On Track

We're off an running again. With three weeks of competition behind us and eight to go its going to be a whirlwind.

Beginning of the year trivia.

TEAM REPORTS went out two weeks ago but not enough have come back. This is the basis for rankings, correct spelling, schedules, phone numbers, etc. Coaches, please take time to fill it out and return it—at least send us a team roster and schedule.

RANKINGS begin in this issue and I've already made some mistakes. Some were corrected prior to this issue going in the mail but some made it into print via the state newspapers. Remember, rankings reflect what happened in the previous week with less weight given to previous weeks and very little or no consideration to next week's potential. This means that if a team or individual is beaten by someone with a lower ranking they will most likely move ahead of them in the rankings fro the current week. Weather conditions, tough or easy courses, injuries, other competitions, missing team members, bad races, or other factors that could have influenced the race are not taken into account. Runners that miss two consecutive races for any reason, injury or other, are dropped out of the rankings until they return. My own philosophy is that if you line up to race and get beat you don't make excuses for the loss but prepare to win the next time. However, the final, pre-state ranking will be based on state meet potential. I encourage input. Please call to correct errors or just give me your opinion. Rankings will be released to state newspapers and put on our web site (<http://www.oktrack.com>) as frequently as possible, at least every two weeks.

POWER RANKINGS are going to appear in all issues from now on. This is an area where I especially look for input. Where possible, they are derived from average team times on the same course if head-to-head competition doesn't exist.

RESULTS: rankings are based on results and unless we receive them we are in the dark. Coaches, make sure that the meet director is planning to send full (20+ deep with full names and times) results as soon as the meet is over. With weekly rankings going out we have to have results in by noon on Monday to be factored into the week's ranking. Late results may appear in an issue but they are not always factored into the rankings.

SUMMER TRACK RESULTS got the best of me again. Same song, fourth or fifth verse. I'm still looking for help in getting summer USATF/AAU/Hershey track meets entered into my computer. Unfortunately, these age-group results are vastly more complex than state high school results and very time-consuming to keyboard. If I can get the results submitted electronically, I will also post them to the web site. Are there any USATF officials out there listening?

WEB SITE is up and running. We posted state track meet results along with final season leader listings and summer schedule. We will be posting team and individual rankings and maybe meet results. Look us up, check us out and let me know what you think.

Seven Champions Highlight 65 Returning All-Staters

Seven of the ten 1997 cross country state champions, along with three previous champs, will return to defend their titles in 1998. Head-

lining the group of 65 returning All-Staters in five classes are three two-time winners, led by 4A defender, McGuinness senior Kevin Connolly, and Weatherford senior Herbie Pebeashy, a two-time winner from Hydro in Class A, now competing for the 4A Eagles. They will be vying to become only the second boy to win three titles after Edmond Memorial's Mark Thompson accomplished the feat for the first time with his third win in 1996. Velma-Alma's Rae Ann McCurry, winner in '95 and '96, will be gunning for her third title in her senior season after dropping to seventh last year.

Only three of the defending champs are currently ranked No. 1 after three weeks of competition. Rankings are based almost completely on reported meets and runners who have not competed for any reason for two weeks are dropped from the lists. Please see the complete explanation on page two for ranking criteria.

The Power Ranking is making an early appearance this year in spite of the lack of overall competition, different course lengths and lack of inter-class competition. These rankings are rather mystical but strive to compare how teams stack up against each other across the state. The final Power Ranking from the state meet takes the combined results of each team and gives an average team time for more accurate comparison.

5A Girls

Eight of the top ten individuals are back, along with 4A's third-place finisher, Camille Herron, who has transferred from Duncan to Westmoore to help make coach Laura Clay's

Jaguars the No. 1 pre-season team again with four runners in the top ten. Defending champion Sapulpa, nationally ranked 22nd by

magazine, has apparently suffered the non-graduation loss of three of their top runners and drops to fifth. Moore leads the group of challengers that include Mustang, Jenks and Edmond Memorial, with no clear favorite in the group.

Herron, unbeaten so far this season, has nabbed the top individual ranking over Westmoore teammates, defending champion Summer Suchy and Allison Franklin. Herron was the 4A champion at 1600 and 3200 meters on the track. Jenks' Atalie Barber, 5A 1600 champ, Norman North's Carolyn Remy and Sapulpa's Adrienne McVey will all be challenging for the top spots.

5A Boys

Edmond Memorial is back on top here on the strength of a win over defending champion Moore at the Sapulpa meet and a victory over Jenks at Marlow. The Bulldogs don't have a top ten runner yet but are still scoring the points where they count. Jenks has a young team, led by defending champion Clay Cosby while Moore is led by No.1 ranked Chris McWatters. Mustang and Norman North will both contend for top five positions at the state meet.

4A Girls and Boys

Same song, fourth verse. Coach Dave Morton's Irish will be seeking to re-write

Oklahoma cross country history as they go for their fourth consecutive double team victory. After joining Jenks ('88, '98, '90) as the only other "triple double" winner last year, the Irish have the chance to own the "quadruple double" and the girls will be going for a record seven straight titles after tying Union's six with their win last year.

While a team disciplinary suspension has kept the Irish boys out of the rankings up to this point they will be seeking to live up to their 1997 No. 1 Power Ranking and 18th national pre-season ranking by *Harrier* magazine. Led by two-time champion Kevin Connolly, they return four All-Staters, including last year's second and third place finishers, Bret Lowry and Patrick Eberle.

3A Girls

This class, already one of the toughest at the state meet, got a lot tougher with the return of

Two-time Class A champ Herbie Pebeashy is now at Weatherford but will have to contend with Connolly to become only the second boy to win three state titles. Guthrie, Noble and Weatherford will do battle for the runnerup spot.

The Irish girls showed some vulnerability at regionals last year but bounced back for a convincing win at state behind the undefeated performance of freshman Amanda Jordan, also nationally ranked by *Harrier* magazine. The toll of being on top for so long—six years, six titles, six individual champs—is beginning to show on the Irish and they could face a serious

perennial power Plainview. Defending champion Little Axe leads the pack with four very capable teams nipping at their heels. Marlow, Plainview, Elk City and Cascia Hall all have the capability of challenging for the top spot.

Cascia Hall sophomore Carrie McFall returns to defend her title along with five other All-Staters and newcomer Jesse Gordon from Plainview, who has been burning up the courses so far this season.

3A Boys

Elk City carried the top ranking from start to finish last year and coach Mark Heard's Elks will be trying to do the same thing again this year to nab their third straight title. With Plainview back in the 3A picture in makes things a bit more interesting. Little Axe, Marlow and Anadarko will also have a chance to contend for the title.

No champion returns here and Plainview's Patrick McGuire has been impressive so far this season. Five All-Staters return but only one, Elk

City's Travis Johnson, has made it in the top ten so far. This will be a wide open race.

2A Girls

Two-time defending champion Lexington has not been impressive, yet, but don't count the Bulldogs out until the final points are counted. Warner, behind defending champ Miley Turnbull, leads a pack of four or five teams that could all mount a serious title challenge. Watch for Tishomingo, Dickson, Lindsay and Chisholm to come on strong as the season progresses.

Individually, Turnbull—winner of the 800 and 1600 on the track—has been very impressive. Lexington's Amanda Wedel and Tamara Broome, along with Dickson's Lindsey Hicks are the top challengers.

2A Boys

Two-time defending champion Dickson stands on top of this heap but the footing is precarious with a host of schools fielding very capable teams. Perennial Class A powers Riverside

and Tahlequah Sequoyah and both up to 2A which will make the mix even more interesting.

Seven All-Staters return but no champion. Alva's Ryan Bickerstaff heads the pack with Tahlequah Sequoyah's Lance Zunie, Watonga's Jim Bob Coleman and Chisholm's Jerome Dunkin nipping at his heels.

A Girls

Two-time champion Velma-Alma has defending champ Amber Thacker and senior two-time champ Rae Ann McCurry back along with fourth place Cindy Fuller. Things will be much tighter this year for coach Jerry Loveall's Comets though, with Laverne finally able to field a full team. Lack of early season competition and information make this a hard class to call but watch for Canton, Oklahoma Christian, Burns Flat-Dill City and Wakita to rise to the top.

Healdton's Sonja Peterson gets the top spot with a win over the Velma-Alma pack but this is always a very unpredictable race. Canton freshman Beth Hooten looks good, as do Laverne's Kristen Barby and Carnegie's Keshia Sharp.

A Boys

Two-time champ Hydro loses a lot, including the transfer of two-time winner Pebeashy to Weatherford. Velma-Alma has former winner Mylo Miller leading the individual race and looks to be the team to beat right now. Oklahoma Christian has most of their team back and will be looking to knock off the Comets if the opportunity arises.

Miller will be challenged by Oklahoma Christian's Steve May and Taylor Miles, along with Carnegie's Lucian Bliss.

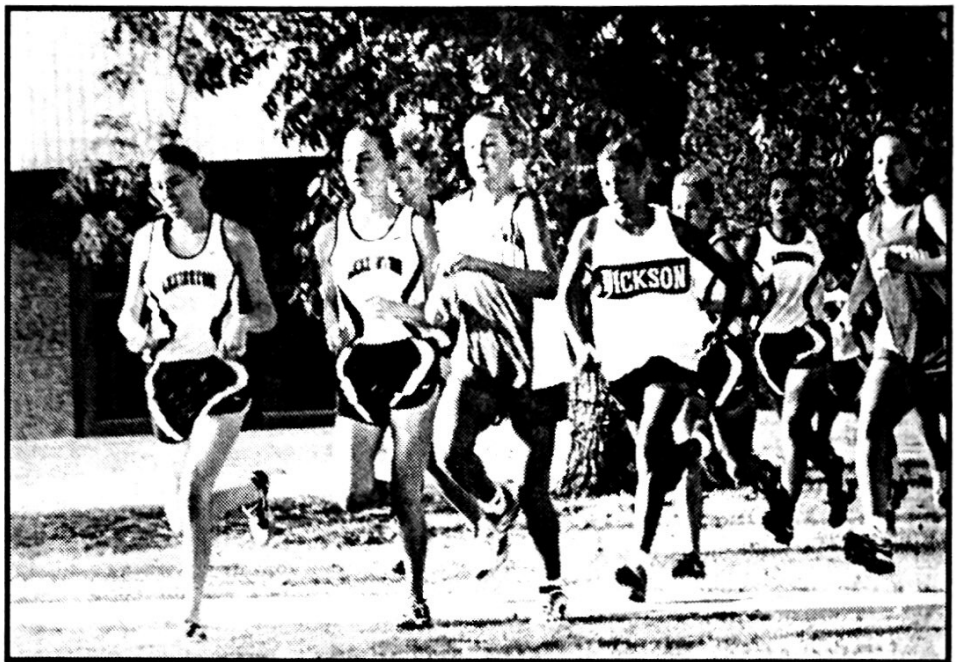
