

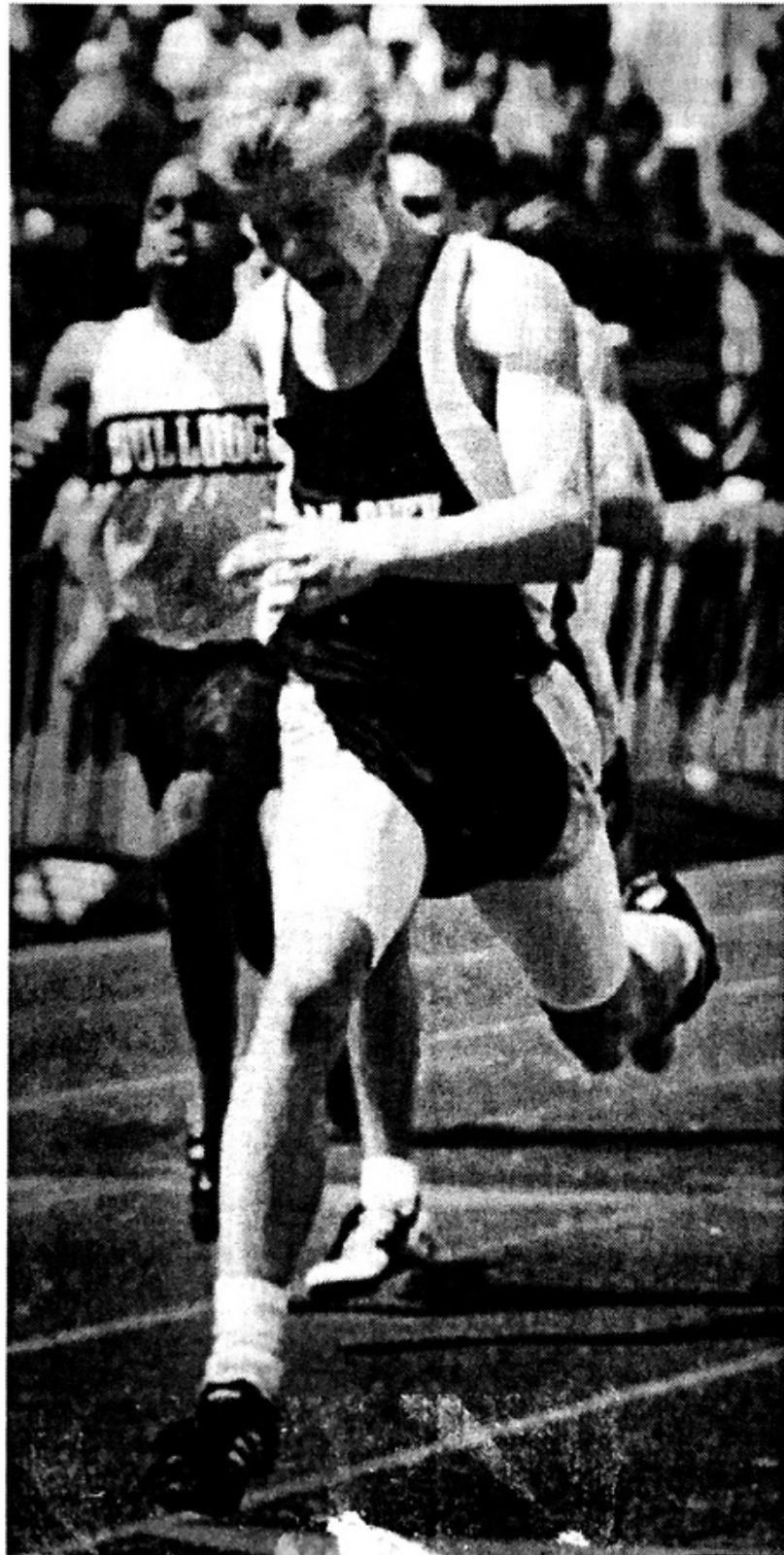

1998 State Track Meets

Class 3A Boys

For McGuinness to complete a first ever double-double, double-double, the burden fell on the track and field boys to come through.

After all, the girls were expected to win.

Never before has a single school swept boys and girls state cross-country and boys and girls track and field championships in the same school year.

McGuinness now has.

While its cross-country heritage stood coach Scott Stevenson's Irish in good stead, there were other contributing factors, too, such as seven points each in the long jump and pole vault and 20 in the 1,600 relay.

Senior Anthony Moses won the 800 (in 1:58.31) for the second straight year and ran leg on the champion 1,600 and 3,200 relay teams.

Junior Kevin Connolly repeated his sweep of the 1,600 and 3,200, setting a meet record 9:24.47 in the latter. He's a 2-time state cross-country king.

Brett Lowry was second to Connolly in the 3,200 and fourth in the 1,600.

It all added up to 104 points and a winning bulge of 29 over Elk City.

"The amazing thing is seeing so many kids who don't run cross-country step up, because track and field is 16 events," Stevenson said. "The kids just had a great day."

Elk City got the 20 points it expected from junior Charlie Atteberry, who repeated in the discus (171-8) and won the shot (56-10.5) as well.

Spiro's Brian Steele won the 100 like last year, but couldn't repeat in the 200. Aaron Howell of Star Spencer, who ran second to Steele in both '97 races, won the 200 in a super swift 21.20. The Accutrack wasn't working at the time, so no record consideration could be given.

Adding the recommended .24 between hand and electronic timing wouldn't have been enough for a record and, of course, only one watch caught the 21.20.

Josh Landreth of Elk City found the Accutrack on and humming for his 400 race and set a new meet mark of 47.56.

I printed an extra 400 copies of the last issue with an added 12 pages and distributed it at the small school state meets in Mustang and Edmond. The response was very gratifying, even though I had to sell it for \$4 to cover the costs. It's really tough to try to cover both meets and though I tried to spend time at both I didn't get to stay at Mustang long enough. With a daughter still at McGuinness, my loyalties still lie with the Irish, and they didn't disappoint any of their fans this year as they took home both titles—the first time ever that the same school has won both cross country and track titles in the same school year.

Head coaches are Ben Martin, Moore (West Boys); Terry Collins, Union (East Boys); David Gleason, Midwest City (West Girls); and Mike Adair, Sapulpa (East Girls). It is still not too late to nominate a senior if you have one interested in competing.

which is also the fastest time of the year in any class.

Another Landreth, Austin, kept the Elks' strangle hold on the 3A pole vault crown. At 13-0, he became Elk City's sixth vault winner in seven years.

Class 3A Girls

Another Abby Robertson or two on the Grove track team and the Lady Ridgerunners would have their fourth consecutive state championship.

But Abby's four gold medals — 400, both hurdles and 1,600 relay — weren't enough as McGuinness outlasted Grove, 96-82.

A year ago, Robertson's work was confined to the hurdles and the 800 and 1,600 relays. She bagged three golds and a silver (800 relay) then.

"I never ran the 400 dash until regional this year," Robertson said. "The coach came up to me the week of the regional and asked what I thought about running it and I said I will if I have to."

"I'd planned on beating my 300 hurdles record (state last year), but didn't think I could (with the added race),"

"I thought the fastest I'd run the 300 hurdles would be 47 seconds. I had no idea I could run 45 (45.85) after coming off the quarter because it was the very next event." But it was shy of her meet mark of 44.48.

Robertson finishes her prep days with 10 gold medals — four in 300 hurdles, three in 1,600 relay, two in 100 hurdles and one in the 400.

McGuinness freshman Amanda Jordan won the 1,600 and 3,200 in complete runaways, to go along with her cross-country title. She was second in the 800.

Jordan's distance times of 5:13.58 and 11:22.50 fell short of meet records, a disappointment in that during the regular season she set new all-time Oklahoma records in both—5:07.42 and 10:56.38. David Morton's Lady Irish previously won state titles in 1989 and 1990.

The Marlow girls broke their own meet 3,200 relay mark, set last year, with a clocking of 9:45.09. It was hardly unexpected since Leah McCauley, Melissa Hinds and Amber Staats were members of both teams, joined this time by Brandi McNair.

Mannford junior Kristin Rogers put herself in a position to become a four-time state champion in a single event by winning the high jump again. She has triumphed the past three years at 5-6, 5-4 and 5-6.

Rogers attempted a meet record 5-8.25 but nudged the bar off "with my hair" on the final try, all of them close to succeeding.

Class 2A Boys

Chelsea rested in fourth place when the wrap-up 1,600 relay left blocks. The Green Dragons had 41 points, Stroud 42, Watonga and Alva 48.

But Chelsea had Larry Crenshaw in anchor and he had already won the 100, 200 and anchored the winning 400 relay team.

The first three Dragons—Mike Hine,

Adam Field and A. J. Owen—put Crenshaw close enough that he could beat Wynnewood to the tape 3:26.87 to 3:27.60.

That pushed the Chelsea total to 61. Wynnewood, ending with 43 points, couldn't win the title for itself, but it did win for Chelsea by nipping Watonga for third place by 13-hundredths of a second.

Watonga, had it finished second in the relay, would have had 62 points. Alva also had to run second in the relay to win the team title and placed sixth. Stroud had no entry in the race.

Crenshaw clocked 21.01 to win the 200, but again it was a non-Accutrack, one watch race. The senior won both sprints last year.

Jason DiMauro of Victory Christian shattered meet marks in both distance races, logging 4:24.68 in the 1,600 and 9:37.44 in the 3,200.

Far from a surprise, Stroud senior Kyle Bookout captured the discus and shot once again. But, considering his condition a week earlier, it was somewhat remarkable.

Stroud coach Bob Wood said Bookout injured his ankle the week of the regional at the Konawa meet. "All he could do at regional was to 'switch' the discus (no follow through), just to qualify."

Qualify Kyle did, with a 152-0. And, with a second place 51-8½ in the shot.

"He seemed okay in practice the few days before the state meet," Wood said. "We can only hope." Hope? Discus: 189-7. Shot: 54-11.

Late this season, Bookout improved his

own state discus record from 191-7 to 192-9.5 Dickson's 3,200 relay unit of David Lampkin, James Lampkin, Alex Ratliff and Gary Eubanks lowered that event's record to 8:08.66.

Never give up. Rod High didn't, the Wynnewood senior got his long awaited long jump gold. He placed third in 1995 (21-8.25), third in 1996 (23-0.75) and second in 1997 (23-2). With this year's winning 22-2.5, Rod Joins older brother Roshay (1996) as a state long jump champion.

Class 2A Girls

Same song, another verse.

After their "long" two-year title slump, the Plainview girls have won their second straight state track trophy and the ninth one in 11 years.

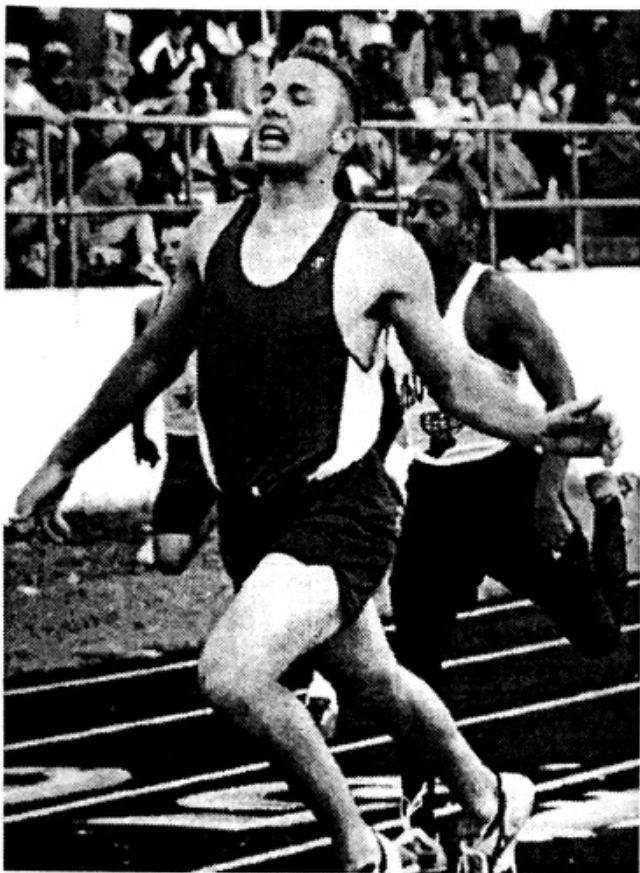
Just as in 1997, Plainview made Warner settle for second place, 80-63.

In a way, it hardly seemed fair, while Plainview did not win a single event, Warner won the 3,200, which used to be Plainview's property, and middle distance machine Miley Turnbull swept the 800 and 1,600.

Plainview, however, picked up points in 11 of the 16 events. Coach Jerry Naylor got seconds from Megan Merritt in the 100 hurdles, Jessica Easterling in the shot, Lindsey Vance in the discus and from his, 1,600 relay.

Warner's 3,200 relay unit of Stephanie Gleese, Karly Roberts, Morgan McAffrey and Turnbull wrote a new meet record of 9:50.77.

Turnbull now is a two-time champ in the

800 and 1,600, won the state cross-country title in 1995 and placed second last fall.

Amanda Wedel of Lexington scored a double in the 200 and 400 and Dortia Dotson of Wynnewood swept the weights.

Neither of Dobson's throw were ho-hummers. The senior's cast of the disc sailed 136-8, almost seven feet beyond the meet record, and her shot was a fine 41-9.

Class A Boys

Do you wonder if adding the top performing fourth-place regional finishers to the state meet field makes any difference?

Wonder no more.

Turpin coach John Winchester can tell you that it can make a huge difference — 17 points, in his case this season.

With those "bonus" 17 points, Turpin nipped Wyandotte, 90-88, for the Class A state championship.

In all, Turpin added eight fourth or fifth place regional finishers. Four of them scored state meet points: Jordan Massoni (8), second in discus; Warren Headrick (4), fourth in 200; Chad Headrick (4), fourth in high jump; Justin Roberts (1), sixth in high hurdles.

Wyandotte scored 202 regional points and qualified 15 individuals and all three relays. It added only a single fourth placer, who did not score.

Turpin had 160 regional points and qualified 10 individuals and its three relay teams. But the fourth placers bumped the Cardinal individual event total up to 18.

And how many other fourth-place additions scored state meet points in A Boys? Only Mangum's 400-meter relay team, which placed fourth.

Fortune smiled on Turpin in another area. In the 1,600 relay preliminaries, freshman anchor Chris Benson tripped while running about even with a Tonkawa runner, both of them well ahead of the pack. He fell to the track about 200 meters from the finish.

"He must have laid there five seconds, then got to his feet and started running again," Winchester said. "He finished third in the heat and sixth over-all."

"We took Benson to the emergency room and he had a partial shoulder separation a bruised hip and a concussion."

The next day in the finals, a "real sore" Benson moved to the second leg for the 1,600 relay finale with Turpin owning 70 team points, Wyandotte 72 and Velma-Alma 75.

Velma-Alma had no relay team, so which ever reached the finish line first, Wyandotte or Turpin, was the champion. It was: Turpin in first place with a season-best 3:26.54, Wyandotte in second place at 3:27.62.

Joining Benson on the winning relay unit were Cody Regier, the open 400 champion, Chad Headrick and Carlos Salazar, who Wyandotte well remembers from the 167-yard, three-touchdown barrage that he threw at the Bears in last fall's state football finals (Turpin 28, Wyandotte 14).

Wyandotte won two events, the 400 relay and the 300 hurdles (Scott Worley). Class A produced two double champions and two meet record performances.

Laverne's Joey Swallow, a husky junior weightman; fit both categories. He swept the shot (53-9) and discus (179-4) for the second time. As a freshman, he was second in the discus, fourth in the shot.

The 179-4 discus fling, super for any class, broke the 20-year-old meet record of Plainview's Joel Wyatt by more than six feet.

"It was a good wind day," Swallow said. "I just kind of sailed it out there. I didn't realize it had carried that far." The best ever shot effort so far by the football tackle and place kicker is 54-3.

Velma-Alma's Mylo Miller won the 3,200 in 10:08.90, the 1,600 in 4:35.43 and was second in the 800 in 1:58.99. He was state cross-country champ in 1995. He is now a three-time 3,200 winner.

That's a good 800 time, but not good

enough when you are pitted against a flier like Tyson Trimble of Commerce.

Trimble, a junior only a week and a half away from discarding his Commerce baseball uniform, clocked a meet record 1:55.06, which is also the fastest time in the state so far this season in any class. He won the event in 1:59.44 as a sophomore.

Another repeat winner is Josh Brown of Foyil in the high jump. But, at 6-2, he was five inches below his '97 winning height.

Class A Girls

It would have been a battle — Velma-Alma vs. Boise City — but it never came about because BC's defending A girls champions dropped down to Class B.

"There's no doubt that Boise City's dropping down a class helped us," said Velma-Alma coach Jerry Loveall.

"We only got 32 points out of the relays, but 64 out of the individuals." Those 96 Velma-Alma points were easily enough to out-distance runnerup Hollis (59).

"Every thing fell into place this year," Loveall said. "Every person who qualified (10), scored points."

Velma-Alma began taking charge by winning the 3,200 relay and got individual firsts from Rac Ann McCurry in the 800 and Tina Lamb in the 300 hurdles and a second from 100 hurdler Sara Darter.

McCurry won the 3,200 last year and the 800 in 1996 and was cross country champion in '96.

All but one of Hollis points were the result of winning two relays (400 and 800) and Toshiba Hayes' 200 gold and 100 silver. Jamie Harvick of Luther swept the high jump and long jump. She also won the long jump in 1996.

There were no other individual double winners. That was settled when Denise Depuy of Hooker upset Bonita Stevenson of Crescent in the shot, 39-2 to 38-11. Stevenson won both weights last year and repeated in the discus, but 10 feet shy of her 1997 record toss of 133-8.

Of course, a couple of absentees helped bring on a new set of Class A winners. Darla Bocoock went to Class B, where she won another state title and Teya Gill, the 100, 200 and 400 champ at Luther the past two seasons is now making Del City a tough customer in Class 5A.

Class B Boys

Try as he might, Logan Judd of Timberlake just could not lift his team past Boise City. The Wildcats from the panhandle prevailed over Timberlake, 100-92. Judd won both hurdles decisively (15.42 and 40.18), took the 200 in 23.42 and anchored the winning 1,600 relay team home in 3:28.81.

Since Boise City led Timberlake 84-72 going into the concluding relay, it needed just a fourth-place finish to clinch at least a title tie. It ran second to Timberlake with a 3:29.93, almost four seconds ahead of No.3 finisher Cherokee.

"I said (to his relay team) don't jump the gun just be careful," said first-year BC coach Steve Lancaster, coming to the Cats from Pond Creek-Hunter.

"We qualified 15, and 10 of them scored. The good thing is we have only two seniors." Last year, in Class A, Boise City scored 41 points and finished fourth. This time Boise City crowned three individual champions, juniors Doug Soell in the pole vault (13-0) and John Terrell in the shot (49-1) and freshman Natt Rosebery in the high jump (6-4).

Soell unseated 2-time state pole vault champion Alan Huddleston of Texhoma. Huddleston squeezed in as a regional fourth-placer after winning at 11-6 in 1996 and 12-6 in 1997. This year, he cleared 12-6 at both regional and state.

Hydro won the 1997 Class B title with its distance strength, but it took only 73 points then because tri-runners up Cherokee, Covington-Douglas and Medford managed only 54 points each.

Hydro's long-haulers were equally strong this year. In fact, they were the same people and they accounted for all 61 of the Bobcats' points.

Hydro opened by winning the 3,200 relay for the third time in four years. Individually, senior Walt Ginn won the 800, 1,600 and ran second in the 3,200, while junior Herbie Pebeashy took the 3,200 and was second in the 1,600. The other two Hydro points came on a fifth place in the 800.

Ginn finishes his prep career with 10 gold medals—three each in the 800, 1,600 and 3,200 relay and one in the 3,200.

Pebeashy, winner of the last two state

cross-country titles, has two 3,200 and two 3,200 relay golds to his credit.

Class B Girl

Minus three relay aces who each ran on three of Boise City's four champion baton units last season, Mike Jinkens' Lady Wildcats were runaway winners once again.

Last year, they captured Class A by outscoring silver medalist Velma-Alma, 125-57. This year, they outdistanced co-runnersup Buffalo and Fox, 112-64.

Jinkens agrees a rematch with Velma-Alma would have been a thing to behold. "Moving to B was a difference maker. We'd had a real challenge against Velma-Alma."

Even without its graduated relay stars, Boise City won the 800 and 3,200 and finished second in the other two baton events.

"Kim Ogles, a senior, is the reason we won," Jinkens said. "She has led off our 3200 relay team four straight years and it finished first three times and second the other. That relay win gave us the start we needed."

The 800 relay victory was an upset over favored Fox. B. C.'s first three legs built up such a lead that even the fleet Cameko Tyner couldn't make up the gap on her anchor carry.

Boise City qualified 11 girls and 10 of them scored, including senior Darla Bocock, who won the 800, and junior Jesse James, champ of the 100 hurdles. Bocock, who won the 3,200 in Class A last year, set a Class B record of 2:22.38

in the 800.

Tyner, the Fox flash, was again the big individual story in B girls. She won three gold medals and the silver in the 800 relay.

Cameko tied her own meet 100 record in the preliminaries (12.31) and anchored the 400 relay team, which twice lowered the meet record of 50.74 by Temple (1996)—to 50.54 in the prelims and to 50.50 in the finals.

Others on the record-setting unit were Candice Walker, Trudy Rushing and Tera Rowls.

Amanda Shane of Buffalo repeated as 300 hurdles champion. She also won the intermediates in 1997, but wasn't in the field this time.

Maysville's Sara Turner ran four seconds better in duplicating her 3,200 victory a season ago.

Then there's the Cherokee weight wonders—Barbara Phillips and Jamie Buck, who must be watched as potential all-class record breakers in the shot.

They are only sophomores and, given the daily competition they provide one another the state record of 44-10.5, set by Darla Austain of Del City in 1989, seems there for the taking. Phillips threw 42-11 in a meet at Ringwood this season, Buck's top was 42-0.5 at Medford.

In the state meet, Phillips was 40-9 and Buck 40-2, reversing their a state 1-2 finish as freshmen when Buck set the Class B meet record of 40-11.5.

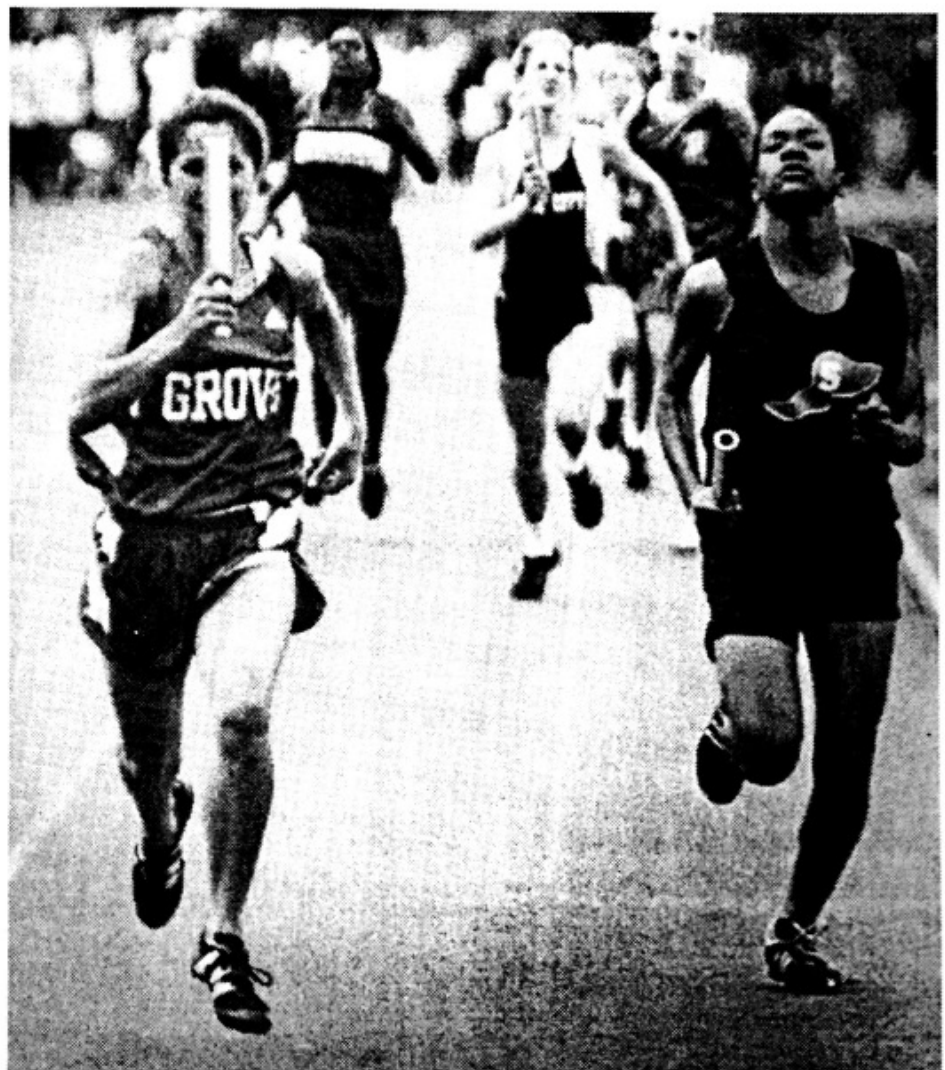

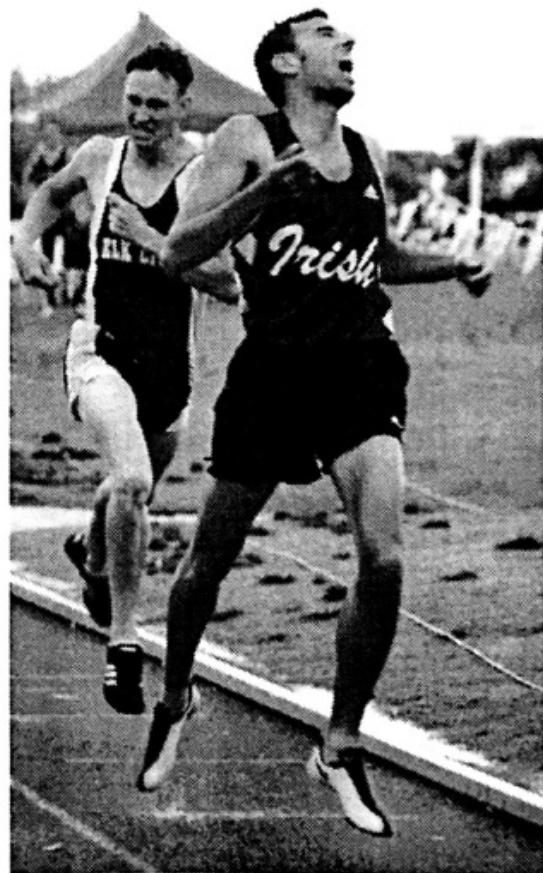

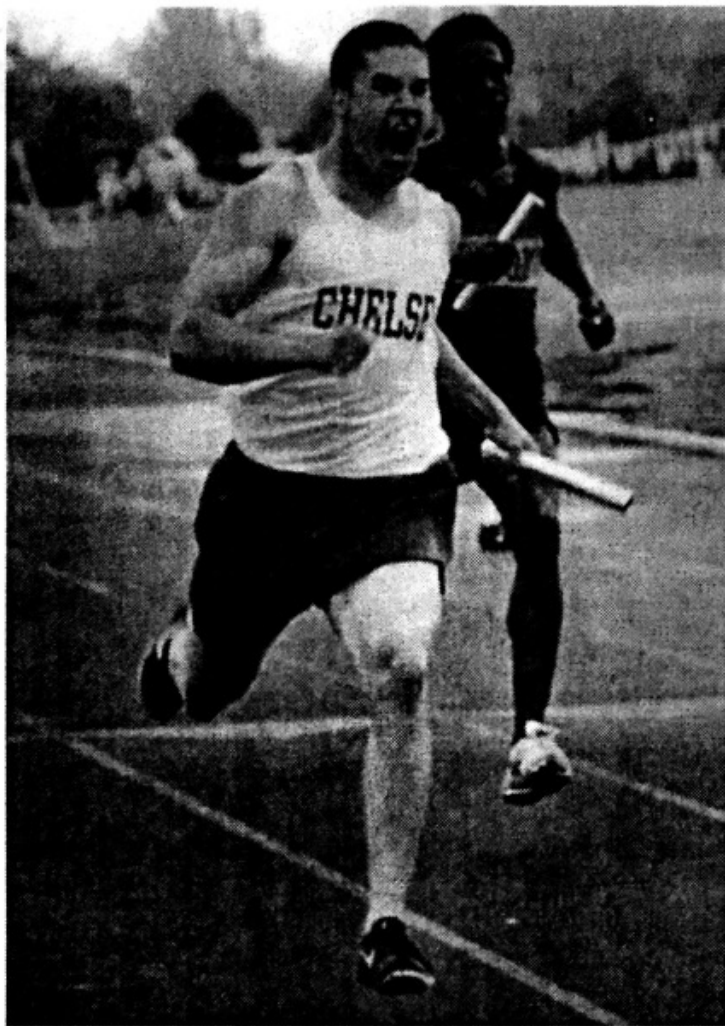

A fine day weather-wise greeted the Sooners as they hosted the Cornhuskers and Jayhawks at the John Jacobs track facility. Intermediate hurdler Edward Clarke posted a quick 51.15 in his specialty over 400 meters, and after Danny McFarlane grabbed the open 400 meters in 45.99, the duo teamed with fellow blurs Roxbert Martin and Ryan Kite to flash to another impressive showing in the 1600 meter relay in

3:02.96.

Marcus Bivines took the 100 meters in 10.40 and lent a hand on the Sooners' victorious 400 meter relay team (40.16). In the 800 meters, Norman standout Kyle Bennett held off a good field for a 1:53.80 win. Look for good things to come from this freshman.

In the middle distances, Germany's Silke Vogel scored a splendid victory for the Lady Sooners in the 800 meters (2:11.40), coupled with Mindy Mizell's victory in the 1500 meters (4:52.18). Norman product Candice Palmer (121' 10"), and Edmond North's Katie Webster (125' 4"), took home golds in the discus and javelin respectively. To wrap up the meet, the Sooner 1600 meter relay team won again with another fine

performance (3:34.22) by holding off the Lady Huskers (3:34.62) down the stretch, in a good tuneup for the conference and national meets.

Queen City Invitational Springfield, MO - May 3

Southwest Missouri State hosted this one on a warm, sunny day as both Tulsa University, and Oklahoma State University took their teams to the 'Show-Me' state to show off their track prowess.

In a thrilling 800 meters eventually won by Arkansas-alum Brandon Rock (1:49.04), the Hurricane's Adam Ellison (1:49.98), and Rodney Peterson (1:50.29) continue to sharpen for the WAC meet to be held in San Diego, CA in a couple of weeks. The duo also coupled with Hassan Faggett and Loren Kool to take third in the 1600 meter relay (3:15.97).

OSU went 1-2 in the 1500 meters with Jon Wild (3:44.27), and Cowboy teammate Chuck Sloan (3:46.86) being followed closely by former Jenks 5A state champ Brian Young (3:48.48) in fourth, and Jeff McDaniel (3:51.40) in seventh. TU runners Cornelius Mason (3:54.77), David Bohlen (4:01.03), Monte Hawkins (4:01.26), and Mark Magnuson (4:03.03) also represented the Hurricane well.

In the 3000 meters, the Cowboys' Rene' Carlsen (8:18.49), and Chris Kebenei (8:23.04) finished third and fourth, while Tulsa's Dwight Davis (8:35.67) followed in seventh. Loren Kool (54.46) brought home a bronze in the 400 meter IH to wrap up the scoring for the Hurricane.
