On Track

The 1998 State Cross Country championships at Oral Roberts University on October 31st were again a peak experience. Over one thousand runners in five classes competed and there were some really good races, both team and individual. I do wish that the OSSAA would either get serious about charging admission or just drop the idea. If you were there, you know what I mean. Here's an idea: let every school sell admission tickets to their parents and fans and split the income 50/50 between the school and the OSSAA. This would work out as a fund-raiser for the school and the OSSAA couldn't help but raise more money than they do now.

In the cross country advisory committee meeting the week following the meet the coaches voted to recommend splitting the state meet into two meets with 2A and A being held the week before. This would allow the smallest schools to get their athletes into basketball by Nov. 1, which is when most of them start playing. This isn't a new idea but I do think it has merit. The meet has grown so much that it is really a chore to put it on and it really taxes the people who have to run it to be there so long. The OSSAA board of directors must vote to approve the recommendation—I'll let you know what happens in the next issue.

Speaking of the next issue. It will be dated February 28, 1999 and will cover everything that happens between now and then, including the Foot Locker regional and national cross country meets as well as all the indoor activity—the OSSAA allows teams to compete in three indoor meets. We will also begin our preview of the outdoor season. TEAM REPORTS will go out in January—coaches, please take the time to fill these out and return promptly and if you are not a member of the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association, it is not too late to join—see Coaches Corner in this issue for all the information.

This issue is getting out a bit later than I had hoped for. We held for the results of the Oklahoma vs. Arkansas dual held in Fayetteville, Ark., last weekend, but the results have been really hard to get. I do know that Oklahoma really dominated the meet, claiming most of the top places with the McGuinness duo of Kevin Connolly and Amanda Jordan taking the individual honors. In a much anticipated match up, Connolly beat undefeated 5A champ Chris McWatters by about 17 seconds in their only head to head meeting this year. Hopefully, by the time we finish putting this issue together, the full results will have appeared.

The movie about Steve Prefontaine was still showing at press time in Tulsa (AMC Southroads, 41st and Yale—see ad in last issue) and reviews by runner friends have been superb. "It was phenomenal, an absolute must-see for any athlete or prognosticator of the sport. If you don't see it while you can, you will be sorry," according to Tulsa track fanatic (and OT&FN helper) George Hall. George goes on to say the Jenks boys team attended the show on Friday, and then the following day beat the No. 1 ranked Edmond Memorial team by one point to win the state championship. Coincidence? He doesn't think so. The inspiration from the film was just enough to get that one extra point.

1998 Cross Country State Championships

TULSA—The weather was great, even a bit warm at times, as the 1998 Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association's cross country state championships were contested at Oral Roberts University on October 31. Over 1,000 runners in five classes competed for team and individual championships and spectators crowded every nook and cranny of the course. The course was a bit soft from recent rains which had a dampening effect on times compared to the ones turned in at the pre-state meet a few weeks earlier.

There were a couple of one-point wins to spice up the day but the biggest upset in recent years came in the last race of the day as Mustang upset Westmoore 63-78 for the 5A girls title. The Broncos of coach Mike McGarry combined for an average team time of 12:22, the fastest ever on the state meet course, and easily topped the Power Poll and improved on Westmoore's 12:24 from last year.

Jenks beat top ranked Edmond Memorial by one point in 5A boys to capture their 10th title, breaking the tie with Edmond Memorial at 9. Less than one second separated the top three teams in the final Power Poll with the Trojans edging out the Bulldogs on combined points and McGuinness in third. The average team times at the state meet were 17:01 for Edmond Memorial, 17:01.4 for Jenks and 17:01.6 for McGuinness.

McGuinness continued their total domination of 4A, setting a new record with their fourth straight "double-double" (boys-girls) win. The Irish girls set new records with their seventh straight and 10th overall team titles while the boys grabbed their sixth in seven years.

Irish senior Kevin Connolly captured his third state championship, only the second runner in Oklahoma to accomplish this feat behind Edmond Memorial's Mark Thompson who won in 1994-95-96. Moore senior Chris McWatters had the fastest boys time of the day with a 16:04 while McGuinness sophomore Amanda Jordan claimed the girls with a 11:44.

Here the class-by-class recap, in the order they were run:

A Boys

Oklahoma Christian was gunning for this race since the beginning of the season, knowing that last year's top three teams had moved up to class 2A. The Saints of coach Martin Schnetzler came through with a 17-point win over runnerup Velma-Alma, putting four runners in the top ten. Oklahoma Christian came into the meet ranked No. 1 after taking over the top spot following a good performance at the pre-state meet and a solid win over the Comets in the Tishomingo regional. Carnegie nailed down the third place medals while Beaver and Oklahoma Bible rounded out the top five.

Velma-Alma senior Mylo Miller closed out his cross country career with his second state title, the other coming as a freshman in 1995. He duelled with Oklahoma Christian's Taylor Miles and Steve May before securing the gold with a six-second victory.

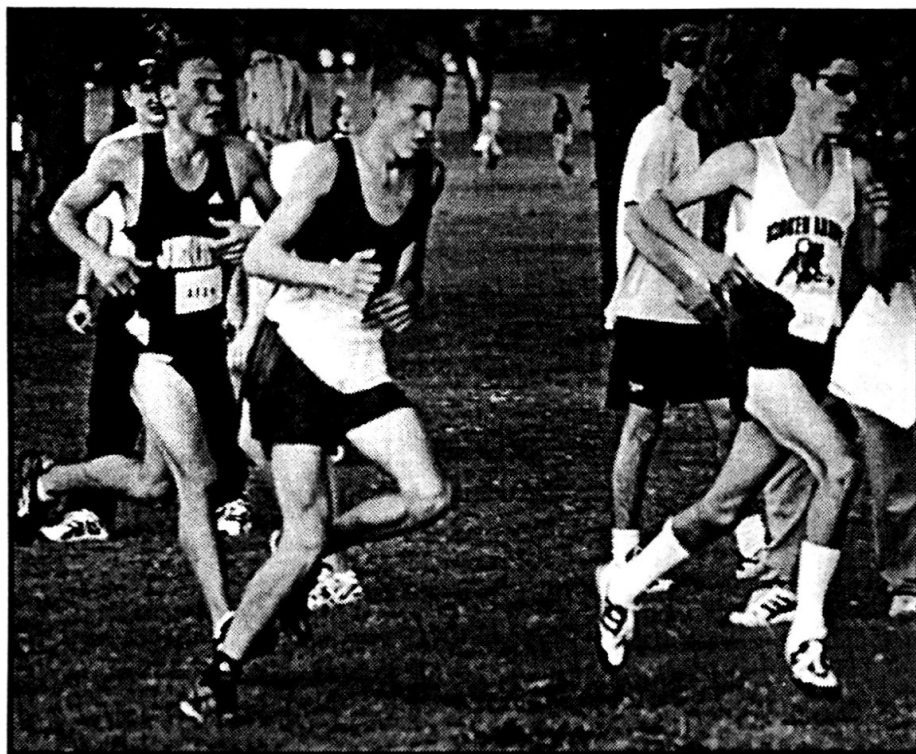
