

# On Track

Sorry for the shameless plug—again—but it takes subscribers to keep us in business. Every high school library should have a copy—it's a great way to get athletes into the library to read something they're interested in and it gives them a chance to see their names in print. Here's another plug: the Steve Prefontaine movie "Without Limits" opens in Tulsa Friday at the AMC Southroads 20 Theater, 41<sup>st</sup> and Yale. There's an ad in this issue but if the times aren't available at press time, you can call 622-9544 to get them.

Karla Shahan of Tulsa successfully lobbied Warner Brothers to bring the movie—a Tom Cruise/Robert Towne production about Steve Prefontaine starring Billy Cruddup and Donald Sutherland, as Pre's coach, Oregon legend Bill Bowerman—to Tulsa. It will hit Tulsa the night before the Tulsa Run and the state meet, so the timing is excellent.

"Without Limits" is the story about two very different men who shared a pure, unadulterated passion for running and a commitment to being the very best they could be. Each rose to greatness: each changed the other's life.

The film is written by Academy Award-winning filmmaker Robert Towne and Kenny Moore, one of Pre's closest friends and a world-class runner and critically lauded writer for *Sports Illustrated* and other publications.

Prefontaine's fights against the AAU were eventually taken up by his contemporaries, who, inspired by his words, ultimately revolutionized amateur athletics in America. During the 1970s, the AAU controlled track and field competition as well as other sports including wrestling and swimming; they determined which athletes could compete against one another and under what conditions. Runner who wanted to arrange their own opportunities to compete against the best felt powerless. Prefontaine, with his relentless drive and will, fought doggedly against the disempowerment of runners and other AAU athletes.

Mary Decker Slaney, a former Olympic runner who met and trained with Pre when both were teenagers, vividly remembers his emotional approach to his sport. "Pre had, among some people, the reputation for being arrogant, but I knew him and that's not the way he seemed to me. He had a great passion for running, and he was generous with his time, consideration and support to people who shared that passion. He had tremendous heart."

"I'm glad that this movie was made, because it will introduce Pre to young athletes, and because it shows someone who became a success on a singular, personal level. He was one of the best."

I'm planning on going—hope everyone else is too.

The next issue, which is the last of the cross country season, will be dated around Nov. 16 in order to be able to get the Arkansas, Kansas, Oklahoma All-Star Meet results in. We will also try to get the results of both the AAU and USATF state meets in as well.

# 1998 Cross Country State Meet Preview

The 1998 Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association's 1998 State Cross Country Championships will be held Saturday, October 31, at Tulsa's Oral Roberts University. The first race begins at 11:00 a.m. with the Class A Boys and the last race is at 3:30 p.m. with the 5A Girls. The A-3A awards assembly is set for 2:30 p.m. and the 4A-5A assembly at 4:30 p.m., with both being held across the street from ORU at the Hilton Hotel. Admission to the meet will be collected again with proceeds to help defray expenses associated with the meet.

Regional meets were again held at four sites—Norman Reaves Park, Tulsa Mohawk Park, Elk City and Tishomingo—with a total of 14 teams qualifying for the state meet in each class, and the top seven non-team qualifying individuals. The weather was great at all sites this year, compared to last year's stormy and snowy meets. All four sites were new for regional competition.

The top ranked teams all captured regional titles with the exception of the Elk City boys, who lost a sixth runner tie-breaker to Anadarko in the 3A West Regional. The McGuinness boys had the largest margin of victory again, with a 54-point bulge over runnerup Durant, while less than a point separated all four of the Class 3A meets as well as two of the Class 2A meets.



The Irish were the only school to capture double regional wins and coach Dave Morton's runners will be gunning for their fourth straight double win at the state meet—a feat never accomplished in Oklahoma. Last year McGuinness tied Jenks' record of three straight double wins and there seems to be little in the way of the "Quadruple Double" for the Irish this year.

The top times at Tulsa went to Jenks defending 5A champion Clay Cosby with a 15:38 and Plainview freshman Jesse Gordon with an 11:29 in 3A. At Norman, McGuinness defending 4A champion senior Kevin Connolly

turned in a 15:54 while teammate defending champion Amanda Jordan ran a scalding 10:54. At Elk City, Anadarko's Jesus Rubio clocked a 16:42 in 3A and Laverne's Kristen Barby got a 12:20 in A. At Tishomingo Victory Christian's Jason DiMauro ran a 16:31 in 2A and Warner's defending champion Miley Turnbull ran 11:49 in 2A.

There are a few shakeups in the final rankings of top teams and a few top runners that didn't appear in regional results but may still be able to compete at state.

There are seven defending champions and three former champions in the field that will include 65 returning All-Staters. Only three defenders enter the meet ranked No. 1 and one former champ while only three of the defending team champions carry a No. 1 ranking into the state meet.


Here is a class by class rundown of the meet, in the order of their races.

## A Boys

### (11:00 a.m.)

Oklahoma Christian School turned in a good performance at the pre-state meet at ORU to take over the No. 1 slot and then came back and dispatched their top contender, Velma-Alma, at the Tishomingo regional. The Saints, under new head coach Martin Schnetzler, have had their sites on the state championship since the beginning of the season and have four runners in the top ten. Velma-Alma will be their toughest competition while defending champion Hydro was decimated by graduation and the move of defending champion Herbie Pebeashy to Weatherford.

Carnegie captured the Elk City regional with Beaver in the runnerup spot but the

western teams just don't seem to have the horses this year.

Velma-Alma's former champion ('95) Mylo Miller moved back into the No. 1 slot with his regional win over Oklahoma Christian's Taylor Miles and Steve May. Tyrone's Nick Cates took the individual win at Elk City while the Saint's Erin Rooney and Ben Craycraft, along with Carnegie's Lucian Bliss, will be looking to crack the top five. Rounding out the top ten are Hydro's Michael Buckmaster, Carnegie's Jean Shackelford and Boise City's Andy Hedgewood.

## 2A Boys

### (11:30 a.m.)

Chisholm, Riverside and defending champion Dickson are in a close battle for the hardware here with the Longhorns of coach Joe Spurlock getting a slight nod over the rest on the basis of their narrow one-point win over Riverside at the Elk City

### 3A Boys

#### (12:00 noon)

This race, along with the 3A girls, looks to be one of the tightest and most hotly contested divisions in the meet. Defending champion Elk City carried the No. 1 ranking all season but lost it to Anadarko when the Warriors nipped them on a sixth runner tie breaker at their own regional. Little Axe, always a state meet contender by the end of the season, is not far behind and any one of these three could be on the podium at the end of the day. This race could easily come down to the sixth runner as less than ten points separate the group based on pointing out individual rankings.

horns were also the top 2A team at the pre-state meet and have two runners in the top ten.

This will be one of the better individual battles of the meet with Alva's No. 1 ranked Ryan Bickerstaff going against Victory Christian's Jason DiMauro, who set track records last spring at 1600 and 3200 meters. Bickerstaff won their last meeting at the pre-state meet. Chisholm's Steve Sawyer, Dickson's Jerry Cook and Riverside's Daniel Davis will be there to keep the pressure on with Bobby Chapman, Prague, Alex Ratcliff, Dickson, Jerame Dunkin Chisholm, Jonathan Burnett, Victory Christian and Jim

face a serious challenge from perennial panhandle power Laverne, who failed to field a full team last year in spite of several outstanding individuals. Canton holds down the No. 3 spot with Hydro a serious challenge for the third place medals. Sallisaw Central is a newcomer to the top of the heap here and is looking to crack the top five in their first year of competition.

Individually, the top spot in this class has changed hands on almost a weekly basis. Healdton's Sonya Peterson gets the nod for No. 1 on the basis of her regional win over McCurry and Thacker while Laverne's Kristen Barby and Canton freshman Beth Hooten both have the capability of winning the whole thing. Velma-Alma's Cindy Fuller and Tiffany Tilley, Stratford's Krista Rowe, Bennington's Lindsey McNeal and Tonkawa's Nikki Norwood round out the top ten.

### 2A Girls (1:00 p.m.)

This is another one of those barn burner races. The top spot has shifted around a bit during

the season but in the end it is surprising Tishomingo that gets a slight nod to be the champion. Coach Charles Wyatt's runners won their own regional by one point over Warner while defending champion Lexington won Tulsa regional but an injury to Amanda Wedel has put them in a challenger role instead of favorite. Warner is a force to be contended with as well, finishing just one point behind Tishomingo on the Indians home course. Lindsay and Chisholm round out the top five but neither has the horses to make a run at the championship.

Defending champion, Warner senior Miley Turnbull, has held on to the No. 1 ranking all season and has two wins over 3A champ Carrie McFall of Cascia Hall, now down in 2A. Purcell's Amy Dunaway won the Elk City regional over Lindsay's Marda Traylor with Dickson's Lindsey Hicks a distant third at Tishomingo. Lexington's Tamara Broome and Audrey Lewis, Watonga's Katy Hartfield, Tishomingo's Tonya Heffington and Dee Dee Kaiser round out the top ten.

### 3A Girls

#### (1:30 p.m.)

This could be the closest race of the day, with any one of four teams solidly capable of pulling off the win. Plainview gets an ever so slight nod over defending champ Little Axe, based on their one-point win over the Indians in the Tulsa regional. Marlow edged Elk City on a sixth runner tie breaker at Elk City but the Elks were missing their top runner, Amy Kilhoffer, who was sitting out with a muscle pull and will be back for state. This one could also easily come down to a sixth runner tie breaker and is my choice to the top race of the day to watch.

Individually, no one in this class has

come close to Plainview freshman Jesse Gordon, who is probably the No. 2 runner in the whole state behind McGuinness sophomore Amanda Jordan. Little Axe's Susan Morford was the runnerup at Tulsa with Plainview's Jacie Jones and Aja Clark third and fourth, respectively. Elk City has Ashlee Maberry and Amber Bell, as well as Kilhoffer, while Little Axe's Kathy Russell and Marlow's Ashley Bracken round out the top ten.

Morton's boys to set the stage for the girls to claim the "Quadruple Double" later in the day.

Individually, McGuinness senior Kevin Connolly will be going for this third title, hoping to tie Edmond Memorial's Mark Thompson as the only two runners to accomplish this feat. He is undefeated in Oklahoma this year and was a convincing winner at the Chile Pepper in Fayetteville where he ran a 15:24 on the University of Arkansas course. Weatherford's Herbie Pebeashy, the Class A champ for the past two years, missed most of the season but stayed with Connolly for two thirds of the race at regionals, coming in a strong second ahead of Durant's Trevor Gillum, McGuinness' Brett Lowry and Duncan's Jerry Gallagher. Ft. Gib-

son's Scott Caldwell is back to lead the second five, along with Durant's Jesse Boydston, McGuinness' John Hamilton, Guthrie's Nick Meyer and Kelley's Ryan Adams.

#### **4A Boys (2:00 p.m.)**

McGuinness has been one of the powerhouse teams in the state for the past several years with 23-100 and 23-91 wins over Guthrie at the state meet the last two years while claiming ten of top ten individual places in those same years. After going one-two-three last year the Irish have only three ranked in the top ten and it is beginning to look like it might be a race again, at least in the near future. The Bluejays took the Tulsa regional by a huge margin over Edison but it would still take a small miracle for them to unseat the defending champs. Look for Morton's boys to set the stage for the girls to claim the "Quadruple Double" later in the day.

Moore's Chris McWatter is unbeaten all season but the competition has been getting closer and closer. Defending champ Clay Cosby of Jenks got off to a slow start but is obviously back in top form, giving McWatters a close race at the pre-state meet and winning the regional with the best time of the weekend. Broken Arrow's Chris Wright was ranked No. 2 going into regionals but apparently got sick, dropping out of the top echelon but certainly capable of returning at state. Moore's Matt Hart, along with Edmond Memorial duo Derek Sparks and Aaron Peterman round out the top five. The rest of the top ten are Mustang's Brad Mixon, Bartlesville's Ryan Starr, Edmond North's Sean Leigh, Sapulpa's Derek Smith and Midwest City's Eric Delgado.

#### **5A Boys (2:30 p.m.)**

Edmond Memorial has held the top ranking all season in spite of a few scares. Coach David Sammons Bulldogs aren't invincible, but they certainly have a solid grip on the top spot. Jenks won the Tulsa regional convincingly and looks to be the only team that could mount a serious challenge. Mustang and Moore were separated by only a point at the Norman regional and will battle with Broken Arrow for the third place medals.

This will be one of the best individual races of the day. The No. 1 spot has been held by three girls so far and there have to be at least five contenders for the gold medal. Mustang's Mindy Scott won the Norman regional with sister Wendy second and defending champion Summer Suchy of Westmoore third. Owasso freshman Mary Ryser captured the Tulsa regional while Westmoore's Camille Herron, No. 1 for most of the season, sat out the regional with a stress fracture in her foot but will be back in action for the state meet.

The second five has Jamie German, Owasso, Lindsey Hughes-'96 champ—and Allison Franklin, Westmoore, Atalie Barber, Jenks and Mary Hill, Sapulpa.

could also break the record for the most consecutive wins by notching their seventh in a row—tenth total—thus eclipsing Union's record of six, set between 1976 and 1981. Weatherford will have their hands full with Kelley—winner of the Tulsa regional—and Guthrie as the three teams fight for the second and third place awards.

Undefeated for two seasons in Oklahoma and the surrounding states, defending champion McGuinness sophomore Amanda Jordan is in a league of her own. She clocked a 10:54 at the Norman regional after an awesome 11:03 the week before at the Chile Pepper and turned a course record 11:34 at the pre-state meet. She set new state records at both 1600 and 3200 meters last track season and the only question seems to be: can she stay healthy and keep it up?

The rest of the top ten has changed regularly through the season with Pryor's Abby Nutter winner of the Tulsa regional getting the nod for the No. 2 slot. Two-time top five finisher Maggie Kelley of McGuinness, Guthrie's Shavon Young and Irish junior Lindsey Peterson round out the top five. Tracy Kmetz, Kelley, Jennifer Shafer, Weatherford, Stormy Deaton, Grove, Amber Willis Durnat and Melissa Corlett, Pryor are the second five.

#### **5A Girls (3:30 p.m.)**

The last race of the day will be worth waiting for. Westmoore is the odds on favorite to win, having one of the best teams in the nation and certainly the top team in Oklahoma. Coach Laura Clay's Jaguars have held the top ranking since the beginning of the season and it doesn't look like there is anyone else with a real chance. The battle for second and third will see Owasso, Mustang and Moore duking it out for the hardware.


