

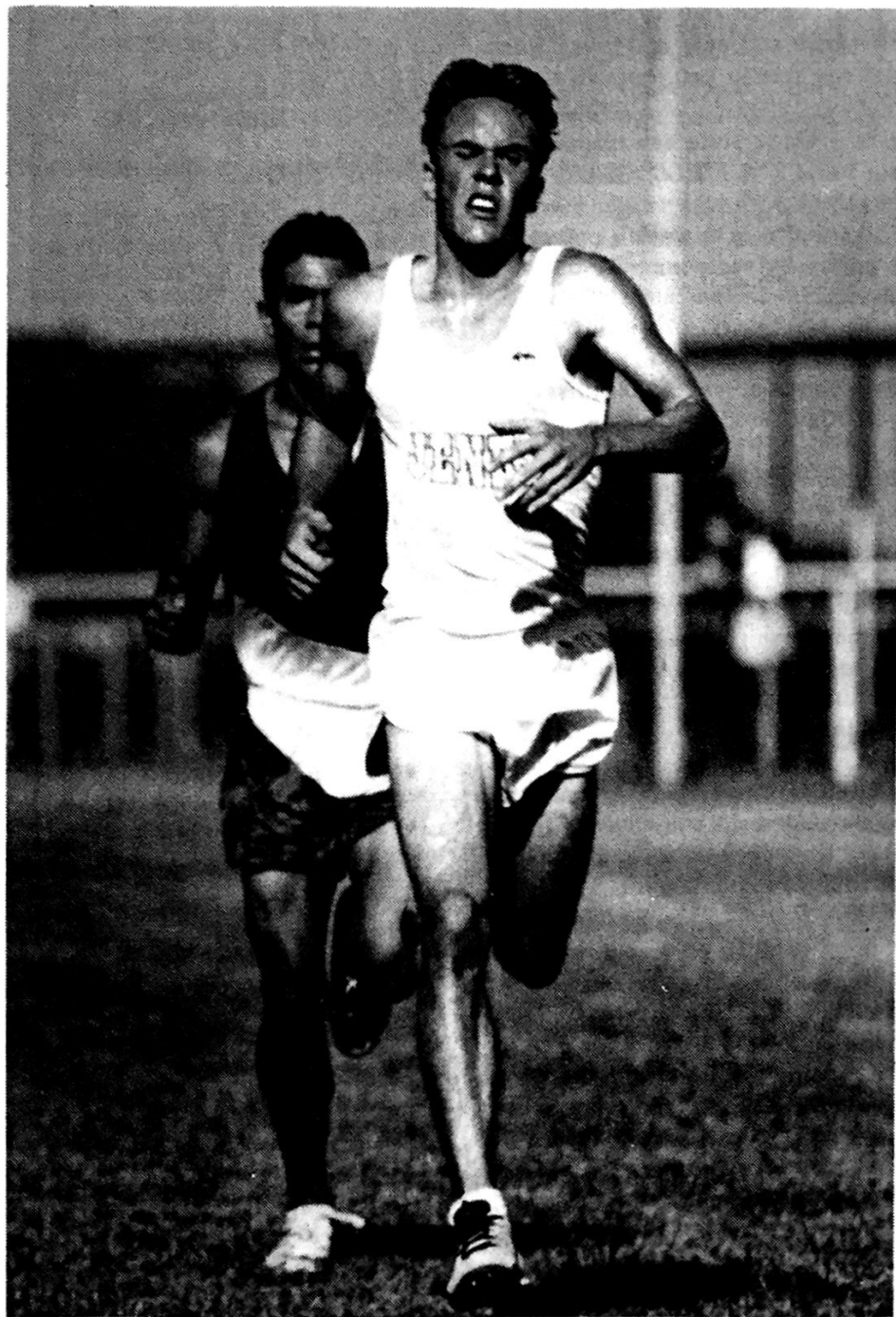

Seven Champions Highlight 75 Returning All-Staters

Seven of ten 1996 cross country state champions will return to defend their titles in 1997. Leading the group of 75 returning All-Staters in five classes is Velma-Alma junior Rae Ann McCurry, two-time champion looking to continue on her path to the once accomplished fourth title. The season is approaching its fourth week of competition and eight of the ten defending team champions are currently ranked No. 1.

5A Girls

Eight of the top 10 individuals are back, led by defending champion Lindsey Hughes of Westmoore. Coach Laura Clay's Jaguars dominated 5A and finished the '96 season on top of the final Power Poll but are off to a slow start in '97, dropping a narrow decision to McGuinness at Shawnee. Sapulpa looked very strong in winning their own meet and will be making a strong case for the top ranking as the season progresses. Moore, Bartlesville, Jenks and 5A newcomer, Hale, will all be in the hunt. Nobody is real deep and the development of their talents will be important along with staying healthy.

Individually this is a wide-open race with Sapulpa's Audrey McVey getting the top spot over teammate Heather Barnes. Owasso's Christine Novara and Jenks sophomore Atalie Barber are looking strong as well.

5A Boys

Defending champion Edmond Memorial lost six starters and has their youngest team in years, but the Bulldogs are still contending for the top spot. Bartlesville was impressive in winning the Sapulpa meet over the 'dogs and Moore and get the nod for No. 1 based on that performance.

On Track

It doesn't seem like it should be almost the middle of September yet, but here we are. The season is past its first three weeks and competition is really starting to heat up.

Time to go over the beginning of the year trivia.

TEAM REPORTS were sent out at the end of August and are the basis for the rankings and preview in this issue. The master schedule is derived from these very important forms and it's still not too late to get yours in if you haven't already done so.

RANKINGS will be released on a weekly basis to state newspapers and published every two weeks in the *Oklahoma TRACK & FIELD NEWS*. They mostly reflect what happened in the previous week with less weight given to previous weeks and very little or no consideration to next week's potential. This means that if a team or individual is beaten by someone with a lower ranking they will most likely move ahead of them in the rankings for the current week. Weather conditions, tough or easy courses, injuries, other competitions, missing team members, bad races, or other factors that could have influenced the race are not taken into account. Runners that miss two consecutive races for any reason, injury or other, are dropped out of the rankings until they return. My own philosophy is that if you line up to race and get beat you don't make excuses for the loss but prepare to win the next time. However, the final, pre-state ranking will be based on state meet potential.

RESULTS: rankings are based on results and unless we receive them we can't do a good job. Coaches, make sure that the meet director is planning to send full (20 deep, at least, full names and times) results as soon as the meet is over. With weekly rankings going out we have to have results in by noon on Monday to be factored into the week's ranking. Late results may appear in an issue but they are not always factored into the rankings.

SUMMER TRACK RESULTS got the best of me again this year. I'm still looking for help in getting summer USATF/AAU/Hershey track meets entered into my computer. Unfortunately, these age-group results are vastly more complex than state high school results and very time-consuming to keyboard. I really do want to get them published but until I get some help it's not likely to happen.

NEW RULES: runners may now wear watches during competition and seven, instead of six, teams will qualify for the state meet from each regional. There will be four regional sites--still only two per class--this year which should help speed the schedule up. It's nice to see the OSSAA responding to changes in the sport but I'm still baffled by the rule limiting the number of athletes that can stand on the podium at the state meet awards ceremony. This is a sport that prides itself on the team concept and a look at any successful program will tell you that every member of the team is important, not just the seven runners that get to compete. I hope the coaches keep bringing this issue before the board of directors until they see the wisdom of changing it back to the way it was before.

INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS are still not represented in the rankings and I'm still looking for some help in compiling at least an individual ranking for this group. Oklahoma City Casady's girls, who would probably be in 2A, have won their class in two meets so far and would easily have three or four runners ranked in the top 20. If you might be interested, give me a call. My new number is 405-521-8750.

Arkansas with Charles Page rival Michael Cliff at OSU, leaving Moore's Jimmy Martinez to reel in the top individual ranking. Martinez has been impressive in winning all three of his starts. Other contenders will be Sapulpa's Ben Lake, Jenks' Clay Cosby and Union's Jeremy Case. The Trojans have a new coach--former Edmond North boss Steve Patterson, but will have to go through some rebuilding before they return to their former powerhouse days.

4A Boys and Girls

With both the top-ranked 4A boys and girls teams, McGuinness is looking for an unprecedented third double team title--the "triple double" as it is known in Irish circles. Dave Morton's runners had the opportunity to accomplish the never-before-done feat in 1994 but the boys were narrowly defeated by a strong Guthrie team, the only school to top McGuinness at the state meet in the past five years. This year the Irish boys certainly don't plan on being the fly in the ointment as they start the season with perhaps the strongest boys team in the state, period. The Irish ladies, the winningest girls program in the state, get a big boost from another in their long line of outstanding freshman, Amanda Jordan, who is virtually unchallenged at the top of 4A at the moment. With five titles in a row, the McGuinness girls can tie the record with a win, matching Union's six titles in a row from 1976 through 1981. Hoping to step up if McGuinness stumbles will be Pryor, Weatherford, Grove and Kelley, all capable of mounting a serious title bid if circumstances are right.



Connolly

The Irish boys are led by junior Kevin Connolly, No. 1 ranked defending champion but hotly pursued by teammate, sophomore Bret Lowry, winner over Connolly in the season opener at Shawnee. McGuinness put six in the top ten last year and can certainly hope to do the same again this year. Edison gets the nod as the best of the rest as the balance of the 4A teams will have to settle for scrambling over the runnerup spot.

Marlow was the runnerup in the final Power Poll and Jimmy Brackeen's team returns all of the starters from last year's championship unit. The Outlaws should contend for the top spot in the Power Poll again this year and easily command the top position in 3A. Little Axe

Defending champion Tasha Lance has the No. 1 ranking but is going to have to defend it against a host of very capable challengers led by Plainview's Becky Harvey, Warner's Miley Turnbull and Berryhill's Jai Scott.

and Cascia Hall are the best of the rest but don't look for anyone else on the top of the stand at the end.

Defending champion Leah McCauley holds on to the No. 1 spot while a host of challengers hope to crack her hold on the championship, led by Elk City's Amy Kilhoffer, Purcell sophomore Amy Dunaway, Cascia Hall's Sara Jurek and teammates Amber Staats and Melissa Hinds.

3A Boys

Elk City is another defending champion with an excellent chance of repeating. Coach Mark Heard's team won their first-ever title last year and they will be hard to stop this year. Led by No. 1 ranked Utah Robinson, they have three runners in the top ten.

Defending champ Kevin Minson and runnerup Albert Kelly from Bristow, both have their sights set on the championship and it will be one of the most hotly contested races, again.

2A Girls

Plainview hopes to return to their usual spot at the top of the heap again this year after their disappointing showing at the state meet last year--not to take anything away from the outstanding effort by Lexington. Coach Jerry Naylor's girls have always been one of the best teams in the state but they will be challenged by several strong contenders in Lexington, Warner and Chisholm.

Dickson finally got their crown last year and they're headed for another this year. Coach Ron Love's Comets will be pushed by a rapidly improving Prague team as well as a strong group from Chisholm.



McCurry

This is one of the most wide-open individual races at the moment with at least five runners capable of making a run at the title out of eight returning All-Staters. The No. 1 spot goes to Prague's Daniel Stone but Alva's Ryan Bickerstaff, Caney Valley's Joey McNair, Elgin's Jeremiah Smith and Dickson's David Lampkin all have the potential to win the big one.

A Girls

Led by two-time champ McCurry, the Velma-Alma girls are a good bet to win it again. Coach Jerry Loveall's Comets have four ranked in the top ten and are always one of the top teams in the state. This race always gets more interesting as the season progress since many of the panhandle teams hardly compete in Oklahoma prior to the regional meets, providing an often unexpected end to the season. Eight top ten individuals return.

A Boys

Defending champ Herbie Pebeashy, has a good grip on the top spot here but don't count Velma-Alma out. Pebeashy and Comet Mylo Miller have had some classic duels and I would hesitate to predict the outcome so early.

Tahlequah Sequoyah always produces a strong team and any of the panhandle teams could pop up to challenge for the hardware.

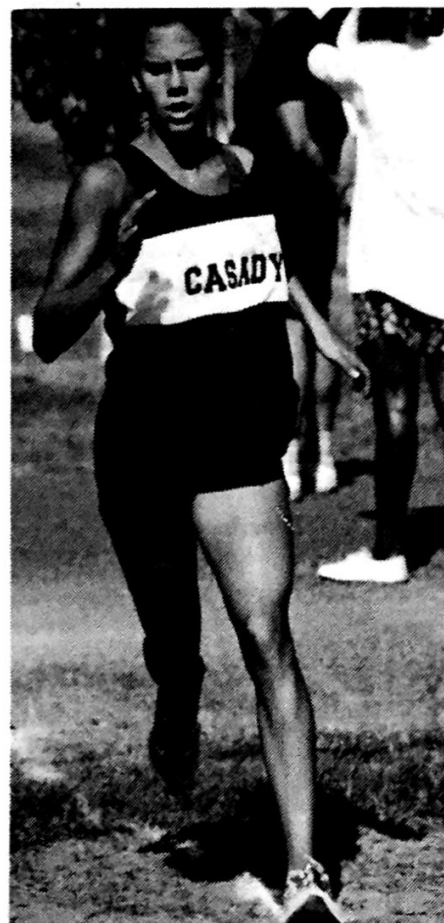

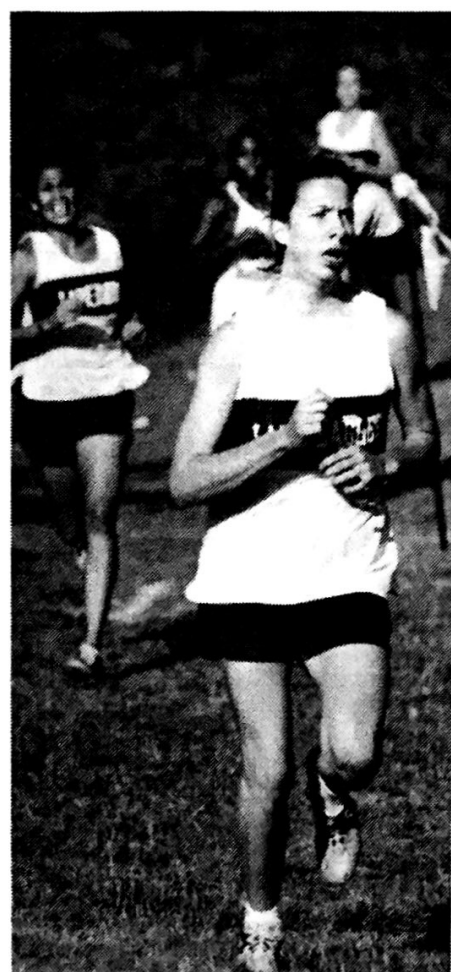
