



Bulldogs, Irish and Trojans Lead Mid-Season Rankings

At a little over the halfway point in the 1996 cross country season, only three major teams still remain undefeated. Defending champion Edmond Memorial has dominated all opposition--regardless of class--leading the 5A boys division while defending champs Jenks (5A) and McGuinness (4A) are the only unscathed girls teams--obviously not having lined up against each other yet and probably not likely to do so this year.

However, both the Marlow and Velma-Alma girls are competing against much tougher competition in the 3A and below classes--which usually lump all the smaller schools together--taking turns beating each other up along with Plainview. The Irish have been the most consistent performers this season but both the Outlaws and Comets would have beaten last year's top team at the OBU meet in Shawnee on the 24th. In their only really close encounter at Western Heights--same course, different races--the Irish would have edged the Trojans 27-29 in a dual meet format but Jenks coach Martha O'Rourke's runners had a two-second advantage in average team time. The Trojan ladies have a good grip on the top spot in 5A but Sapulpa gets stronger every week while the Irish are virtually alone at the top of 4A. Marlow will not have a problem dominating 3A with the likely move of Plainview to 2A if the anticipated Class A develops for girls. Velma-Alma will continue to crush A competition but Laveme will hope to put up some resistance.

Last year McGuinness, Velma-Alma, Marlow and Plainview all showed up at the Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Fayetteville, Ark., along with some pretty hot regional teams for a bragging-rights showdown. Coach Dave Morton's Irish won the slugfest by a mere 10 points over Jerry Loveall's Comets but this year's contest could be even tighter, if they all show again.

In the boys divisions, Edmond Memorial has been untouchable. Period. The Bulldogs finished third at the Chile Pepper last year and upset seven-time defending champion Jenks for the state title. So far, no team has come close to beating coach Dave Sammons runners this year. The best of the rest is pretty wide open with Jenks, McGuinness, the top dog in 4A, Ponca City and Mustang (5A) all having a claim to the top contender spot. Elk City is enjoying their new home in 3A with coach Mark Heard's runners leading the pack. Tahequah Sequoyah, defending 2A champs but

On Track

The cross country season is half over, or, I suppose--if you look at it differently--there is still half to go...anyway...

With the season in full swing there has been a lot of action but I'm not getting the results I need to do justice to the rankings. I know I sound like a broken record sometimes but I just can't understand why meets happen and I have to beg for decent results. I'm especially lacking on results from the eastern half of the state and the far northwest. I'm also frustrated by getting only 10 places when there are 75 to 100 runners. In cross country, I have the space and will use up to 30 or 35 places if I get them.

I would really like to see the new Class A formed this year. This is a great opportunity to expose more of our young athletes to the experience of competing at a higher level. I know for a fact that the state-meet experience is one that stays with you for a lifetime and can be a very positive influence on a young person's life. And this is what it boils down to in the long run--giving our young athletes an experience they can use to grow into healthy adults.

In order for Class A to form it takes at least 12 full teams (five runners minimum) with their regional entry forms in by October 11th. The new class can be for both boys and girls or either one alone. It looks like to me the girls will make it but, though the boys are closer now, they still need a few teams. In order to encourage this I have added a Class A ranking in this issue which reflects the information I have right now.

Speaking of rankings...Individual rankings are getting tougher to do. In some classes it's hard to find enough and in others there are well over 20 that deserve mention. I'm getting a few calls and letters regarding spelling and missed individuals--I really appreciate the input, don't be scared to call and let me know what you think.

The O.S.S.A.A. Cross Country Advisory Board voted last year to work out a way to charge admission to the regional and state meets. This might seem to be a bit tough to manage but I hope everyone makes the effort to make it work. Cross country is about the only sport I can think of that traditionally hasn't charged admission and it has hurt the sport from an administrative standpoint. When we have to depend on funds raised from other sports, we are at the back of the line when it comes to getting our financial needs met.

If you didn't renew your subscription, you are either reading this over someone else's shoulder or you managed to get the library's copy...the first issue was mailed to everyone, but about 200 people--including a bunch of coaches that need to renew their OTCA memberships--are in the dark this week. Help me spread the gospel, if you like *Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS*, pass the word, covert a fan to a subscriber, give a runner a gift.

There will be a little more time between this issue and the next due to the slightly extended schedule this year (state meet is Nov. 2 instead of last weekend in Oct.). Look for it October 18th with Regional Assignments and a pre-regional review.

relatively invisible so far this year, top 2A while last year's 2A runnerup, Hydro, drops to A to duke it out with Velma-Alma.

In the individual races Mustang's Corrie Hussar, defending 5A champ, continues to go undefeated but has not come up against Broken Arrow's undefeated Karla Hopkins (transfer from Bartlesville). Marlow's Leah McCauley, Velma-Alma's Rae Ann McCurry--2A defender--and McGuinness' Ashley Boothe--two-time 4A defender--and Plainview's Becky Harvey all look strong as well though none are undefeated.

In the boys races Edmond Memorial's two-time champ Mark Thompson is still undefeated, without a really close race yet, but will have his hands full with Charles Page's (Sand Springs) Michael Cliff who has blown away the competition in the northeast and has both 1600 meter and 3200 meter track wins over Thompson from last year. Other top boys include McGuinness sophomore Kevin Connolly in 4A, Marlow's Kevin Minson in 3A, Chandler's Bobby Holmes in 2A and Velma-Alma's 2A champ Mylo Miller in A--if it makes it as a class at state.




CROSS COUNTRY RESULTS
