

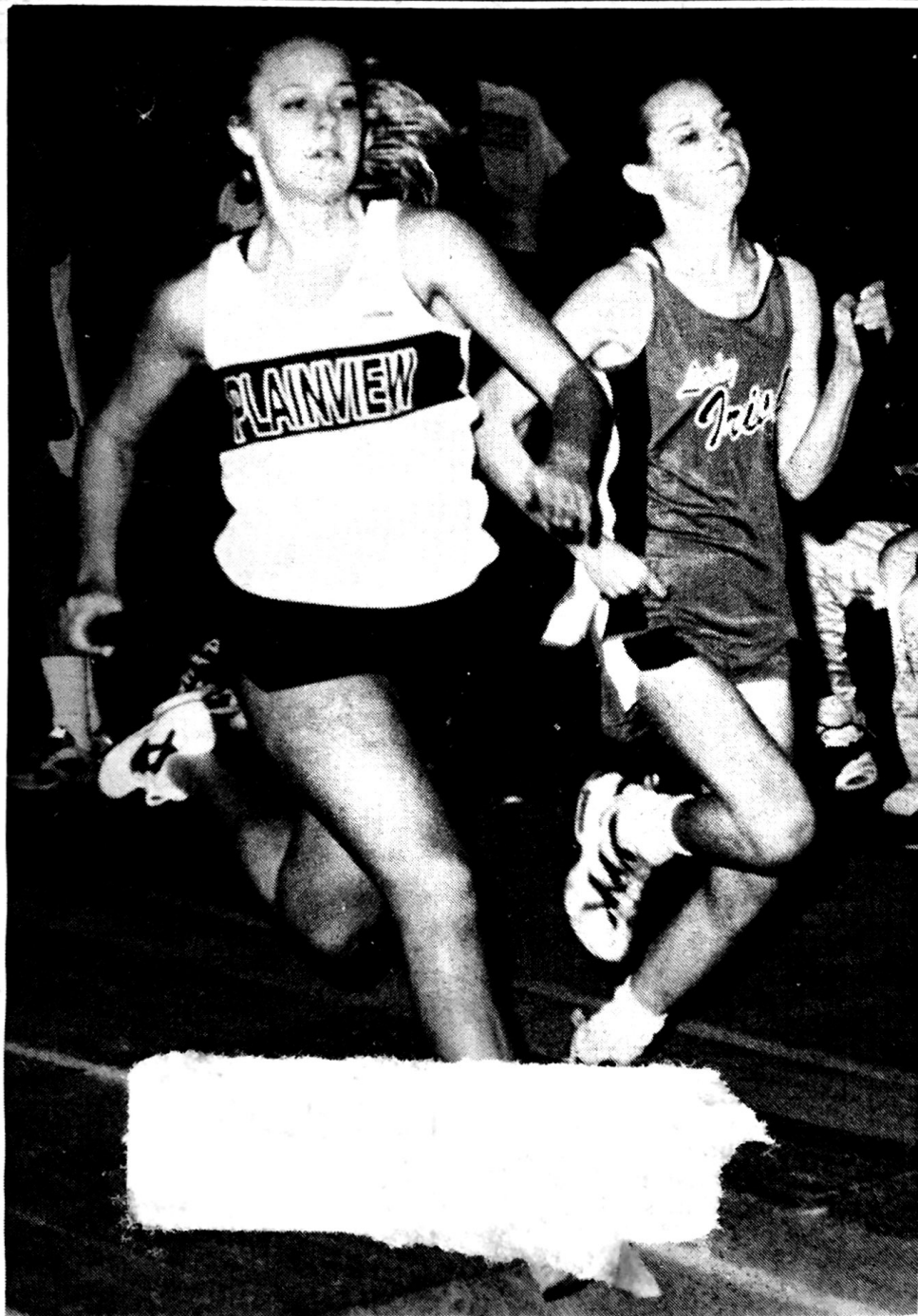

## 1997 High School Track Preview 5A-4A-3A

The 1997 Oklahoma high school track season opens March 1st with a handful of meets around the state, but the season doesn't really get into gear until spring breaks are over at the end of the month. This year the calendar has stretched the season out a bit, with the state meets not being held until May 9-10 (3A at Choctaw) and 16-17 (4A-5A at UCO), which is probably going to make for an even slower start.

Returns on the annual TEAM REPORT--which is mailed to all schools in the state--were a little better this year, but information is still pretty scarce, so team rankings in this issue are based solely on performance during the indoor season (coaches: if you haven't sent yours yet, do so now!). Future rankings will reflect teams' current ability based on factoring the season leader lists for each class. Individually, we've tried to identify as many returning champions as possible and apologize in advance to those that were missed--we didn't get your coach's TEAM REPORT!

This preview covers classes 5A-4A-3A, 2A-A-B will be covered in the next issue which will be dated March 14th.

### 5A Boys

Two-time defending champion Edmond North was off to a slow start again this year in the indoor championships, and is again going to suffer from graduation losses, losing two state champs. I said the same thing about them last year, and they still came back to win the title! Norman took the indoor over Moore, followed by Santa Fe and Edmond Memorial. This should probably be a tighter race this year and I expect the top teams to be within 25 points of each other when it's all over.

Charles Page's Michael Cliff returns to defend his double 1600/3200 titles and will face a strong challenge from Edmond Memorial's Mark Thompson, three-time cross country champion, but unable to best Cliff last year on the track. Thompson was impressive in the indoor season, taking both 1600/3000 titles. Edmond North will be anchored by 200 meter champ, Terrence Wakefield while cross-town rival Santa Fe returns 400 meter champ Jeremy Boudreau. Boudreau will be challenged again by Muskogee's Rodney Wilson, winner of the 400 indoors while Boudreau took the 200. Jenks'

# On Track

The 1997 track season will get under this weekend with a slightly abbreviated schedule due to a calendar adjustment which makes the season about a week longer and a traditional opening weekend meet not being held due to poor track conditions. This is going to make it difficult to rank teams and produce the season leaders lists for a couple weeks, but bear with us and we'll be steaming ahead at full speed before you realize it.

As the 1997 season unfolds I'm still finding myself concerned about the dominance of foreign athletes in our colleges and universities. I read a recent article in *Outside Magazine* decrying the demise of track in the United States and I can't help but think that it is at least partly due to the fact that our own athletes are being passed over for scholarships in favor of often older and more experienced foreign athletes.

High school coaches may not think this is a problem at their level, but if high school athletes don't find an opportunity to compete in college, they will begin to select other sports that may give them a better chance. I don't object to allowing foreign athletes the opportunity to come to the United States and compete but I do think we are shooting ourselves in the foot when we eliminate opportunities for our own kids. You need look no further than our own state's two major universities to find the dominance of foreign athletes a reality. In spite of recent efforts by the University of Oklahoma in women's track and cross country, OSU's and OU's rosters are loaded with foreigners while Oklahoma high school graduates have to look elsewhere for scholarships.

I think it's worth a call or letter to your state senator or representative to make them aware of the situation before it gets totally out of hand.

Season leader lists will start in the next issue and should be up to full speed by the end of March. Coaches need to remember to send complete results by FAX no later than the Monday following your meet. We have contacted all the daily and weekly newspapers in the state in an attempt to get them to use the team and individual rankings that will appear in each issue once the season gets under way. We have offered to FAX the rankings at no charge as long as the newspaper has a subscription. Contact your local paper and encourage them to take us up on this offer if you want to see these rankings in your home town paper.

I attended the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association Mid-Winter Clinic in Norman again this year and was again impressed with the attendance and enthusiasm shown by our state's high school coaches. A report on that event is elsewhere in this issue.

I got a note from Sally Heath of Holdenville, who was wondering if any other school has managed to win a state track championship with only four girls scoring all the points, as the Wolverines did in 1995. Be glad to hear from anybody that knows.

I'm going to put out my plea for a journalism intern or volunteer early this year because I know how busy it's going to get in a few short weeks. If there is anyone in the Oklahoma City area that would be interested in learning a little bit about publishing and gaining some valuable experience, please give me a call at 843-9992. I do it all here, from typing results, taking photos, producing the layouts, pasting up, managing circulation and making the coffee. Not that it isn't more fun that I can stand, but I would welcome a little help. Call me.

Barrett Hall and Moore's Jimmy Martinez return from the two-three positions in the 800 and will slug it out for the two lap title.

### 5A Girls

Jenks was impressive in winning the indoor title, almost doubling runnerup Edmond Memorial in points. B.T. Washington drops to 4A but is replaced by 4A state runnerup Northwest Classen, an instant contender with some incredible sprint strengths. Norman took the title last year when the Trojans were disqualified in the 1600 relay but the Tigers graduated a lot of points. Cross country champ, Westmoore, didn't fare well last year in track, but the Jaguars could score some points if they can keep their distance aces running.

Northwest's Aisha Gordon was a double winner in 4A in the 200/400 sprints and took third in the 100 while teammate Raven Bruner took the 300 hurdles. Norman's Hilary Reser will return to defend her 1600 title and will be a contender in the 800 if she can get back to full speed after missing the cross country season due to a stress fracture. Union 1995 1600/3200 double winner Megan Riddle returns for her senior season and Jenks' Candy Siems will defend her discus title. It looks like Mustang senior Corrie Hussar, undefeated in cross country before collapsing in the state meet, will miss the track season while recovering from a serious automobile accident.

### 4A Boys

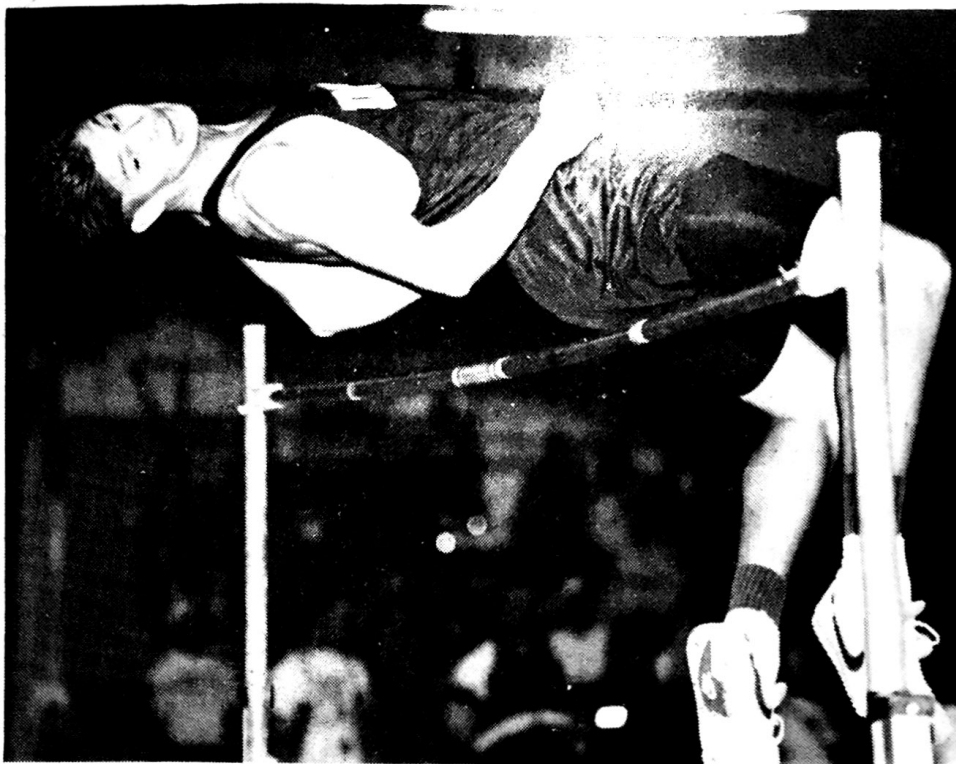
Altus will be gunning for their third straight title and though they lost some points to graduation, the Bulldogs look like they can accomplish the threepeat. Duncan was impressive in winning the indoor with 134 points but a lot of teams weren't there, including Altus and Carl Albert. Two perennial powers, Okmulgee and McGuinness drop to 3A. Tulsa Central has some returning points and should be considered a darkhorse this year.

Altus senior Chauncey Raiden will be gunning for his third straight 400 meter title and Tulsa Central's Bertrain Bailey will defend in the 800. Altus graduated double distance winner Brian Whitlock and with the McGuinness distance crowd in 3A now, the long races are up for grabs. There very well may be other champs back in this class but a lack of information makes it hard to know.

### 4A Girls

With state runnerup Northwest Classen moving up to 5A and third place McGuinness down to 3A you would think defending champion Northeast would be feeling pretty good--that is, until you remember that 5A powerhouse B.T. Washington is in 4A this year. The Hornets bring with them a host of sprinters, led by senior Kim Schumpert, a four gold winner in '95 but eliminated by grades in '96, and hurdler Andrea Bell, double 100/300 winner last year.

Hale won the indoor and has some strength in the distances and a bit of balance. Indoor runnerup Duncan scored 97 points and will be a contender for a top spot as well. Guthrie will be a one-girl show as triple 800/1600/3200

winner, senior Brandi Woodard, leads the graduation-decimated Bluejays.

Altus returns champion Shavanta Sneed, who set a state meet record in winning the 100 meter dash last year, and '95 400 meter champ, Chakei West, runnerup last year.

### 3A Boys

This will be a really tough class this year with defending champion Broken Bow duking it out with Elk City, Weatherford and 3A newcomers from 4A, Okmulgee and McGuinness. The Elks were truly impressive in winning the indoor over the Eagles and apparently have the team balance that is necessary to win at state. The Savages didn't show at the indoor this year and, in fact, we may not see any of them until they start showing up at Oklahoma meets in mid-season, when they have a tendency to surprise a few people.

Multiple distance champion, Bobby Holmes, of Chandler, drops to 2A, but the distances will be hotly contested with both 4A (McGuinness) and 3A (Elk City) state cross country team champions in 3A for track.

There are probably more champions back here but, again, a lack of information has made it hard to know.

### 3A Girls

Two-time defending champion Grove is a bit of a question mark this year, wounded a bit by graduation and move-outs. Perennial power Plainview has dropped to 2A but is replaced by McGuinness, who won the title the last time they were in 3A in 1990. Weatherford was third in the state indoor and runnerup to the Irish in 4A cross country. Millwood has always had strong sprinters and puts together an incredibly

strong group of relays. Marlow was impressive in winning the 3A cross country title and will be a definite darkhorse in this race.

Millwood's Shlaunda Hayes returns to defend her 100 meter title along with Grove's Abby Robertson in the 300 meter hurdles. McGuinness senior Ashley Boothe, a three-time winner in cross country, took 4A 1600 meter titles in '94 and '95 and the 3200 in '94. Marlow senior Bambi Carson won the discus in '95 with a meet record and Grove junior, Carly McCulley, won the 1600 in '95 as well.

Edmond Memorial's three-time state champion, Mark Thompson, finished second in the Midwest Regional of the Ft. Locker Cross Country National Championships in Kenosha, Wisc., and then went on to take second in the finals held in San Diego, Dec. 14th. Thompson covered the 5k course in 15:54 in Kenosha and 15:47 in San Diego.

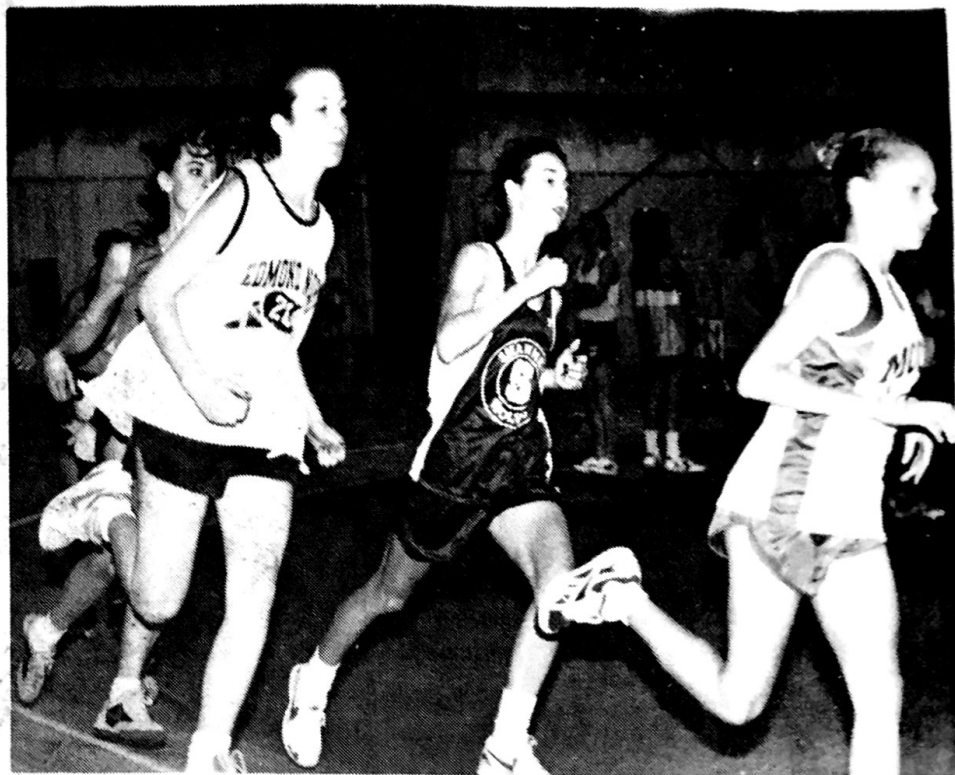

## OTCA Winter Track Clinic

**NORMAN--**The Oklahoma Track Coaches Association held their annual Winter Track Clinic at the Ramada Inn in Norman, Jan. 31-Feb.1. Over 125 coaches attend the two days of meetings, clinics and lectures. President Amie Lampkin of Plainview conducted the business meeting and David Jackson of the O.S.S.A.A. conducted a rules clinic.

Results of the Cross Country Advisory Board meeting in November were reported with the following actions approved by the O.S.S.A.A. Board of Directors: splitting regionals into two classes per site and having different sites for each; increasing the number of teams qualifying for state from each regional to seven and the top 25 individuals (up from six and 20); allowing watches to be worn during cross country races.

The coaches voted to add another girls class and the 4 Lap Relay to the indoor meet next year. Speakers covered all areas of track and field and the coaches selected Laura Clay, Westmoore (girls) and Alan Hibler, Hydro (boys) as cross country coaches of the year for 1996 (story is this issue). The OTCA Hall of Fame inducted former Maud coach, George Lemons and a plaque in his honor will be housed permanently at the University of Central Oklahoma's field-house in Edmond.

Coaches for the Great Southwest Classic will be Jerry Loveall, Velma-Alma (girls) and Steve Patterson, formerly of Edmond North (boys).

It is unfortunate that not all meet directors submit results of the masters to the *National Masters News* for publication and eventual tabulation in the national rankings. The Tulsa Track Club sent results of all their meets to the *National Masters News*, and the Tulsa Spikes have to date sent some of their meet results and will hopefully send the rest prior to year's end. The Ponca City Meet personnel seem to be reluctant to compile any results, but Jim Dolezel obtained all the masters results he could get at the meet this year and sent these in. Jim also sent in results he was given from the Sooner State Games, but these contained numerous errors. Something called the Senior Games (not to be confused with the Senior Olympics) was held in Bartlesville this spring, but no one seems to be able to locate any meet results. I do not understand why accurate meet results can't be produced, published, and made available to everyone with an interest. Despite the problems I have noted above, the situation is currently better than it has been as most all meets are being reported.

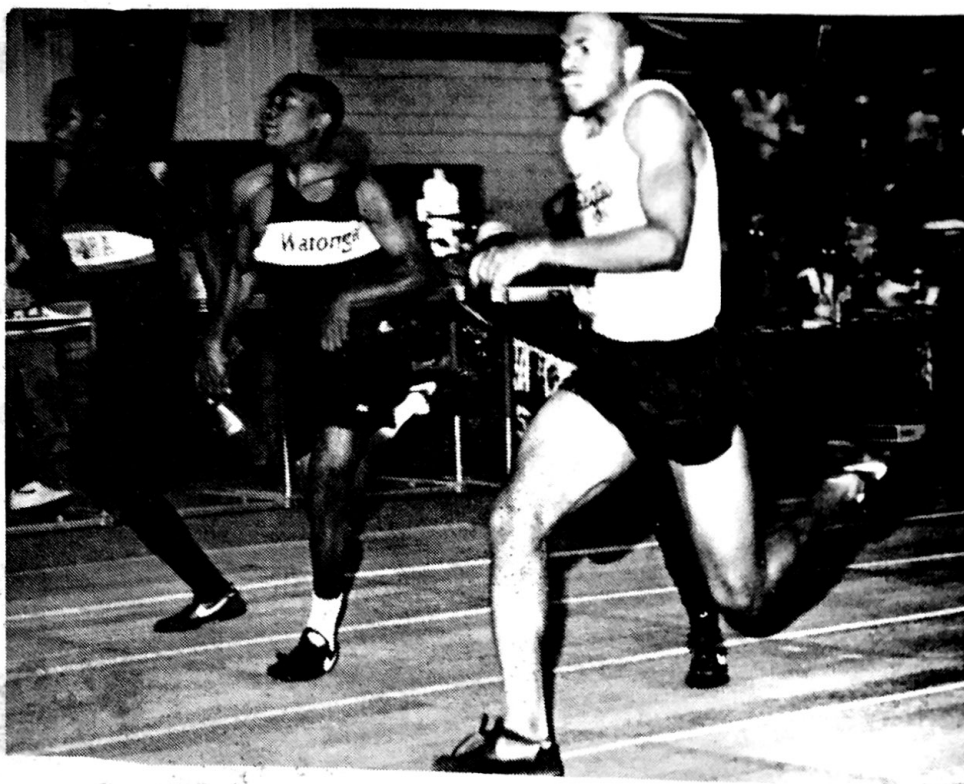
