# 4A-5A State Championships

At UCO Wantland Stadium

The opening day of the 4A-5A State Track Championships at UCO's Wantland Stadium in Edmond saw some fierce action, including dropped batons in four relays. But when the dust settled on Saturday, all four favorites had claimed their titles as predicted by regional points.

Five meet records fell during the two days, including a spectacular double in the 200 dash on Saturday--even though lack of watches on the hand-held times will prevent them from being recognized as official state

Edmond Memorial won the meet's first final with a near-record performance in the 3200 meter relay--amazingly without their superstar Mark Thompson. The Bulldogs ran within 2.5 seconds of Guthrie's 1985 record of 7:46.9 and, after Thompson's winning 1:54.20 in the open 800, it doesn't take much calculating to figure that they could have set a new state record with him in the lineup.

Thompson squared-off with defending 3200 champion Michael Cliff of Charles Page in the first of their much-anticipated double 1600/3200 showdown. Cliff set the pace for seven laps but Thompson took off on the gun lap and Cliff could only hang with him through the curve, dropping off on the back side as Thompson cruised home to the win in 9:28.08 to Cliff's 9:35.9.

Norman had the season's fastest time in the 400 relay but the Tigers dropped the baton on their third exchange to eliminate them from the finals. Pre-meet team favorite, Santa Fe, took advantage of the situation to open Saturday's events with the win in the 400 relay and continued to pile up the points in the sprint and hurdle events, winning by a hefty 44-point margin over runnerup Moore.

The Wolves of coach Carl Hawkins scored 20 points in the hurdles, finishing 1-2 in each with Isaac Robinson taking the

gold in both.

In contrast to Friday's almost perfect weather, the hot, windy conditions on Saturday put a serious damper on the 1600 races. Cliff set a record-breaking pace for the first two laps but couldn't hold it through the third. Sapulpa's Ben Lake took

## On Track

This is the last issue of the 1997 high school season. The next issue will be out late next summer and will cover all the summer U.S.A. Track & Field meets that I receive. There are five issues in the fall covering cross country, every two weeks through the season until the state meet.

This is the first time in five years that all six of the state meets have been covered in the same issue. This worked out well this year and gives me an opportunity to give each class the coverage it deserves both in photographs and a story--even if it does cost more and take a full 32 pages.

I was very pleased with the response I got at the small school state meets as I worked my way through the crowd hawking copies of Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS. It's pretty obvious to me that is a group that is hungry for Oklahoma high school track results and I hope that I'm at least partly filling that need. I haven't met anyone that would admit to being satisfied at the space devoted to coverage of track in our state's two major newspapers. That's not the fault of the writers, but rather the space they're given to fill. It doesn't seem fair to see a tiny story on the state track meet that involves at least 32 state championships and close to 30 teams compared to a huge story on soccer or baseball where only a couple of teams play and one championship is at stake.

The only way to remedy that problem is to call or write the editor of the paper and let them know that you're not satisfied with the space allowed to cover track.

There has been quite a bit of controversy over the past weeks, peaking during the 4A-5A state meet at UCO, over "official" state records. Long time track follower and historian, Ray Soldan, has a guest editorial in this issue on that topic. We welcome comments and suggestions. It's a complicated issue and there are probably no really simple answers, but I hope that the OTCA can come up with some firm quidelines for records in the future.

Speaking of guidelines. The enforcement of the rather petty uniform rules seems to be reaching a new high. Disqualifying athletes over insignificant issues like whether their uniform is pinned or taped seem to be going a bit too far. I don't think there should be no uniform rules, but I do think we need to re-visit the underlying reasons, and try to bring the enforcement back in line with the intentions of the rules.

With cross country season on the horizon it's time to think about summer training and summer camps. I've gone to camp for the last four years and have to say that it is an experience that the kids never forget. I'm of the opinion that camp is not especially a time to get in shape but rather a time to build team camaraderie and get individual interests headed in the right direction. I haven't had time to chase camp directors for advertisements, but I do have information on quite a few camps in our area and around the nation. Please give me a call if you need some information about taking your team to a camp or attending one as an individual.

the lead with a burst at the beginning of the gun lap but Thompson powered past him to win in 4:18.66, well off Larry Rose's 1967 record of 4:11.

With Thompson winning everything from 800 up, Edmond North's Terrance Wakefield took everything from 400 down. The senior sprint star was outstanding in winning three golds in the 100, 200 and 400, but missed out on two records. His meet record in the 200 of 20.37 was eclipsed by 4A's Chauncey Raiden, Altus, who clocked 20.05, though both were hand held times with only one watch on the race, therefore, neither can be considered for an overall state record. In the 100, Wakefield's 10.39 was only .01 second off the meet record, and that was after the first start was recalled due to a slipped starting block.

Norman's Josh Howk won both weight events, taking the shot with a toss of 57-4 and the discus with a 157-10. Choctaw's Eugene Drake won the long jump with a leap of 23-1.5, Tahlequah's Garrett Crawford jumped 6-8 to win the high jump and Choctaw's Mike Westlund grabbed the pole vault gold with a 14-6.

Moore edged Muskogee for the runnerup trophy, 60-59, on the strength of a second place finish in the meet's final event, the 1600 relay.

#### 5A Girls

Jenks was knocked off the victory stand last year when their winning 1600 relay team was disqualified for throwing the baton. Martha O'Rourke's Trojans were out to make sure that nothing was going to keep them from the top of the podium this year. So, when the opening day saw them grab the 3200 relay title and score 34 points, they were well on their way to their expected title, especially after the Northwest Classen runner fell on the first exchange of the 400 relay preliminaries.

The Trojans dropped the baton themselves on the second exchange in the 800 meter relay prelims while Northwest ran a scalding, season best 1:40 in their heat. But the Knights were mortally wounded when they were subsequently disqualified from the 800/1600 relays and a second-place finish in the 300 hurdles for entering a runner in more than four events.

Del City took advantage of Northwest's disqualification, winning the 400, 800 and 1600 relays--all events the Knights had season-leading times in--but it still wasn't enough to knock the Trojans off their path to the victory stand. It certainly would have made the team race more interesting, with almost 80 points difference, and it was a shame a coach's mistake cost a bunch of girls their medals.

Edmond Memorial's Andrea Bell was the only double winner, taking both the 100 and 300 hurdles. A transfer from B.T. Washington, Bell joined an elite group when she claimed her fourth straight 300 title. The 800 race saw Midwest City junior Marthia Robinson edge Jenks' teammates Kelly O'Rourke and Atalie Barber for the gold while Bartlesville's Stephanie Webb

ran away from the field in the 1600, winning with the fastest time in all this year's state meets, 4:18.26.

The meet's first final saw an incredible four teams drop below 9:40 in the 3200 relay with Jenks coming from behind to win in 9:31.65.

In the sprints, Muskogee's Cherise Culton took the 100 with a 12.15; Aishia Gordon of Northwest won the 200 with a 24.04 and Broken Arrow freshman Jessica Talton won the 400 with 57.75.

In the field events, Mustang's Jenny Morrow won the shot with a toss of 40-0.75; Joslyn Ross of Broken Arrow took the discus with a heave of 121-6; Edmond Memorial's Shayla Austin won the long jump with a leap of 18-6.5 and Tahlequah's Jessica Lingor won the high jump at 5-6.

### **4A Boys**

Led by Chauncey Raiden's four gold medal performance, the Altus Bulldogs romped to their third straight title with a 103-70 margin over runnerup Carl Albert. It was the fifth overall state track title for Altus.

Raiden swept the 200 and 400 and anchored the Bulldogs winning 400 and 1600 relay teams.

"Three times in a row; it feels good," said Altus coach Jeep Johnson. "We scored just about every point we had expected

"Raiden is just a super talent. He has a track scholarship to Oral Roberts."

Raiden won the 400 for the third straight year with an outstanding 47.59.

But the 200 was Raiden's masterpiece. He ran the fastest ever 200 in state history by a whole bunch: 20.05 compared to the state record of 20.8. However, it won't be accepted as a state record since there was only one hand held watch on the race.

The top five teams all finished in perfect order of their pre-meet rankings based on regional performances. B.T. Washington's Aaron Lockett took the 100 in 10.57 but pulled up hurt in the 200. Carl Albert's Nathan Mata anchored his team's winning 3200 relay and them came back to win the 1600 with a time of 4:39.14--his sister Sarah was third in the 800.

Duncan's Josh Dial, the nephew of state record holder Joe Dial, set a new meet record in the pole vault with a leap of 15-4.5, breaking the old record set in 1989 by Heath Hanoch of Claremore. Ada's Brian Thomas, who was dethroned as 4A discus champion on Friday by Duncan's Lute Croy, came back to win his first ever state shot medal, a gold one, with a toss of 56-0.5.

The hurdles were won by Webster's Matieu Astier, who took the 110's with a time of 14.63, and Altus' DaRandle Shivers, who won the 300's with a 37.83. Hale's Chuck Mahan was the long jump winner with a leap of 23-7.5, the best in all the state meets, and Chickasha's Austin Johnson won the high jump with a leap of 6-8, another overall meet best along with Forgan's Class B winner, Preston Starr, 5A's Johnson and 4A runnerup, Tywon Harring of Tulsa Central.

#### 4A Girls

Coach Greg Nash's Hornets from B.T. Washington were on a mission this year, and though they were not ranked No. 1 until the final pre-meet ranking, they knew they had a chance to win it all from the beginning of the season.

With Northwest Classen up to 5A and

With Northwest Classen up to 5A and McGuinness down to 3A, this was a wide-open race. The Hornets, behind the heroics of senior Kim Schumpert, outpointed rival Tulsa Central, 67-54, to take home the trophy in one of the closest state meets this year.

Schumpert missed the 1996 state meet

when a court ruled against her in an eligibility case. She made up for it, streaking to victory in the 100 and 200 plus anchoring the Hornets' champion 400 and 800 relay units.

Tulsa Central hurdler Alesha Peel put her name among the honored list of fourtime winners of a single event. She won the 100 hurdles with a 14.54, a shade less than her winning 14.46 a season ago.

Duncan claimed two meet records as their 3200 relay team clocked a 9:42.09 to edge McGuinness' 1994 time of 9:42.77, even with a .24 added due to a hand held time, and then Amonica Wiggins, the 3200 relay anchor, ran a meet best 56.72 in the 400. The old 400 mark was 57.59 set by Darlena Morganfield of MacArthur in 1986.

Brandy Bratton of Hale beat defending champion Brandi Woodard of Guthrie to the tape in the 800, 2:18.55 to 2:19.60. Woodard also failed to defend her 1600 crown with Tracy Kmetz of Kelley, second a year ago, winning this time in 5:22.65. Woodard id repeat at 3200 champ with an 11:39.55.

Tulsa Central's Shaleah Taylor took the 300 hurdle crown, edging Noble's Lori Weaver who tripped on the last hurdle and fell over the finish line.

Kelley's Elizabeth Bashaw won her third straight long jump title with a leap of 18-4.25 and MacArthur's Kendall Arant defended her high jump crown with a jump of 5-6.

Woodward's Kristie Little took both throwing events with a 38-8.5 in the shot and a 129-6 in the discus.



## State Meet Class 3A-2A

At Choctaw High School

Seldom in the spotlight, the discus throw was the featured event of the 1997 state track and field meet, staged at Choctaw, May 9-10.

Rightly so, because the years on;y two state record setters, Kyle Bookout of Stroud and Bambi Carson of Marlow, were on hand to demonstrate their skills.

Neither disappointed.

Bookout launched the second best ever Oklahoma boys throw of 191-7 to break the 2A meet record by almost eight feet. His state record toss of 192-1 came on April 1 (no foolin') in the Cushing Invitational.

Carson authored the second best ever girls throw of 152-10 to break the 3A girls meet record by 21 feet. Two weeks earlier, Bambi had smashed the existing state standard by more than 12 feet with a 157-10 fling at the Weatherford Invitational.

The 3A boys discus competition was just that: "competition." Elk City sophomore Charlie Atteberry avenged his only loss of the season by edging defending champion Noah Henson of Tuttle, 173-5 to 172-9.5. Both were more than seven feet beyond the previous meet best of 165-5.

The team titles were carried home by McGuinness (3A boys), Grove (3A girls), Prague (2A boys) and Plainview (2A girls).

It's the first state track title for the McGuinness and Prague boys, the third straight for the grove girls and No. 8 in 10 years for the plainview girls.

3A Boys

Put the finish line far, far away, throw in a few hills and the McGuinness runners are hard to beat.

This spring, the Irish boys, five times state cross-country champions in the last six years, have turned out to be pretty fair flat-landers, too.

In just his second year as head boys coach, Scott Stevenson's forces won their first-ever state track and field championship by outdistancing runner up Spiro, 85-62. McGuinness' scoring method was highly predictable: 20 points in the 1600

and 16 points each in the 800, 3200 and 3200 relay.

That's 68 distance points and all the Irish needed.

Sophomore Kevin Connolly, state cross-country champ last fall, won the 3200 meters in 9:44.17 and the 1600 in 4:27.64. Junior Anthony Moses captured the 800 in 1:58.21.

Weatherford prevented a distance title slam by the irish by beating them in the long relay, 8:06.99 to 8:08.53.

Spiro's Brian Steele carted home three gold medals, winning the 100 in 10.94, the 200 in 21.99, and anchoring the winning 1600 relay team home in 3:22.28.

While henson was winning the discus crown for Tuttle last year at 157-0, freshman Atteberry qualified for the state meet but went unplaced. "Freshmen jitters," he said.

Atteberry's winning throw this year came on his first attempt and the 173-5 was a personal best by more than three feet. In the shot, Atteberry was second to Nate Niehus of Grove, last year's runnerup, 58-11.5 to 56-0.

Cushing's Jamal Jackson repeated as intermediate hurdles champ, trimming his winning time form 39.31 to 38.58.

3A Girls

The Grove girls do love those relays. In winning three consecutive state titles, the lady Ridgerunners rolled up 314 points and 140 of them came in relays--52 in 1995, 40 in 1996 and 48 in 1997.

Sherry McCulley's current squad won the 1600 relay in a meet record 4:02.93 and placed second in the 800 and third in the 3200. Besides anchoring the 1600 quartet, Abby Robertson won the 300 low hurdles in a record 44.48 and the 100 highs.

Abby bagged the lows in 1995 and 1996, also. Shaunti Lusk of Millwood, the 1996

winner of the 100 hurdles, was nipped by Robertson at the tape, 15.86 to 15.89.

Other members of Groves record-setting 1600 relay unit are Kayla Webb, Keri Harris and Cheryl Vanlear.

Marlow finished second to grove by 102-90 margin, but the Lady Outlaws can always brag about Bambi. That would be Bambi Carson, who warms for her huge discus toss by winning the shot on Friday with a 43-0.25. It was also a meet record, breaking her own mark of 41-0, set in 1005

Hobbled by a basketball knee injury last season, Carson managed only a third place discus toss of 120-11. She had lifted the meet mark to 132-10 as a sophomore.

No problem this year for the 5-10, 175 pounder, who sailed the disc 152-10. Five of her six discus flings at the state meet exceeded 140 feet, averaging 145-6. The state record before Carson's 157-10 butchered it on April 29 was 146-6.5.

"I had a really good season," Carson under-stated.

Shlaunda Hayes of Millwood made three trips to the top step of the victory stand, winning the 100 in 12.39, the 200 in 25.61 and contributing to the falcons' 400 relay record of 48.37. She won the 100 in 1996 and this year edged defending 200 champion April Steele of Spiro.

Sophomore Kristen Rogers of Mannford won her second high jump crown (5-4) and Kendra Morris of Byng repeated in the long jump (17-11).

Meet records were toppled in both 3200 meter races with senior Katie McGraw of Cascia Hall doing the solo job in 11:21.47 and Marlow's relay gang of Leah McCauley, Michelle Poeling, amber Staats and Melissa Hines completing their task in 9:46.80.

McGraw's time was especially noteworthy because it was a full 20 seconds better than former Cascia star Natalie Gray had ever done in winning four straight 3200 titles (1991-91) in 2A. The 3A record Katie broke by almost 13 seconds was held by another 4-time, 3200 champion, Sarah Harvey of Plainview (1993-96).

McGraw finished second in last falls 3A cross-country championships. But in her record race at Choctaw, she outlegged two cross-country winners, 3A's Leah McCauley of Marlow (fourth) and 4A's Ashley Boothe of McGuinness (second).

2A Boys

Sure, Kyle Bookout of Stroud was the big story, but the state team championship trophy resides in another Lincoln County trophy case-that of the Prague Red Devils.

Prague, coached by Charles Anderson, was one of those sneaky winners, pecking away here and there, scoring in 11 events and winding up with 74 points to Watonga's 61.

tonga's 61.

The big bonanzas came with championships in the 1600 and 3200 relays. Ryan Friend and Roderick Burdine ran legs on each and were joined by Eric Jordan and Travis Burdine in the 1600 and Daniel Stone and Tim Guess in the 3200.

The mile unit notched a meet record 3:21.42. Watonga, which trailed Prague only 54-49 entering the wrap-up relay, came home third in the race.

High jumper Dustin Ripley gave Prague it's only individual winner, clearing 6-6.

Before leaving Lincoln County, let's talk about senior Bobby Holmes of Chandler. There's a lot to say.

Holmes scored a 2A sweep of the 800, 1600, and 3200 when he was a sophomore. Last year, Chandler was in 3A, where Holmes won the 3200, place third in the 800 and fourth in the 1600.

This year, Holmes was at his sparkling best, smashing meet records in the 800, with an outstanding 1:54.24, and the 3200 with a 9:53.77. The former 800 mark (1:55.7 by Craig Curtis of Laverne) had been on the books for 21 years.

Holmes, a state cross-country champion last fall, won the 1600 at this years regional, but didn't place at the state meet. That title went to David Lampkin of dickson, who had won the 2A 3200 last year when Holmes was busy winning the same event in 3A.

Lampkin took silver behind Holmes in this years 3200 and has posted cross-country finishes of first, second and third, his title coming back in 1994.

Heath Guthery of Jones swept the hurdles and Larry Crenshaw of Chelsea scored a double in the 100 and 200 and ran on the Green Dragons' champion 400 relay team.

No, Kyle Bookout, we haven't forgotten

you.

After winning the discus Friday with his mammoth 191-7, which broke the 182-8 state meet mark of his brother, Casey, the 6-7, 281 pound junior came back with a gold medal 55-10.5 effort in the shot.

"I was hoping for a 190," Bookout said of his discus performance, "I could tell it was a good one when I released it."

#### 2A Girls

It may have seemed eternity to the Plainview girls, but actually only two years had passed since they won the state track championship.

Plainview strung together seven titles in a row from 1988 through 1994 before slumping to fourth in 1995 and fifth in 1996 (both years in 3A). But now they're bach up on top--way up-- having outscored runnerup Warner, 110 points to 66.

This isn't to say that Plainview wins only when it's in class 2A. Four of it's eight championships were as a 3A school.

Keying the charge for coach Jerry Naylor's girls this time were the victories by the 1600 and 3200 relay teams, individual triumphs by April Holmes in the 200 and Becky Harvey in the 3200, plus depth and more depth.

Plainview scored in 12 events with 16 different girls contributing points. Only Lycrisha Lampkin ran on both winning relay teams.

Amber Crumbo, from somewhere in northeast Oklahoma, won her fourth consecutive shot put title. in 1994 and 1995, Amber tossed the ball 40-2 and 42-6.75 for Sperry. In 1996, it was 43-4.25 for Hominy and this year, 43-0.25 for Chelsea.

Crumbo also won the discus in 1996, but was second to Dorita Dotson of Wynnewood this season.

"I was disappointed I didn't beat the record again this year," Crumbo said. Her throws in '95 and '96 were both record setters. "But I only missed 40 feet once (in '97), so I guess it was a good year."

Warner's Miley Turnbull won the 800 and 1600 and ran second to Plainview's Harvey in the 3200, while Juli Loveless of Adair took both hurdles. It's a repeat for Turnbull in the mile and Loveless in the lows.

At Yukon High School

Oklahoma's Class A and B track champions for 1997 -- Heritage Hall (A Boys), Hydro (B Boys), Boise City (A Girls) and Beaver (B Girls) -- all found sure-fire ways to carve out their titles at the Yukon High School track May 9-10.

None employed a more clear-cut method than Mike Jinkans' Boise City Lady Wildcats: WIN EVERY RELAY!

During the 16 years that four relays have been on the girls track program, a sweep has been accomplished just six time.

Those relay hogs have been: Wynnewood -- 1983.

Madill -- 1986.

John Marshall -- 1988, 1991, 1992.

Boise City -- 1997.

Still in a unique category as the only girl to run on four relay champions in a single year is Angela Harman of Wynnewood, who anchored all four of the champion Savage relay units in 1983.

Harman would have done it again in 1984 as a senior, but wynnewood's 3200 team was nipped for the title by less than a

second and a half by Hobart.

A Boys

When you own a stable of good half-milers, ride them for all they're worth. That certainly paid off for Heritage Hall coach Keith Cassell as the northside Oklahoma City school won its third state team title.

The aptly-named Chargers took the 3200 relay by almost 100 meters and placed 2-3-4 in the open 800. That accounted for 38 of Heritage Hall's 62 points for a 13-point advantage over runnerup Velma-Alma.

Commerce's Tyson Trimble won the 800 with a clocking of 1:59.44, moving up from his third-place finish of 1996. Galloping home close behind Trimble were the three Heritage Hall "hosses' -- senior Blake Pardee (1:59.87), senior Sean Strickland (2:00.69) and junior Jimmy Jernigan (2:01.60).

Joined by freshman Wes Welker, the four Heritage half-milers clocked 8:25.95

in winning the 3200 relay.

"Everything fell in place for us," Cassell said. "Dropping down a class this year (after scoring 12 points in 2A last season) certainly helped. So did our regular-season competition. At most meets this year, we were the smallest school in the class in which we competed."

The last time Heritage Hall won the state title (1988), it also was due to distance strength. Brent Johnson won the 1600 and 3200 in '88 and the Chargers bagged the

3200 relay.

The individual Class A star for 1997 is University of Kansas-bound sprinter Jabari Wamble of Oklahoma Christian School. He swept the 100, 200 and 400 with readings of 11.83, 22.54 and 49.99. Jabari had no fourth event because the slim Saints

Wamble won state gold in the 100 and 200 last year and was third in the 200 in

"This is the first year I've run the 400," Wamble said. "Probably the 200 and up are my races of the future the way I'm built (lean and lanky), most likely the 400, one of those races where it hurts."

Three other defending state champions were on hand in A Boys. Jason McDonald of Foyil won the 1600 again and Velma-Alma's Mylo Miller, 1995 cross country champion, repeated in the 3200.

However, Tonkawa's Zac Swords slipped to fourth in the pole vault, which

was won by Mangum's Reed Box at 13-3. Joe Swallow of Laverne swept the shot (52-3) and discus (147-9).

Showing his versatility, Josh Brown of Foyil won the high jump with a leap of 6-7. During the football season the talented junior scored 30 touchdowns for Foyil's state semifinalists and kicked a 61-yard field goal in a playoff game -- the longest in state high school history from scrimmage.

The state record 63-yard field goal by Tim Sydnes of Putnam City West was a free kick following a fair catch.

#### A Girls

Lori Crabtree of Boise City likely enjoyed the finest moment of her track career about 3:30 p.m. on the Saturday of the 1997 Class A finals.

At that time, the senior running machine won her seventh state gold medal. It was special because it was her first individual first, coming in the 300 hurdles in the near-record time of 45.97. Lori's previous six gold, plus an eight one garnered an hour later in the 1600 relay, all came in baton events.

Crabtree ran on three championship relay teams this year and also in 1996, when Boise City was the state team champion in Class B. She was a member of the Lady Wildcats' 1600 relay queens in 1996. Two other Boise City seniors, Rachel

Two other Boise City seniors, Rachel Rosebery and Janna Williams, ran legs on three of the Cats' four champion baton teams this year and two each in 1995.

"We're proud that we've won the 1600 relay three straight years," said Boise City coach Jinkans.

The Wildcats now hold the meet record for the showcase race in both Class G (4:05.89 in 1995) and Class A (4:05.36 this year).

Teya Gill of Luther took the second step on a path which could lead to a historic achievement. She swept the state 100, 200 and 400 last year as a freshman and now again as a sophomore.

Only two state athletes, both of them girls, have ever won two events four years in a row. No one has scored a four-year slam in three events.

The double sweeps to date belong to Stephanie Childers of Comanche (1982084) and Marlow (1985) in the 100 and long jump and Natalie Gray of Cascia Hall (1991-94) in the 1600 and 3200. Gray is also the only four-time cross country winner in state history.

"The 200 race is my favorite because it's the last one of the day," Gill said half-jokingly. "It's also the only race that I'm unbeaten." Bonita Stevenson of Crescent rubbed out a 14-year-old meet record by over three feet in the discus. Her 133-8 throw, in an event in which she had to settle for a silver medal last year, was a career best by more than 12 feet. It shot down the 130-3 Jackie Rich of Healdton posted in 1983.

Stevenson also won the shot with a peg of 39-8. That was important to her family-wise because a brother, Eric, now on the OSU football squad, won the two weight events for Crescent in 1996.

Crescent coach Wayne Owens has already set 1998 goals for his powerful junior: "45 in the shot, 150 in the discus. She just needs to follow through (as she did with her 133-8 cast). Ninety per cent of the time, she stops before her release."

Velma-Alma's Rae Ann McCurry, twice a state cross country champion, failed to repeat in the 800, falling to fifth, but she bounced back later to comfortably win the 1600 in 5:29.83.

B Boys

No, Hydro's distance aces do not train by running round-trip to Clinton every day, nor even to Weatherford.

But the obviously pack some big mileage into their work as attest back-to-back state championships, sandwiched around the 1996 cross country title.

Junior Walt Ginn won the 800 (1:58.81), 1600 (4:39.76) and finished second to sophomore teammate Herby Pebeashy in the 3200. Pebeashy, who won the state cross country championship last fall, was runnerup to Ginn in the 1600.

Ginn also joined Chris Tookalo, Mike Gossen and Ryan Pieper to win the 3200 relay. With a season left, Ginn owns 10 state meet medals, seven of the gold, and has finished 13th, second and fifth in the last three cross country state meets.

All 73 Hydro points came from the four distance events. Well behind Alan Hibler's tireless striders, tied with 54 points each, were Cherokee, Covington-Douglas and Medford.

"We brought 10 runners," said Hibler, "and return nine of the, including all of the points." Randy Overton of Covington-Douglas duplicated his hurdles sweep of a year ago by logging 15.46 in the 100's and 40.01 in the 300's.

Alan Huddleston of Texhoma-Goodwell repeated in the pole vault with a one-foot improvement to 12-6.

Cement's Kirk Halcomb topped his winning 6-4 high jump of 1996 with a 6-6, but that wasn't enough because Preston Starr of Forgan (third last year at 6-4 on misses) climbed to a championship 6-8.

Nick Andrew of Maysville went from a 1996 runnerup finish to the discus crown with a heave of 143-4; as defending champion Josh McReynolds of Pond Creek-Hunter slipped to third.

#### **B** Girls

Beaver wins because it thinks it is supposed to do so. The 1997 championship by Mike McVay's Lady Dusters is their sixth in eight years.

The title race came down to the concluding 1600 relay. Beaver and Fox both had 60 points. Neither is a relay giant, having placed third in regional qualifying.

However, Fox wasn't even in the race, having been eliminated in Friday's preliminaries. Beaver had the fourth fastest prelim time and that's just where the Dusters finished for a 68-60 victory over the Foxes.

## What's a State Record?

Still up in the air is the record-keeping problem created by the totally out-of-context clockings of the 200 meter races in the Class 4A and 5A state meet at UCO's Wantland

When the "official" result sheet was printed out, a red light flashed.

The results showed:

Altus' Chauncey Raiden won the 4A race in 20.05. Edmond North's Terrance Wakefield won the 5A race in 20.37. Edmond Santa Fe's JEremy Boudreau was second in 5A in 21.00.

No way! All are quality sprinters, but no way!

The national high school record is 20.00, set in 1985 by a Texan, Roy Martin of Dallas

The nation's three fastest high school clockings in 1996 were 20.82, 20.90, and 20.93,

all in Texas. No one else in the United States broke 21 flat.

Of course, these national times were recorded electronically and were below the wing

allowance of 2 meters per second, which figures out to 4.473 m.p.h.

A quick check of the races for the two questioned Oklahoma races revealed they were not electronically (Accutrack) timed because the running direction had been reversed and the Accutrack equipment had not ben moved.

The finishing straight-away was south to north--with the wind.

A call to the Weather Bureau established that the wind velocity in the city area at 4 p.m., the approximate race time, was 18 m.p.h. with gusts to 22.

Wind, however, has never been a consideration in establishing Oklahoma high school

records. Wind gauges are not used at high school meets in the state. Isn't Oklahoma wing always above 5 m.p.h. in April and May?

UCO track coach Paul Parent, director of this year's 5A-4A state meet, said that in Wantlands sunken bowl "the runners aren't going to catch the wind (on the 200) until the last 80 yards'

What was dont not in lieu of no Accutrack was to put three watches on the first place

finisher. Only one watch caught the winning 20.05 and 20.37 times.

That immediately disqualifies them from state record consideration.

Track authority Glenn Chowins, who annually serves as a referee at the state meet, said: "In no way would I consider a race timed with one watch for a record. Just call it unoffical exhibition.'

The Track and Field News had a formula for adjusting a 3-watch, hand timed race to

an electronic equivalent: Add 24-hundreths of a second (.24).

That's the standard that has been followed in the last few years (even with a one-watch time) when the Accutrack has failed to produce a picture of the race at a state meet.

State meet records by class were the creation of Daily Oklahoman track writer Ray Soldan in the late 1970's to give gaols for athletes in all classes. Only performances made in the State meet are included.

Through the years, there has been an occasional decision to make, usually where to fit in a new class.

This 200 problem because these times are so off the wall.

Using the past procedure, we'd add .24 to each, making Raiden's 4A state meet record 20.29 and Wakefield's 5A record 20.61.

Parent believes the proper formula is to round up the hand time to the next 10th, then

add.24. That would make it 20.34 for Raiden, 20.64 for Wakefield.

What we're left with are still virtually untouchable marks.

More food for thought: Oklahoma recognized state 200 record is 20.8 by David Oaks of Southeast, who went on to prove he was one of America's premier fliers while competing for the Oklahoma Sooners.

Oak's race, in the 1990 Elk City Invitational, was not electronically timed. But four watches on first place reportedly averaged just over 20.70. At the time, that figure was just rounded up to 20.8 with no .24 added.

So, Oaks' time perhaps should be should be re-adjusted to 21.04.

Would it still be a state record? No. Alan Brown of Norman had an Accutrack 21.03 in the 1990 state meet, Oklahoma's fastest electronically timed 200.

Would Brown beat Oaks? Maybe yes, maube no.

Both were seniors in 1990, but rairly met head-up. The day brown won the 5A state meet title with his 21.03, Oaks won 4A with a 21.14.

In the '90 John Jacobs, Oaks won his class in 21.30, Brown his in 21.62.

They did face off at least one time that season in the Western Heights Invitation at.

Oaks won in 21.0. Brown was second with no time listed.

There had been a chance that the state meet 200 dilemma might be ironed out because a bach up electronic timing device owned by UCO was being operated from the pressbox.

But when the operators of that camera called down to the timing table to see if they

should make an attempt to shoot across the field to catch the race, they recieved a flippent

They turned the machine off.

The UCO camera did give proper reading on the 4A girls 3200 meter relay, during which the Accutrack malfunctioned. Thus Duncan's winning record time will go down as 9:40.82, an improvement over the hand-held figures.

### COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY TRACK UPDATE

Big 12 Championships - Waco, TX - May 16-18

The OU Sooners and the OSU Cowboys ventured south of the Red River landing deepintheharta Texas for the inaugural Big 12 outdoor meet in sun-drenched Waco. The host Baylor Bears provided a fast track on which to settle some conference scores before moving on to the national meet in Bloomington, Indiana.

Women

On the women's side, OU and OSU finished 10th and 11th respectively. OSU's Tracyan Baker narrowly lost a close one in the 100 meters, finishing third by .06 hundreths of a second to Texas' Sabrina Kelly and Nanceen Perry. Baker's time was 11.35 (she had previously autoqualified for nationals with an 11.34). Teammate Sherita Jackson finished sixth in 11.48. In the 200 meters, Baker and Jackson scored impressive times of 23.17 and 23.32 respectively, Baker's time being the 4th fastest in the country this year. They also teamed up to lead the Cowgirls to a fifth place finish (45.03) behind the Sooners' third place quartet (44.86) in the 400 meter relay.

The 400 meters provided some thrills as the Sooners' Cecile Cargill finished a close second to Texas' Suziann Reid in 52.03 (Cargill has the fifth fastest time with an

auto-qualifying 51.94)
The Sooners' Silke Vogel navigated the 800 meters in 2:14.34 for sixth, but not quite fast enough to qualify for the national meet. Lawanda Dyson also scored for the Sooners with a third place 60.04 clocking in the 400 meter

Oklahoma's great 1600 meter relay unit qualified earlier this season with the nation's second fastest time of 3:31.73, but could manage only a fourth place finish with a disappointing 3:36.22 with the Cowgirls' squad back in

eighth place with a 3:44.89.

Probably the biggest surprise of the meet was the Hanna Smedstad's 5000 meter win in 17:06.85. The Cowgirl frosh's time was a good one considering the high Texas temperatures that day. The Sooners' Katherine Webster eked out a third place with a 152' 8" heave in the javelin to finish out the scoring.

#### Men

The men's divison witnessed an impressive fifth place performance by the Sooners, as the Cowboys likewise had

some brights moments in finishing 11th overall.

The 1600 meter relay duel between Oklahoma and Baylor was about all it could have been, with the Sooners' Edward Clarke, Danny McFarlane, Ryan Kite, and Roxbert Martin exploding around the sun-drenched oval in 3:01.31, just ahead of the Bears' 3:02.23. They will undoubtedly meet again at Bloomington for the final noholds barred throw down match of the year.

Martin blazed another sub-45 400 in 44.89 in leading his teammates to a 1-3-6 finish in the one-lapper effectively stamping the Sooners as the most dominating force of quarter-milers in NCAA history. McFarlane's 45.65 and Kite's 45.96, coupled with Clarke's 50.53 second place in the intermediate hurdles were extroadinary performances to say the least. The Sooners' Omar Brown (51.39), and Kevin James (51.49) finished out the 2-3-4

Indoor NCAA 3000 champ Adam Goucher of Colorado and the Cowboys' Jon Wild battled it out in both the 1500 and 5000 with tactical paces mandated by 86-degree temperatures. Wild outkicked Goucher coming off the curve in the 1500, his 3:46.72 good for a 1.67-second win. Goucher came back in the 5000 and avenged his loss with a victory over Wild (14:31.49) who had earlier provisionally qualified with a 13:53.33. The Sooners' Craig Kirkwood also ran well with a seventh place 14:41.15.

Christopher Kebenei and Rene Carlsen led the Cowboys to a strong showing in the 10000 with Kebenei winning in 29:51.31 followed by Carlsen's 29:57.08, further indicating a strong and progressive improvement by the Cowboys' distance corps this season. They are almost as strong in the longer events as the Sooners' are in the sprints. Chuck Sloan continued the distance onslought for the Cowboys with a fourth place 9:07.04 steeplechase.

Finishing out the scoring for the Sooners was the 400 meter relay team in 40.06 (5th), triple jumper Jerome Douglas' third place (53' 3 3/4"), and Oneil Hyman's (21.68), and Benjamin Chapman's (23.91) sixth and sev-

enth places in the 200.

The Arkansas Razorbacks' Phillip Price has made a name for himself in the 1500 this season with a third fastest national time of 3:41, and did nothing to dispel that notion with some great performances in the SEC conference meet at Auburn, Alabama. He ran an easy 3:44.91 in the metric mile to grab third place honors for the Hogs, in addition to his sixth place 14:29.29 in the 5000. Look for the Catoosa junior to score well at Bloomington. WAC Championships

The Tulsa Golden Hurricane will be competing in the WAC championships during the weekend of May 21-25 in San Diego, California. Results will be available in the next issue at the end of the summer. We'll also recap the season finale's for the other state schools as well, with regards to the NCAA and NAIA championships.

#### Track's Future

In closing, this outdoor season, as well as the exciting indoor season, provided a glimpse to a bright future for many of the state's colleges and universities as they enhance their programs with great recruiting and quality facilities. The notion that track and field is dying on the vine at the grassroots level, is one that many journalists like to perpetrate, but this journalist would rather dispel that rumor than feed it. There are many distractions in the world today, which makes it increasingly harder for T &

F to compete against, but the overall numbers are still increasing at the grade and middle school level. As long as responsible journalists would portray this sport in a positive light, rather than dragging it down with meaningless stories involving alleged drug/steroid use by a few of T & F's current or past stars, then the younger generation could look upon this sport as a true individualist's paradise, a place where one can be a separate entity as well as a team player.
