

Next Issue October 31st Regional Results State Meet Preview

Regionals On Horizon As Competition Heats Up

This is the last issue before regionals which will be held October 25th in Midwest City, Ponca City, Watonga and Lindsay. This is the first year for four sites and seven teams will qualify from each regional for a total of 14 at state.

The big pre-state meet at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa on the 10th drew most of the state's top teams for a head-to-head clash on the state meet course and is the primary factor in the team and individual rankings in the issue, especially the Power Ranking. There were a few notable absences: Moore, top-ranked in 5A boys; Hydro, defending champ and top-ranked in A boys; and Carl Albert, high-ranked in 4A girls, among others.

McGuinness still looks like a good bet to accomplish the "triple double" though they're definitely not as untouchable as they have been in the past. No other school has both teams top-ranked, though several are close.

5A Boys

Moore has continued to hold on to the top spot with a solid win at the Cowboy Jamboree in Stillwater but the Lions ducked-out on the ORU meet. Edmond Memorial and Jenks tied at 83 point each on the ORU course but the Bulldogs got the victory on their sixth man with Mustang and Bartlesville a distant third and fourth. Though they're definitely not invincible, the Lions get the nod for the top spot in the Power Ranking after 4A McGuinness faltered at ORU. The Irish had the fastest average team time at the Cowboy Jamboree but slipped to third in Tulsa.

Sapulpa's Ben Lake handed Moore's Jimmy Martinez his first loss of the season at the Cowboy Jamboree then Jenks' Clay Cosby outsprinted Lake at ORU to nab the top spot in the individual rankings. Union's Jeremy Case led early at ORU but faded to third with Edmond North's Chase Hawkins fourth.

5A Girls

Sapulpa continues to hang on to the top spot by a hair, edging defending champion Westmoore at both the Cowboy Jamboree and the ORU meets. It looks like it is going to be a two-team fight for the state title with Moore lurking in the background and hoping one of the top teams will slip up.

On Track

Only two more weeks until the state meet! This will be the last issue before regionals and regional assignments appear elsewhere in this issue. Admission will be charged at both regionals and state--\$4.00 for adults and \$2.00 for K-12--and I hope everyone makes an effort to make the system work. I know we're all used to attending cross country free of charge but it is time to do our part to help the sport financially.

The issue of girls running two miles or five kilometers is bubbling to the surface again and we're running two articles, one on each position, in the next two issues.

The 1997 Oklahoma vs. Arkansas cross country dual will again be held in Fayetteville, Ark., on November 15th at the University of Arkansas course. Head coaches for the Oklahoma team are David Morton, McGuinness (405-842-6638/341-0877), girls, and Barry Klein, Little Axe (405-769-6536), boys. 20 runners will be selected for each team and their coach must be a member of the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association. If you are interested running, contact the appropriate coach. This is a great opportunity for our athletes to be seen in a regionally significant meet.

The 1997 Foot Locker Cross Country Championships, now in its 19th consecutive year, will be held at Disney's Wide World of Sports Complex in Orlando, Fla., December 13th. Runners qualify through four regionals with only the top eight advancing to the finals. Oklahoma runners are assigned to the Midwest Regional which will be held in Kenosha Wisc., November 29th at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside. There are usually a couple of groups from Oklahoma traveling to the regional and I'll try to put you in touch with one of them if you're interested in going.

I've done a Power Ranking in this issue with the rankings based on a combination of average team times and head to head competition. Since there are very few opportunities for inter-class competition in Oklahoma these rankings are a bit mystical but there seems to be a lot of interest in how teams stack up against each other. The last chance for a showdown between classes will be at the Chile Pepper Cross Country Festival in Fayetteville on October 18th. The final Power Ranking will be based on the combined results of the state meet at ORU in Tulsa.

My congratulations again to the meet directors at the pre-state meet at ORU last week. Results were available quickly and accurately and were the heart of all the rankings in this issue.

Our college writer, Bud Almond, was swamped this past three weeks and had to put the college report on the back burner until the next issue. We'll be looking forward to its return.

Senior Achievement Awards are being coordinated by Velma-Alma coach Jerry Loveall and coaches should have their nominations in following regional competition. These awards honor five senior runners in each class and division that don't qualify for All-State awards.

We're still having significant problems with the U.S. Postal Service's delivery of OT&FN and the only remedy is to call you local post office to complain if you're not getting your issues promptly. In spite of the fact that all issues are put in the mail at the same time, there can be several days' difference in when they arrive, even in the same town!

The next issue will be dated October 31st and will contain full regional results and final pre-state rankings. It will be available at the state meet.

4A Boys

McGuinness still looks untouchable here even though the Irish weren't as impressive in winning the ORU meet as they were at the Cowboy Jamboree. Guthrie stepped up to second and Edison is not too far back. Last year the Irish put six in the top eight but will be hard-pressed to get four in the top ten this year.

McGuinness defending champion Kevin Connolly has regained the top ranking with teammate Brett Lowry a solid second. Shawnee's George

Wright, Western Heights' Phillip Semien and Guthrie's Robert Darbe are all in the hunt for a top-five spot.

4A Girls



2A Girls





Two miles or 5km? That is the question!

As we stand on the brink of the next millennium, many coaches, parents, cross country and track & field advocates, are beginning to ask what can we do to make our sport even better.

On the world-class level, as the rest of the world is stretching the limits of competition with times that most thought could never be reached, the U.S. falls farther and farther behind in the distance events

In the mens events, there is only four runners, Bob Kennedy, Todd Williams, Rodney Holman and Rich Kenan, who have made breakthroughs on the world-class level.

In the women's event, Regina Jacobs, Lynn Jennings and Mary Decker Slaney, are essentially the only women that have been able to compete at the top of their class.

There are a number of reasons for this trend and probably too many to discuss *in* this article, but from a coaching and athletic standpoint, we have put too many limitations on our young athletes. As a former national class high school and collegiate runner, a long time running promoter and advocate, one of Oklahoma's top open runners, and presently personal trainer and coach to athletes ranging from high school to post college, I feel compelled to offer the argument that in Oklahoma we can overcome some of those limitations by making the girls standard cross country distance equal to the boys.

However, no argument is valid without the evidence to support it, Here are just a few of the reasons I feel the Oklahoma powers-that-be should consider over the next few years.

I. Olympics - One of the best development for women's running came in 1984 when the Olympic Gaines opened up the modern marathon to women. Soon after, Joan Benoit showed that women were just as strong and tough as men in the event that is considered the epitome of the Olympic games - the modern marathon.

Although, as a personal trainer I believe that no one- man or womanshould attempt the 26.2 mile distance until after college, Benoit showed that women were equal to men in terms of training, mental toughness, and understand race strategy.

Since that time, the doors have slowly opened up to allow' women to compete in the same events as men. Today, women are competing and training on par with men in every distance the 100-meters to the ultra marathon In fact, Ann Trason, a woman ultra marathoner, is considered by some to be the "best" endurance athlete of our time.

Likewise, in working in young athletes, I have found that in all cases, young women train just as intelligently, are just as mentally tough and understand the strategy of racing just as their male counterparts.

2. Standardization - Presently, there are 32 states in the union that offer 5K cross country championships. An additional 9 states are in transition from the 2-mile to the 4K or 5K distances, and there are nine others, including Oklahoma, who still use 2-mile or 3,200 meters as their longest competitive distance

Although I don't agree with the United State Track & Field Association on many issues, I do agree with their policy of trying to standardize (in metrics) most of the country's major running championships. Even though as a traditionalist, I still enjoy running mile-based events, I do understand that the United States is the only country in the world where the mile standards are still being used. In Europe, 4K, 6K, 12K, and 20K distances are very common to cross country and road races.

If the time is not right for the move to 5K, some consideration to using the 4K distance should be given to experimenting at the smaller schools where *cross* country is given top billing.

3. College recruiting - For Oklahoma high school female runners who happen to be good enough to make it to college, having a good 5K cross country time on their resume is a plus in being recruited.

In my conversations with college coaches across the nation, when they recruit female athletes to compete in the 5,000 and 10,000 meter events on the collegiate level, a good cross country 5K time helps to predict the athlete's potential.

Also, every classification of women's collegiate athletics use the 5K distance for their national championships.

Although many of Oklahoma youth may run 5K road races, there are not many college coaches who use road times as a basis for choosing how their athletes will run in cross country or on the track..

Also, it is no wonder that many of colleges choose to recruit out-ofthe-country athletes who may have a number of 5K times under their belts.

4. Foot Locker - For college coaches, the biggest recruitment tool for top U.S distance athletes besides track & field, is the Foot Locker regional meets and championships. And what is the distance that is run at all Foot Locker? 5 kilometers. At last year's Foot Locker regional and national championships, Oklahoma's Mark Thompson was able to finish among the top athletes in the country (2nd at regionals and, 7th at nationals) because he had run a number of meets and his state championship at the distance.

However, no Oklahoma female athlete was able advance to the Foot Locker national meets because they had no "race experience" at the distance. The Oklahoma female athletes who did compete in the Foot Locker regionals in Wisconsin struggled at the 5K distance because they were not familiar with 5K race strategy. Not surprisingly, the Oklahoma team finished last at the Midwest regionals.

5.11-minutes - In track & field, no Oklahoma woman has ever broken 11 minutes for the 2-mile, which is considered, beside running well at Foot Locker meets, to be "national class" benchmark for top high school girl runners. As a longtime coach, I believe once Oklahoma girls start training at the 5K distance, the 11-minute "barrier" will be broken the same year. why? Because once an athlete learns to run a respectful 5K, the 2-mile distance will seem a lot easier, thus the "mental barrier" of 11 minutes will soon be broken too.

6. Dollars and Sense - The reason it makes good sense to move to the 5K because when it comes to college, the Oklahoma girls lose out on the millions of scholarship dollars that are given out across the country each year. Title IX has opened up the doors for many young women to go to college, pay for their school and start promising careers. Let's not deny them that opportunity by limiting their ability to compete for those scholarships.

And although I have no problem with foreign athletes running for teams at U.S. colleges and universities, I do see a growing with American distance athletes, and Oklahoma girls specifically, at a disadvantage to compete for the same scholarships that are now going to athletes from other countries.

And as the cost of college continue to rise, I know there are a number of Oklahoma parents out there who would benefit economically from the scholarship bounty that will continue to grow. In the spirit of fairness, I will offer that there are some very credible arguments that weigh in on the side of staying with the 2-mile distance. Some critics argue that the longer distance would lead to more eating and nutrition disorders that now are prevalent in the sport. Others say that the increase in distance will also cause the an increase in training load, which would lead to more injuries.

However, in talking with doctors and sports psychologist and physiologists, most will tell that a majority of eating and nutrition disorders &e psychological disorders, Also, the training base for 5 kilometers, for high schoolers, is essentially no different than the 2-mile.

Finally, a good knowledge, understanding and respect for running by administrators, coaches, parents and "sports writers," can make cross country the most healthy participation sport in America. As a writer for one of the state's largest newspapers, I know that there many sports writers and sports fans who consider running, cross country and track & field an off-season basketball, football and wrestling.

I would also encourage the Oklahoma Coaches Association to consider either changing the distance altogether from 2-mile to 5K, implementing a 2-year or 2-year pilot program with the larger classifications and then moving to the smaller schools, or slowly integrating changes in the distance by experimenting with the 4K distance before wholesale changes are made.

In closing, I reiterate that it is time to let our great Oklahoma female athletes shine.


