

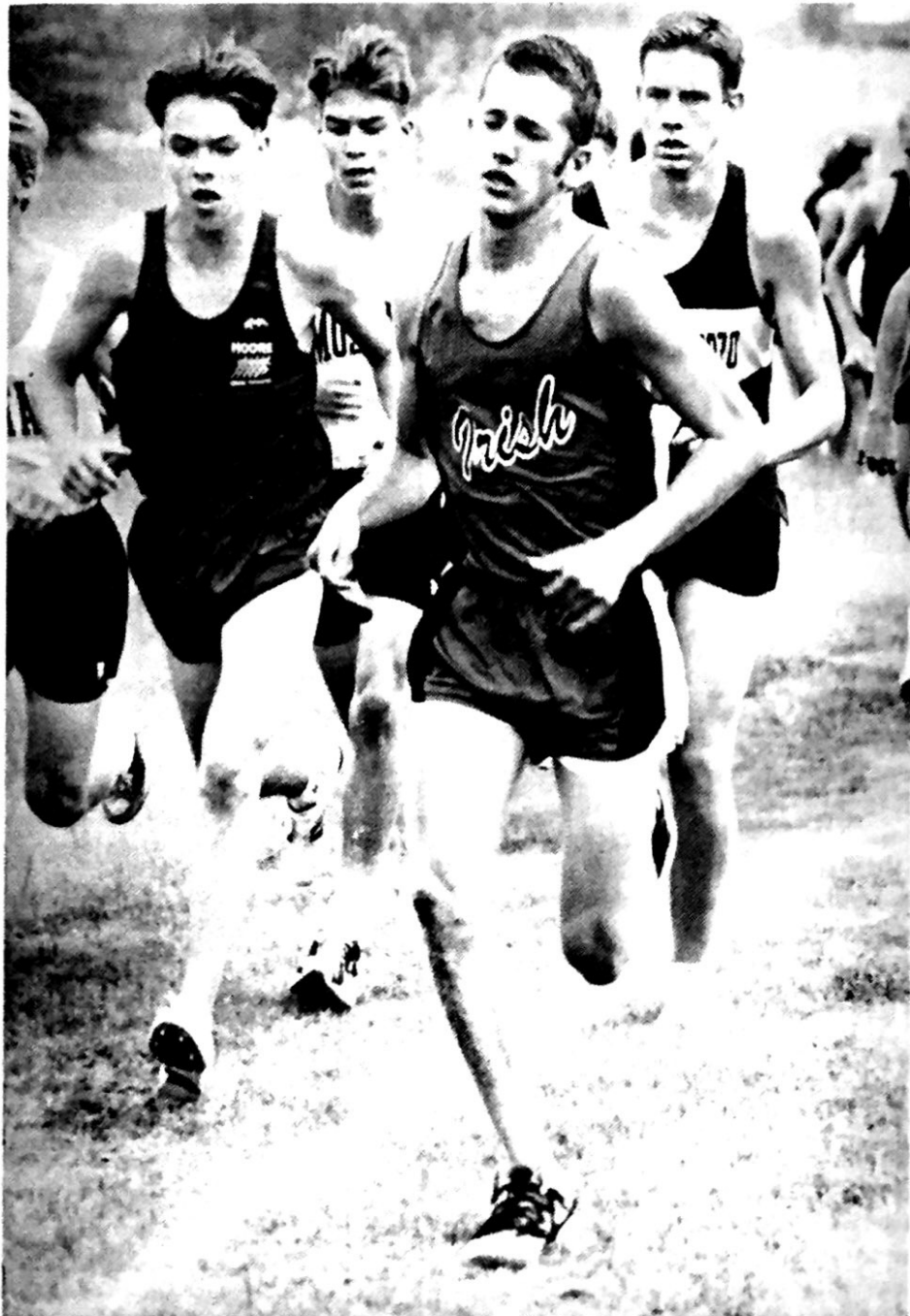

Six Champions Highlight 50 Returning All-Staters

Six of eight 1995 cross country champions lead a contingent of 50 returning All-Staters in four classes--for now--as the 1996 cross country season is well under way. As usual, there have been a few surprises with transfers and injuries and there is already an outstanding crop of newcomers.

This review is based on the meets reported up to September 10th and the TEAM REPORTS filled out and returned by coaches. The team and individual rankings are based on this information and readers are encouraged to call or write for their input on future rankings.

5A Girls

Only one of the top ten graduated last year but Norman's fifth-placer, Hilary Reser, is out due to ACL surgery, leaving eight returning All-Staters led by defending champion, Mustang senior, Corrie Hussar. Hussar had the fastest time on the state meet course in Norman last year and has been impressive so far in two early meets.

Bartlesville's Karla Hopkins transferred to Broken Arrow, lifting the Tigers into contention for team honors while two Jenks freshmen join the leaders in this class, Atalie Barber and Michelle Ahlgren. The defending champion Trojans did not lose anyone from last year's squad and the addition of these two outstanding frosh will make coach Martha O'Rourke's team one of the best in the state--period. Sapulpa, Edmond Memorial and Broken Arrow will all field tough teams and this is probably the most well-balance class in the state this year.

5A Boys

Edmond Memorial has taken command of this division, led by two-time defending champion, Mark Thompson. The Bulldogs ended Jenks' win streak at eight last year but lost three runners, though they have not been beaten so far and have two wins over the arch-rival Trojans already. Ponca City will be in this fight and they can be counted on to be in contention if they stay healthy this year. Mustang has looked good as well.

Thompson gets the nod as top individual though Charles Page's (Sand Springs) Michael Cliff beat him handily on the track and will be a real threat to end Thompson's streak at two. Other top individuals include Sapulpa's Ben Lake, Union's Jeremy Case, Eisenhower's Welton Jefferson and Ponca City's Paul Paschal. Eight of the top 15 return with Jenks' Mike Pense moving to 4A Ft. Gibson.

4A Girls

McGuinness is again the top team here and, for the moment, the top team in the state. Though they aren't as strong as they were last year individually

On TRACK

Well, here it is cross country season again. It has been a busy summer and the season is already three weeks old but before you know it, it will be November and the state meet will be over.

Lots of little bits and pieces to cover:

TEAM REPORTS went out at the end of August and are the basis for the rankings and preview in this issue. It's still not too late to get yours in if you haven't already done so.

RANKINGS will be released on a weekly basis and published every two weeks in the *Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS*. They mostly reflect what happened in the previous week with less weight given to previous weeks and very little or no consideration to next weeks' potential. This means that if a team or individual is beaten by someone with a lower ranking they will most likely move ahead of them in the rankings for the current week. Weather conditions, tough or easy courses, injuries, other competitions, missing team members, bad races, or other factors that could have influenced the race are not taken into account. Runners that miss two consecutive races for any reason, injury or other, are dropped out of the rankings until they return. My own philosophy is that if you line up to race and get beat you don't make excuses for the loss but prepare to win the next time. However, the final, pre-state ranking will be based on state meet potential.

RESULTS: rankings are based on results and unless we receive them we can't do a good job. Coaches, make sure that the meet director is planning to send full (20 deep, at least, full names and times) results as soon as the meet is over. With weekly rankings going out we have to have results in by noon on Monday to be factored into the week's ranking.

SUMMER TRACK RESULTS were promised in this issue but due to a lack of staff and time won't make it in until later this fall--if I can find someone to help type them into my format. The Tulsa Track Club has done a great job of getting results of their meets in but the sheer volume of age-group results make it tough to manage. Sooner State Games did make it in this issue--not just because I ran in them myself--which I did, with a second in the 800 meter run and a first in the 1500 meter run, but because I could drop them straight into a page without having to type them in.

A NEW CLASS A is in the works if at least 12 schools can field full teams (five runners) by the regional deadline of Oct. 11. The way I understand it is there could be both boys and girls or either one alone, depending on whether or not they meet the minimum number of schools. At this point it looks pretty good for the girls but not so great for the boys. This will drag 2A girls powers Velma-Alma and Laverne into A, much to the relief of the rest of 2A, I'm sure, which is already loaded with a host of powerful teams including several that dropped from 3A this year. There are over 190 schools with cross country this year and it keeps growing every year. Look for more class changes in the future as big schools, Norman and Moore, split into less big schools, forcing the trickle-down theory of class movement into motion.

STATE MEET is back at Oral Roberts this year after a one-year trip to Norman's Duck Pond. The date is November 2nd, I'm sure it will be here before we know it.

they do have a lot of depth and are eyeing their fifth title in a row and looking down the road to tying the record with six. Led by two-time champion, senior Ashley Boothe, and sister Brooke, Dave Morton's Irish will be out to repeat their undefeated season again.

Guthrie was gutted by graduation so Tulsa teams, Hale and Kelley look like the only 4A teams that will be able challenge McGuinness' domination. Individually this will be a tough division to All-State in with nine of the top 15 back this year. Other top contenders include Hale's Brandy and Amy Bratton, Guthrie's Brandi Woodard--three event winner on the track--and Pryor's sophomore Melissa Corlett.

Grove and Elk City swapped places with the Ridgerunners ending up in 4A and the Elks in 3A--this will make things a bit more interesting as the year progresses and 3A state runnerup Carly McCulley gets in shape.

4A Boys

If the Irish girls are strong again, the Irish boys are supermen. They return all their 1995 points, led by seniors Taylor Styron and Matt Sexauer, one-two last year, and sophomore Kevin Connolly, fourth and undefeated so far this year in 4A, putting five in the top ten ranking in this issue. Everyone else was seriously hurt by graduation so it doesn't look good for preventing an Irish double-double (back-to-back boys and girls titles). Individually, Ft. Gibson's Pense and Durant's Paul Starkus, join the Irish horde in the top group.

Only time is going to tell what other teams will step up to the top of the heap here since virtually all of them are needing some time to mature.

3A Girls

This division was gutted by class changes as Grove moved up and three perennially tough teams moved to 2A--Plainview, Jones and Elgin. Always tough Marlow, led by junior Leah McCauley, is left to battle it out with Elk City and Little Axe for the top honors. This will definitely be a division that will see some different teams at the top as the year progresses.

Individually only four of the top 15 are back due to graduation, class changes and move-outs. McCauley is joined by teammate Melissa Hinds, Elk City's Amy Kilhoffer and Cory Dirickson and Little Axe's Susie Morford and Jessica Mania at the top of the rankings. Look for lots of changes in this class this year.

3A Boys

The same goes for this class regarding class changes with newcomer Elk City getting the nod for the top spot at the moment. Forever 3A powers Little Axe and Marlow will be looking to rebuild after beating up on each other the past few years and Pawhuska will be lurking in the wings looking for an opening.

Only four of the top 15 individuals are back here as well and the Elks' John Shirley gets the top spot followed by Marlow's Kevin Minson and Little Axe's Raymond Swearingen. Others to watch include Pawhuska's Matt Benson, Marlow's David Kinsey, Little Axe's Chris McClure and Elk City's Utah Robinson.

2A Girls

This is really a tough class. Velma-Alma was the state's overall number-two team last year and lost only one runner while newcomer-to-2A Plainview won the 3A title. Jones and Elgin make strong additions to this class and everyone is probably hoping that a new class A manages to form and drag the Comets away to dominate it.

Eleven of 15 top runners return and with the addition of two top 3A runners this is the class most loaded with returning placemen. Champion Rae Ann McCurry of Velma-Alma leads the pack right now but new O.S.S.A. school Victory Christian has Tasha Lance to challenge for the top spot. Plainview's Becky Harvey, sister of phenomenal Sarah, will be tough as will Warner's Miley Turnbull and Velma's Amber Thacker.

2A Boys

2A boys will be especially tough as well with defending champion Tahlequah Sequoyah back along with Hydro--last year's runnerup returning all their points--Dickson, Elgin, Plainview and Prague.

Individually, Velma-Alma's Mylo Miller, winner as a freshman last year and one of the best runners in the state regardless of class, is back along with Chandler's Bobby Holmes and Hydro's Walt Ginn. This will be an especially tough class to medal in, just like the girls, and the team race will be wide open.

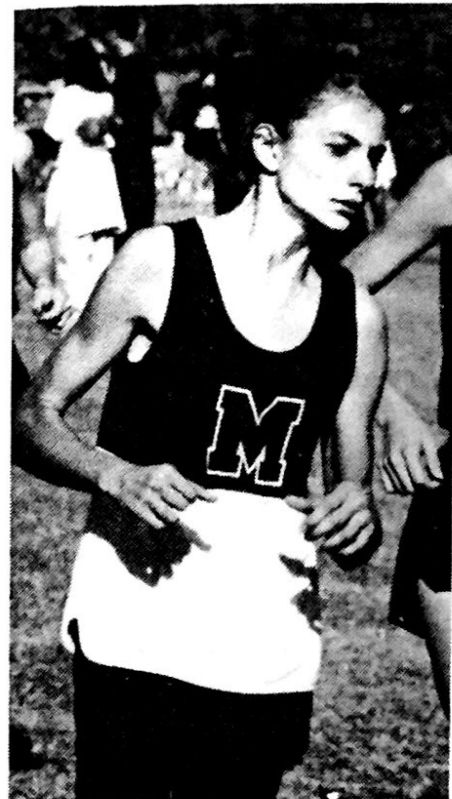
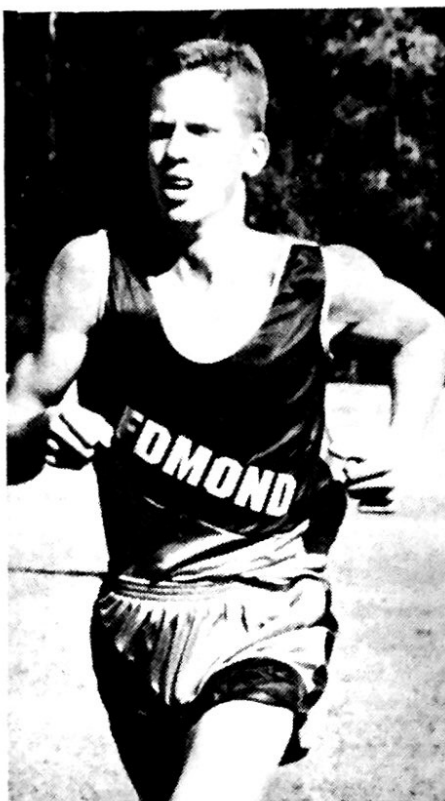

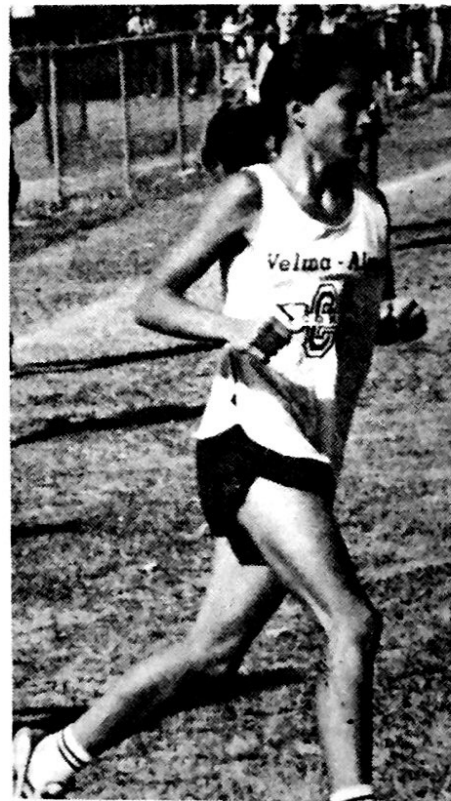
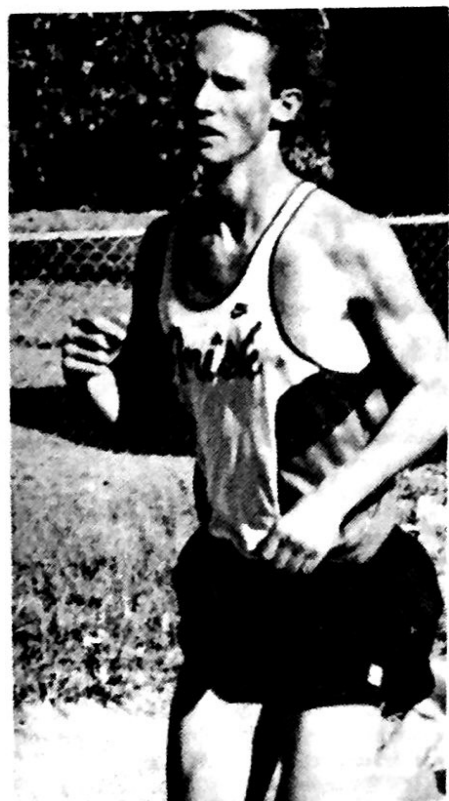

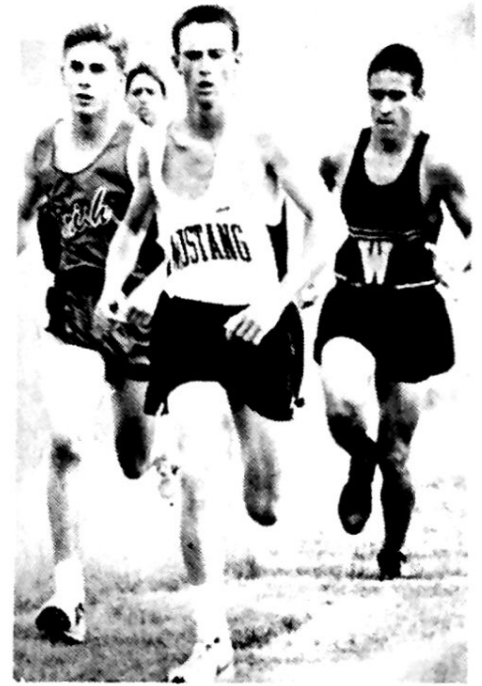
