5A-4A State Meet

A year ago, Oklahoma's large-school track and field championships were highlighted by the greatest 800-meter race in state history, a record-setting duel between two 5A boys under-classmen.

A re-run was anticipated this season and, sure enough, the 800 was the feature event again. Except, it was the SA girls who grabbed the spotlight.

In the regional at Catoosa, Jenks junior Atalie Barber broke the state record of 2:13.63, set a year ago by her graduated teammate Kelli O'Rourke, with an electronically-timed 2:13.47. Barber was second in 2:14.00 when O'Rourke set her record in the 1998 state meet and figured to move up to the title this year.

But Melissa Webb of Bartlesville wasn't figuring it that way. After all, Webb had been a

close second to Barber at Catoosa (their hand timings used for state seedings were 2:13.25 to 2:13.81). In the state finals at Ardmore's Noble Stadium, Webb, also a junior, sped her two turns around the superb new track in 2:12.38, She took the lead on the first curve of the second lap and breezed to a 20-yard victory. Barber was state runnerup again in

"I don't see how Webb did it." said John Hoke, editor of Oklahoma Track and Field News. wind was furious."

Midwest City track coach David Gleason saw a lot of things he liked that day as

Lady Bombers upset favored Jenks for the state title, but the 800, in which he lacked an entrant, caught his attention. "To me," said Gleason, "that was the feature race of the whole meet.



"It was a hot, hot day," he said. "The wind was strong. That is an outstanding record. It's unbelievable."

Webb placed fifth in the state 800 both as a freshman and sophomore in 2:20.9 1 and 2:17.48. Barber came back later to repeat as 1,600 champion in 5:18.11. In fact, she'd now be a 3-time winner in that event, but as a freshman in 1997 finished

second behind Bartlesville's Stephanie Webb, the sister of Melissa.

The 800 in 5A boys ended up as an oh-what-might-have-been proposition. Last year, Midwest City's Chip Helaire, then a sophomore, blazed home in a state record 1:52.31. Clay

Cosby of Jenks clocked 1:53.71 for second, Derek Sparks of Edmond Memorial did 1:55.82 for fifth and DeJuan Davis of Tulsa East Central, a 2-time 4A champ, posted 1:55.99 in last season's success.

That foursome figured to be in the 1999 Class 5A field. But Helaire and Cosby were absent, their speed reduced by hobbling injuries.

Helaire sprained a hamstring anchoring the 1,600 relay at the Moore Invitational the final week of March. Cosby, state 5A cross-country champion, was sidelined just before the regional with a stress fracture in his foot.

The only state action

for Helaire and Cosby was in the 3,200 relay. Cosby anchored Jenks home a winner for a vital 20 points (the Trojans won the team title by 1 3). Helaire ran a 2:02 to help Midwest City place

fourth in the relay, four-plus seconds behind

Sparks won the 800 tered-down in 1:55.35 and Davis placed fifth. Finishing second was Joey McNair of Bartlesville, who also won a silver medal in the 3,200 and bronze in the 1,600.

second over-all state record was broken in the big-school fi-

nals when Jenks senior Emily Waibel skimmed over the 300 low hurdles in 42.78. It rubbed out the 15-year-old record of 43.03 by Edmond's Judy Williams. That year (1984) was the inaugural season of the event on the girls program.

Class 5A produced two first-ever state team champions in the Jenks boys and Midwest City girls. Ardmore, a double winner in 4A, is an old hand at achieving track success, the boys winning their sixth title and the girls their seventh, all since 1980.

Class 5A Boys

It figured as a team fight that any of a

half-dozen schools could win, it was exactly that with gold medals spread among II different schools.

Defending champion Midwest City crowned the most champions (three), but troubled by injury and faulty baton handling, the Bombers wound up fourth in the team race with 49'/ points.

The Jenks Trojans used 40 relay points, Jason Beckstrom's 200 victory and a 2-3 finish in the long jump to rack up a championship total of 73. Lawton was runnerup with 60 and Moore placed third with 58. Individually, honors

were spread as never before. Only two of 1998's 13 individual champions qualified for the state meet. Veteran Moore distance runner Chris McWatters, repeated as 3,200 champion and, this time, added the 1,600 title as well, while Eisenhower high jump champ Mike Hardrick had to settle for a tie for third.

Chris McWatters

McWatters, 1999's only double winner, improved his 3,200 time from 9:40.74 to 9:37.34. Last spring, he was nipped by 11-100th of a second in the 1,600 by Moore teammate Jimmy Martinez, but clocked 4:19.82 this year compared to 4:21 44 in '98. He won the state cross-country title last fall.

Stanley Gordon of Del City placed third in the 1998 long jump, but nearly missed a return appearance when he did 21-4.75 in the regional. Given new life as a fourth-place invitee, Gordon spanned 23-7.25 to win the state championship.

Midwest City came nearer to claiming a repeat title than the final scores show. With a healthy Chip Helaire, a potential winner in the 400 and 800, the Bombers might have been slightly ahead of the pack. With proper baton management, Midwest City would have been in the battle anyway.

In the 400 relay preliminaries, the Bombers (owning the year's fastest state-wide time of 42.29) dropped the baton and missed the finals.

In the concluding 1,600 relay, going into the second turn and holding a slight lead, the Bombers' second leg flat dropped or had the baton knocked loose. Zero points. Midwest City winds up 23.5 points behind champion Jenks.

The Bombers did crown individual champions in high jumper Michael Dupree (6-8], shot putter Aaron McConnell (56-6.5) and Chris Nappa in the 100 (10.73).

In winning its first state track title, Steve Patterson's Trojans scored points in half of the 16 events. A big boost was the 14 long jump points earned by the 2-3 placing of Brian Carter and Tyrin Harris, ranked third and fifth in the pre-state 5A standings.

Jenks finished seventh last year with 38 points and managed just 24 the previous season.

With the track success, Jenks teams now have won state championships in nine of 11 boys competitions, including now-abandoned volleyball, and in eight of nine girls sports. The boys

have missed only in basketball and wrestling, the girls only in softball.

Runnerup Lawton won the 400 relay in 42.13, topping Midwest City's best, and bagged 22 points in the hurdles.

Class 4A Boys

Ardmore had to do little more than sweep the three relays, which it did in 41.83, 3:22.39 and 8:16.23, to win its sixth state championship in 14 years and second straight.

But Charles Minkley's Tigers did plenty more to roll up 137'/i points to 88 by runnerup Alms. The Tigers amassed 106 in winning the 1998 title.

Ardmore produced individual winners in quarter miler Mark Downing (48.59) and long jumper Jamaal Moore (22-3.25) and scored in 11 of the 16 events. It was shut out only in the two hurdles, two distance races and pole vault.

Two meet records fell and both of them found homes in Duncan. Demon junior Adam Doiron sailed the discus 173-9, two inches further than onetime, over-all state record-holder Dale Pierce did for Woodward in 1979. Doiron had finished second to another Duncan weight specialist, Lute Croy, last


Not content with his Friday record, Doiron returned Saturday to repeat as state shot champion. He won with a heave of 57-3, a little off last year's 57-8.5.

year, 172-4 to 156-6.

Some word combinations seem to fit together naturally: peanut butter and jelly, ham hock and beans, pole vault and Dial.

For the eighth time, a member of the Dial clan of Stephens County is a state pole vault champion. Duncan senior Josh Dial added to the family tradition by clearing a meet record 17-2. He has won three straight state vaulting

to 17-2.



The 17-2 also is the highest ever accomplished in a state meet in any class, topping the

3A mark of 17-1 by Joe Dial, Josh's uncle, set in 1980.

After failing twice at 17-6.5, Josh had the bar raised to 1 7-10 for his allotted third try. This would break Joe Dial's all-time state and national high school record of 17-9.5, posted in the 1981 Western Heights Invitational.

"I figured if I was going to make it, I might as well make one that is going to count," Josh said. "If I would have done just one little thing right, I would have made it."

Joe Dial, now track coach at Oral Roberts, witnessed Josh's attempt. "I'll tell you what, he

made a heck of a try at it," said Joe. "I've had it (the national record) for almost 20 years. It's time for that thing to go."

Little did Joe Dial know, his record did "go" that very same day at the Texas state high school meet in Austin. Eric Eshbach, a senior from Orangefield, cleared 18-2.25.

The Dial state championship log:

Rex Dial, Marlow, 1969. Joe Dial, Marlow 1978 1979, 1980, 1981.

Josh Dial, Duncan, 1997, 1998, 1999.

All were taught by Dean Dial, state runnerup in the vault for Marlow in 1947 and 1948.

Hurdler Chris Brack thinks 38.75 is ample time to run the 300 intermediates. That's exactly what the Duncan senior did in winning two straight gold medals after finishing fifth in 1997 at 41.09.

Class 4A had a fourth repeat champion and he doesn't even live in Duncan. Tulsa Central's Tywon Herring remained consistent in the high jump. He was second in 1997 at 6-8, first last year at 6-8 and a winner again this year at 6-9.

Three defending champions failed to repeat. Trevor Gillum of Durant was forced to second in the 1,600 by Kevin Hughes (4:33.88 to 4:34.52)

and Western Heights' Phillip Semien and John Anthony Marshall's Hawkins fell a place short in the 3,200 and high hurdles, respectively.

Semien half-second faster than Gillum in the 3,200 last (10:00.27 year 10:00.62), but the Durant distance ace turned the tables this time, 10:18.61 to 10:31.94.

Gillum had placed fourth behind three McGuinness runners in last fall's 4A cross-country. McGuinness was 3A in Julian McClelland

track this spring, finishing as state runnerup to Elk City.

Hankins had to settle for silver this time in the 110 hurdles behind Tristin Fields of Altus, 14.16 to 14.36.

That was the only victory for runnerup Altus, which would have liked more relays and hurdles events. The Bulldogs went 3-2-3 in the relays and 1-3-6 and 2-3-6 in the hurdles for 62 of their 88 points.

Julian McClelland of McAlester joined Doiron as a double winner, taking the 100 in 10.77 and the 200 in 21.88.

MacArthur's Chad Davis made the biggest regional-to-state turn-around by placing second to Hurlon Hamilton of Northwest Classen by a half-second in the 800 state finals after a trailing fourth in his regional.

Class 5A Girls

Based largely on Jenks' impressive numbers in regional qualifying, the Lady Trojans were projected as potential 100-point victors in the state meet.

As an old saying goes, "Figures don't lie, but sometimes liars figure."

Jenks did not win by a hundred. It didn't win at all with Midwest City edging the Trojans, 109.33 to 99.66.

There were two reasons for the huge swing: One - Jenks DID NOT match its top regional mark in 13 of the 15 events it had qualifi-

Two - Midwest City EXCEEDED its regional best in nine of the 11 events it had qualifiers and equaled its performance in another.

The point swing shouldn't have been all that unexpected. Midwest City won a tough regional at Putnam City by 80 points with 202. Jenks won at Catoosa by a margin of 53 with 219.

"We thought we had a good chance," said Midwest City coach David Gleason. "I'm proud of what they all accomplished.'



"I was tickled to death when the officials took the baton from us at the finish line (after the 1,600 relay). Only then I knew for sure we'd won."

Entering the wrap up relay, Midwest City had 89.33 points, Jenks 83.66. So the Bombers needed only to finish one place behind Jenks for the team title. The rivals ran 1-2, Midwest City clocking a season best of 3:57.11, Jenks doing 3:58.04.

The ultimate difference came in the four relays. Jenks had the best regional times in three of them, trailing Del City by one spot in the 800. The Trojans didn't win a baton event, batting 3-4-2-3 for 48 points.

Midwest City didn't have a 3,200 unit but won the 400 and 1,600 relay and finished second to Del City in the 800 as the Mid-Del stranglehold on the sprint relays continued.

Beginning with a Midwest City victory in the 1,600 relay to conclude the 1996 state meet, the Bombers and Eagles have combined to win 10 consecutive sprint relays: Del City 400 in 97 and 98, 800 in 97 and 99, 1,600 in 97 and 98; Midwest City 400 in 99, 800 in 98 and 1,600 in 96 and 99.

Junior Teraneik Crawford was the springboard to Midwest City's 1999 relay success. "She leads off all three relays," Gleason said. "She put us in front in all with a 12 flat, a 24.8 and a 57.10."

On the 400 baton brigade, which lost only once all season when two freshmen were substituted in the Mid-State Conference meet, Crawford is joined by three sophomores — Ilicia Walker, Debbie Barnett and Brittany Anderson.

The 1,600 unit has Crawford, Anderson, senior LaKeesa Williams sophomore Shavonne Johnson.

Brittany Anderson was Midwest City's' lone individual winner, bagging the 100 in 11.98.

She briefly held the over-all state record in the event this season with an 11.64 clocking, only to lose it when Class 4A's Shana Robinson of Tulsa Central ran an electronically timed 11.58 in the Tulsa East Central regional.

Typical of Midwest City's over-achieving was sophomore Candice Milton in the discus. She made the state field as a fourth-place regional finisher at 109-6, then uncorked a 121-7 at state. Shavonne Johnson, another regional fourth, won the state bronze medal in the long jump.

Midwest City has only two seniors on its squad and loses 13.33 state meet points with their graduations. The Lady Bombers won the state indoor championship in February by an 89-81 margin over Owasso.

Individually, state record-setters Melissa Webb of Bartlesville (2:12.38 in the 800) and Emily Waibel of Jenks (42.78 in the 300 hurdles)

obviously stood out (see introductory story).

Waibel swept both hurdles for the second straight year and was third in the highs in 1997 and also third in the long jump that season. She set a new state record at the regionals the week before in the 100's with a 13.70 electronic time.

Other repeat champions were Delisa McClain of Stillwater in the discus, Jessica Linger of Tahlequah in the high jump and Atalie Barber of Jenks in the 1,600.

McClain made a substantial improvement from last year's winning 119-2 to this year's 138-11. In

doing so, she broke a long-standing meet record 137-3 by Rhonda Mitchell of Edmond in 1984, which at the time was the over-all state record. Norman's Laura McCarthy won the shot with a toss of 38-11.75.

Linger medaled for the fourth year in a row. She was fourth in 1996 at 5-0 before reeling off three straight titles, all at 5-6.

Barber, a junior, now has gone 2-1-1 in three metric miles.

Teya Gill did not double or triple as she's done in the past, but won a seventh state individual gold by winning the 200, edging Midwest City's Anderson, 24.75 to 24.92.

Gill won the 100, 200 and 400 at Luther in 1996, the 100 and 200 for the Lions in 1997, then moved to Del City where she's won each sprint once, plus three relay golds.

An upended state champion was Jessica Talton of Broken Arrow. She was going for a third 400 title in a row, but ran second to Alisha Adams of Putnam West, 57.14 to 57.24.

Jamie German of Owasso ran third behind Mustang sisters Wendy and Mindy Scott in last fall's cross-country meet, but she out legged both to win the 3,200. In fact, Owasso's Mary Ryser did too, placing second, a reversal of the pair's regional finish.

Class 4A Girls

From 32 points and an 11th-place finish of a year ago, no 1999 big-school track champion made greater improvement than LeeAnn Musgrove's Ardmore Lady Tigers.

They scored in 13 of the 16 events to roll up 117 points, 42 more than runnerup McAlester, blanked only in the shot and two distance

Much like the Ardmore boys, a relay bonanza keyed

the triumph, three firsts and a second adding up to 76 points. Ardmore won the 400 in 48.72, the 800 in 1:44.17, the 1,600 in 4:02.31 and was second to McAlester in the 3,200, bowing 10:00.19 to 10:03.66.

The Tigers had no individual champions.

sprinter Shana Robinson and Woodward strong-girl Megan Crystal.

Robinson fell a little shy of the over-all state 100 record of 11 .56 she notched in the regional with an 11.77. But that was good enough to erase the meet record of 11.93 by Shavanta Sheet of Altus in 1996.

For good measure, the Central junior came back in the 200 to shoot down another meet record. Her 24.20 just did take a 24.21 by MacArthur's Darlena Morganfield in 1987 off the books.

Crystal repeated as discus champion with a record 142-3 (she did 122-9 a year

ago) and also won the shot with a cast of 42-11.5. Shana Dowdy of Ardmore (1995) owned the former discus mark of 141-11.

Crystal had been even better in the regional with impressive efforts of 144-8 and 43-I. Woodward also picked up eight second-place discus points when Sarah Stinson, only fourth in her regional at 118-2, delivered a 130-8 throw.

The other double victors were Melissa Corlett of Pryor in the 1,600 and 3,200, Robin Hoffman of McAlester in the hurdles and Kala Bowers of Woodward in the high jump and long jump.

Corlett had been runnerup to Amanda Jordan of McGuinness in last fall's 4A cross-country.

Hoffman dropped defending champion Jenny Snider of Bixby to second in the 300 hur-

Kim Thomas of McAlester came close to making it a complete 6-girl double. She repeated as 800 champion, but was bested 58.54 to 59.01 by Sarah Walker of Tulsa Edison in the 400.

Caton Hill of Ada, the 1998 shot winner, improved from 38-5 to 39-8, but placed third.


