

1996 Cross Country State Meet

TULSA--The weather was perfect for running on Saturday, November 2nd, as the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association's 1996 Cross Country State Championships got under way on the campus of Oral Roberts University at 11:00 a.m. sharp. Five classes were contested and, with close to perfect timing, the races came off right on schedule.

There were no big surprises in any of the team races, with nine of the ten top-ranked teams claiming the championship trophy. Only in 2A girls did number-one Plainview stumble as number-two Lexington put three runners in the top ten to claim the trophy.

In the individual races it was basically more of the same except for the collapse of unbeaten defending 5A champion Corrie Hussar in the last 50 meters. Hussar apparently became seriously dehydrated and was unable to finish the race, though she was leading with close to a record setting pace when she collapsed.

Only three defending champions were able to repeat, three-time winners Ashley Boothe of McGuinness in 4A and Mark Thompson of Edmond Memorial in 5A, both seniors, and Velma-Alma sophomore Rae Ann McCurry in A, winner of 2A last year. Thompson became the first boy to win three titles and Boothe only the fourth girl, counting four-time winner Natalie Gray of Cascia Hall.

Westmoore sohpomore Lindsey Hughes won the 5A race with the fastest time of the day of 12:15 followed by 3A's Leah McCauley, Marlow junior, at 12:17 and Broken Arrow sophomore, Karla Hopkins, at 12:18.

Thompson had the fastest boys time at 15:29 in winning the 5A race followed by Charles Page senior Michael Cliff at 15:39 in second and 4A winner, Kevin Connolly, McGuinness sophomore, at 16:03.

McGuinness was the only school to win double titles, taking both 4A titles for the second year in a row. No school has ever won three double titles (the "triple double") in a row, but watch out next year, as coach Dave Morton's Irish return the core of both teams and look to be even better.

Edmond Memorial and Jenks are now tied with nine boys titles each, the most in what might be called the "modern era" since 1964--Tulsa Central had 19 titles since 1937 and only shared the


On Track

This is an invitation to all the road racers out there that would benefit from the experience of running fast on a track, and besides, it is really a lot of fun.

George Hall of Tulsa, who produced a book of best performances in Oklahoma age-group track & field last year, is in the process of doing the same for Oklahoma high school track & field and hopes to have it done by the start of track season this year. It will include "official" state records as well as state meet records and is a project that is long overdue for Oklahoma high school athletics. This will be the last issue until the end of February when we will wrap up the indoor track season and begin our preview of the upcoming outdoor season. championships with other Tulsa schools Rogers and Edison up to 1964. The Trojans took seven n a row before the Bulldogs ended the streak last year and Edmond Memorial had a streak of five between 1979 and '83 before Jenks put a stop to

Girls races have only been contested since 1975 (thank you Title IX) and McGuinness is now tied with Edmond Memorial with eight spiece. The Irish have a streak of five in a row going and will be looking to tie Union's six next year. Jenks has seven titles and Marlow five to ound out the top tive girls teams of the last wenty years.

Back to the present and a round-up by class.

Class A Girls

This is the newest class and was the first up at 11:00 a.m. 2A power and '95 winner Velma-Alma dropped to here and was the dominant force all season. Coach Jerry Loveall's Comets put three in the top ten behind individual winner McCurry to outscore runnerup Canton, 37-105, with Hydro in third at 115--just as they had been ranked going into the championships. All five of the top five were from the West Regional with Boise City and Laverne rounding it out.

Sophomore McCurry won easily over teammate, sophomore Amber Thacker, with

Canton junior, Cassie Gray in third. Hydro freshnan Nikki Wright was fourth ahead of Laverne sophomore Kristen Barby in fifth.

Class A Boys

With no defending or former champ back here his was wide open race and Hydro capped an

outstanding season with a 21-point win over runnerup Riverside, with Velma-Alma in third, 15 points oack. Coach Alan Hibler put hree runners in the top ten, aking the title they were favored to win last year, while Riverside and Velma-Alma 1ad two each. The Bobcats etum all their team again and will certainly be looking or another championship ext year.

McCurry

There was no clear favorite n this race with 2A champ Mylo Miller, Velma-Alma sophomore, running injured und Hydro teammates Walt Jinn and Herbie Pebeashy sharing the top ranking hrough the season along Pebeashy with East Regional champ lason McDonald, Foyil senior.



Pebeashy set the pace from the start with defender Miller gamely hanging on through the first mile before fading to 18th. Pebeashy stretched his lead, winning by 47 seconds over Heritage Hall senior. Sean Strickland who edged River-

side's Roland Nez for second followed by two more in less than a second, McDonald in fourth and Ginn in

Class 2A Girls

A tight race was predicted here between number-two ranked Lexington and number-one Plainview, but when the dust had settled, Coach C. Art Wheeler's Bulldogs had simply blown the Indians away by 36 points, putting three runners in the top ten en route to their second state championship in three years. Chisholm was 18 points back in third, nine ahead of Warner. No other team claimed more than one All-Stater.

Individually, top-ranked

Tasha Lance, Victory Christian junior, led all the way, winning by a comfortable 12 seconds over Chisholm freshman, Court-

> ney Metscher, with a time of 12:21.



Dickson was the pre-meet favorite, as they were last year in 2A, but this year they came through with the numbers necessary and walked away with the title by 37 points over runnerup Elgin, who was just ahead of Chisholm by another five points. Coach Ron Love's Comets benefitted from the late-season return of former champion, David Lampkin, who had spent most of the season at Del City before moving back to the Dickson

(Ardmore) late in the season. Lampkin, a junior, stayed with number-one ranked Chandler senior Bobby Holmes, but Holmes was on a mission and controlled the pace, eventually winning by five seconds with Prague

junior Daniel Stone in third. Class 3A Girls

The Marlow Outlaws capped a great season, winning their fifth title in the last nine years, with no finish worse than second, outscoring runnerup Elk City by a whopping 58 points with Little Axe in third, three more points back. Coach Jimmy Brackeen's team McCauley



district

came from a slow start to being a contender for the top team in the Power Ranking--story elsewhere in this issue--and claimed four spots in the top ten, and will have everyone back next year.

Marlow's number-one ranked junior, Leah McCauley, didn't take the lead until after the first mile but ended up winning comfortably over

Cascia Hall senior Katie McGraw, with Elk City sophomore amy Kilhoffer a distant third.

Class 3A Boys

Top-ranked Elk City dropped from 4A last year into 3A this year where they butted heads with second-ranked Marlow all season. Coach Mark Heard's Elks handed him his first state championship with a narrow 35-47 win over the Outlaws while defending champion Little Axe faded to a distant third. Elk City and Marlow claimed the lion's share of the top ten with the Elks claiming four spots and the Oultaws three.

In the day's most exciting finish, Marlow junior Kevin Minson Minson, out-leaned Bristow

junior, Albert Kelley, by .54 of a second at the line. The pair had duelled for the entire 3.1 miles and sprinted neck and neck for the last 200 meters with the lead changing every other step. Minson got the last step and the title with Elk City senior John Shirley in third, 24 seconds back.



McGuinness continued the longest current winning streak in cross country, taking their fifth straight title and eighth overall, though they

proved they weren't invincible after a mid-season tie with Weatherford. Dave Morton's Irish came through in the clutch, with three in the top ten to outscore the runnerup Lady Eagles, 42-79. Things may get more interesting in 4A next year as McGuinness loses three-time champ Boothe while Ashley Weatherford returns their entire squad--it would have cut the difference to less than 15 points this year.

Boothe left no doubt that she intended to make it three in a row, building a big lead, then hanging on to win by nine seconds over Kelley sophomore Traci Kmetz, who came in three seconds ahead of Weatherford freshman,

Renilta Lettkeman. Guthrie senior Brandi Woodard claimed her fourth top-ten finish to end her high school cross country career.

Class 4A Boys

In the day's biggest runaway, top-ranked McGuinness didn't disappoint their huge contingent of chanting fans in attendance. Living up to their pre-meet rankings, the Irish stomped the

opposition, claiming the title by a whopping 91 points over arch-rival Guthrie, the only team to beat coach Morton's team at the state meet in the past five years. The Irish put six runners in the top eight, scoring only 23 points. The only other team in the last twenty years to do the same was the 1981 Edmond team that had six in the top nine and scored 18 points.

McGuinness claimed the top individual spot again, this time by sophomore Kevin Connolly, who literally ran away with the race, winning by more than a minute over Wester Heights sophomore Phillip Semien, who outsprinted Weatherford junior Matt Donley for second and McGuinness senior Matt Sexauer in fourth. Irish defending champ, senior Taylor Styron, finished seventh.

Class 5A Girls

Time to welcome a new name to the top of this class--Westmoore. The Jaguars of coach Laura Clay got off to a slow start but were at full speed by season's end, claiming the State Title by 58 points over runnerup Moore and ending up on top in the final Power Ranking. Early season leader and defending champ, Jenks, faded in the stretch, dropping to a dismal fifth after winning seven titles since 1985. Westmoore will be looking for more of the same next year, losing only their fifth runner out of the top five.

In the days most disappointing individual race, undefeated defending champion, Mustang senior Corrie Hussar, collapsed less than 50 meters from the finish line with a huge lead, from appar-



ent dehydration, and was unable to finish. Westmoore sophomore Lindsey Hughes drove past Broken Arrow sophomore Karla Hopkins to take the win, while teammate Allison Franklin came in third.

Class 5A Boys

The final race of the day was well worth the wait, and all it was supposed to be. With the team title virtually assured, Edmond Memorial concentrated on having one of the best state meet performances, ever, while the Bulldogs' two-time defending champion, senior Mark Thompson, duelled with arch-rival Michael Cliff of Charles Page in front of hundreds of screaming fans.



Coach Dave Sammons Bulldogs put three in the top ten and came within one second of having five runners under 17:00 for the 5k course. Their 16:28.8 team average time puts the at the top of the Power Ranking and is one of the best averages in memory. Mustang edged Jenks, 111-115, for the runnerup trophy and the next four teams came in with less than 15 points separating them.









1996 Power Ranking

The computer took a vacation this year from helping to figure the annual Power Ranking, but a little time and a lot of effort—with a little help from my friends—accomplished the same thing. All classes were combined into one race and it was scored just like a regular cross country meet, including dropping the places of individuals that did not run with a full team. Individual times were added together and averaged for the team average to give further comparison, providing some interesting contrasts to scoring by points only. (Note: hundredths of a second were not used for time averages but were used to separate places where ties existed to the second.)

In the absence of a true Meet of Champions, this is the most valid comparison between classes, since all runners ran the same course under the same conditions.

Edmond Memorial came up with what may have been the best performance ever in the boys Power Ranking, repeating as the number one team again this year. Coach Dave Sammons' Bulldogs had a phenomenal average time of 16:28.8 which compared to Little Axe's '94 average on basically the same course of 16:55.2. 4A McGuinness was a distant second with an average of 17:04.6 but the Irish were the only non-5A team in the top ten this year after three made it last year.

As usual, there were several surprises in placings after the classes were combined into one race. Jenks moved ahead of Mustang into third in spite of a slower average time and Midwest City jumped from sixth in 5A to fifth in the Power Ranking.

On the girls side it was no surprise that Westmoore took the top spot with a comfortable margin over Marlow and McGuinness, who were only three seconds apart. Coach Laura Clay's Jaguars averaged 12:36.4 to unseat two-time top team McGuinness which put them less than three seconds down on the Irish 12:33.8 on the same course in 1994—the best average on record for the Oral Roberts course. The girls were incredibly even between classes with all five class winners in the top six of the Power Ranking.



In the table above, "WS" is wind speed expressed in meters per second, and negative values indicate a head wind for straight-lane sprints. The "A-G Equiv." value is the age-graded equivalent, and represents the theoretical performance the athlete would have had during his/her open competition years (age 19-34). The "A-G %" is the age-graded percentage of maximum theoretical performance, assuming the age group world record to be the maximum possible performance. As a general rule, performance values of +80% can be considered to be a "national class" performance, and performance values of +90% can be considered to be "world class." Bill Carter, Dale Lance, Suzanne Williams, and Ed Hooker all had performances of +80%, and Dale Lance had 1 +90% performance! Betty Jarvis and Suzanne Williams were both dominant in their events. Betty captured four gold medals by winning all of the throwing events, and Suzanne returned with one gold, two silver, and one bronze in running events ranging from the 100 to the 1500!

Dale Lance and Betty Jarvis received special recognition from the USATF during a ceremony held at the annual athletes meeting. Dale was recognized as the multi-event athlete of the year, and Betty was recognized as the thrower of the year. All things considered, Oklahoma athletes made quite an impression at the national meet.

Oklahoma-Arkansas-Kansas All-Star CC Competition


Fayetteville, Arkansas 11/16/96

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. -- Two Oklahoma All-Star teams travelled here November 16th to race on the University of Arkansas' new cross country course against the top runners from Arkansas and Kansas. The boys put four runners in the top five, including a one-two finish by seniors Mark Thompson of Edmond Memorial and Michael Cliff of Charles Page. It wasn't quite enough to pull off a team victory though, as Kansas took ten of the next thirteen spots (10 scorers) to score 121 points to Oklahoma's 144, with Arkansas a distant third at 236.

The girls--missing many of the state top guns-didn't fare as well, managing to put only one runner in the top 15 as Kelley's Tracy Kmetz finished 14th. Oklahoma finished a disappointing third, with 223 points behind winner Kansas at 65, and runnerup Arkansas at 195. Mustang senior, Corrie Hussar, who collapsed at the state meet two weeks earlier, started the race but dropped out after less than 800 meters.

The Oklahoma All-Star teams were sponsored by the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association and were coached by Dave Morton of McGuinness, and Little Axe's Barry Klein. This was the third year for the meet and it has been in Arkansas every year, though there are plans being discussed to hold it in Oklahoma next year.
