue will contain full results of the state meet and then you'll be all set for track season this spring.

top ten but this year they have senior Jeff Reid in the number three slot and a top-ten contender in junior Michael Pense. Eisenhower's Welton Jefferson has been inconsistent but is the only runner in 5A to claim a win over Thompson this season.

5A Girls

The Trojans of second-year coach Greg Rice are ranked number-one here, too, but this is one of those races that I'd rather not have to pick a favorite. Though the defending champions have not lost to a 5A team they have had some close calls, including a one-point win over Stillwater in the east regional. The Trojans won the pre-state meet at Norman--without a finisher in the top ten--but are precariously thin this year and young as well, with no seniors in their top seven. The return of sophomore All-Stater Renee Ahlgren will certainly boost their chances but she did not compete at the regionals and has only run in one meet. Their only runner in the top twenty is sophomore Kelli O'Rourke, last year's favorite but obviously struggling this year.

Stillwater has been steadily improving behind senior Lena Echelle and sophomore Kristin Scott and the Pioneers' are a legitimate championship contender. Moore and Westmoore both have team balance which will weigh heavily in the race.

Individually this class has been dominated by Owasso freshman Christine Novarra, winner of the pre-state meet in Norman and the east regional but she has not gone against west regional winner, Mustang junior, Corrie Hussar. Norman's senior Andrea DeLozier and junior Hilary Reser should challenge for the top spot along with Union's junior, Megan Riddle, winner of the 1600/3200 double on the track last spring.

**4A Boys** 

This will be another close one as arch-rivals McGuinness and Guthrie duke it out once again for the hardware. The Bluejays are the defending champions but the Irish own two titles in the past three years and this may be one of their strongest teams yet. So far this season Dave Morton's Irish have managed to beat Clay Tartar's Bluejays every time they've met but their talent is so close that it will come down to who has the best day on the Duck Pond. Carl Albert gets the nod as the best of the rest but it would be a major upset if anyone else managed to win the title.

The east regional was a nightmare for this class as the boys got off course somehow and ran almost four miles. Guthrie got the win, led by senior Jeremy Cleek, who gets the number-one ranking by a hair over McGuinness freshman Kevin Connolly. Irish junior Taylor Styron and Altus senior Brian Whitlock are both senious contenders for the title as well, both having been ranked number-one at some time during the season. Miami senior Kyle Brown, second in the east regional, is a dark horse and will certainly be in the picture at the end.

**4A Girls** 

The McGuinness girls, along with the 2A Velma-Alma girls, are probably the surest bet in the championships. It makes me nervous to say this, lest I jinx my favorite team, but they finished the season undefeated, went one-two-three-four in the west regional and will be going for their fourth title in a row and seventh in the last nine years, tying Edmond for the lead in total girls titles. However, I know that Guthrie--one-two-three in the east regional--will be doing all they can to see a different outcome and the Irish can remember winning by only 10 points at the OBU meet when defending champion Ashley

Boothe was out of the lineup. Tulsa rivals Kelley and Hale will battle it out for third with hopes of slipping into second.

There are a host of runners that have a crack at the title here, led by Boothe, teammates two-time winner Jessica Hoke, sophomore Kelly Long--second last year--and freshman sister Brooke Boothe; Guthrie junior and east regional winner Brandi Woodard and teammate senior Nicole Monroe and two of the Hale triplets, sophomores Amy--winner of the pre-state meet at Norman--and Brandy Bratton. Don't try to talk to me during this race!

3A Boys

Last year Little Axe pulled off one of the biggest upsets of the meet when they knocked-off three time champion Marlow after losing to them all year. This year coach Barry Klein's crew has the same thing in mind, hoping to catch season-long number one Dickson with the same move. The problem is that they may have alerted coach Ron Love's Comets when they came within two points of beating them for the eastern regional title. Not to be discounted either are coach Jerry Naylor's Plainview Indians who took the west regional handily over Jimmy Brackeen's Marlow Outlaws.

Dickson is led by defending champion sophomore David Lampkin, the only undefeated returning champion this year and the only freshman winner in recent memory. Leading the chase pack is Plainview senior Cory Clark followed closely by Holdenville's Ryan Tumer, Dickson's Blake Jackson and Little Axe's Jeremy Johnson and former champion Spud Blanchard, back in action

after missing the whole season due to a back injury.

3A Girls

Grove was the early season leader here, building on the strength of their runnerup finish last year but the Ridgerunners fell victims first to Marlow, then Plainview and finally Little Axe in the east regional. Coach Sherry Lovelace's team drops to third in the final rankings while the Plainview Indians have gained strength down the final stretch and are picked to return to the top of the heap again this year. The Little Axe girls are something of a novelty at the top of this class, led by senior Amriel Walters, they have continued to improve over the final weeks of the season. Jones has also been steadily improving and should be counted as a dark horse in this race.

Defending individual champion, Plainview senior Sarah Harvey, has consistently been the fastest girl in most meets regardless of class but she dropped two meets to Elgin arch-rival, senior Kelleigh Sanders, including the west regional. Grove sophomore Carly McCulley has been right there with those two and Marlow sophomore Leah McCauley is not far behind. This certainly has the potential to be the fastest race of the day for the girls.

2A Boys

This could be another close race with west regional winner Hydro playing the favorite's role going into the meet. Early season favorite Tahlequah Sequoyah, runnerup last year, stumbled in the east regional as Prague surprised them with a one-point victory, led by sophomore Daniel Stone and junior Renaldo Wiles. Coach Alan Hibler's Hydro team has no juniors or seniors and is led by sophomore Walt Ginn, fifth-ranked after a third-place west regional finish.

Individually, Velma-Alma freshman Mylo Miller has been untouchable and owns an impressive third-place finish in the Chile Pepper, ahead of 5A's Mark Thompson. The race will be for second here with Riverside's Tea Anderson, Chisholm's Shaun Sawyer and Davenport's Daniel McKinney battling it out with Ginn for the silver.

# 2A Girls

I don't know what they put in the water in Velma-Alma but it certainly makes for some impressive athletes in all sports. Not only do the Comets have the longest football winning streak in the state going (even if it only is a game) they also have an incredibly impressive girls cross country team. The Comets have the biggest apparent lock on a title in all eight races but we all know that strange their loot yet. Lexington, Tahlequah Sequoyah and Chisholm will be looking to step up if the occasion arises—even if it means the Comet's bus getting lost on the way to the meet.

Individually, Velma-Alma's Rae Ann McCurry holds down the top spot but there are four other Comets in the top ten, including Cindy Fuller and Jalynne Horn in fourth and fifth. Wakita's Nicki Lanie and Warner's Miley Turnbull will both be very capable contenders for the individual title as well.
