

Five Champions Return to Defend Titles In 1999

Five of the ten Cross Country State Champions are returning to defend their titles this year with two former champions in the field as well. With 60 returning All-Staters back, their task won't be easy. Cross country is growing in popularity, with more and more schools competing every year. Better athletes are taking up the sport, and the drive and commitment to be the best is causing the sport to become more competitive every year. The returning champions are: Beth Hooten - Canton (A); Jesse Gordon - Plainview (2A, 3A champ last year); Amanda Jordan - McGuinness (4A - going for number three); Steve Sawyer - Chisholm (2A); and Patrick McGuire - Plainview (2A, 3A champ last year).

Oklahoma will have two State Championships this year. Classes A and 2 A will compete at Gordon Cooper Vo-Tech in Shawnee on the 23rd of October, while classes 3A-4A-5A will compete at Oral Roberts on the 30th of October. Regionals will be at two sites for each meet the week before the state meet.



5 A Boys

Edmond Memorial will be shooting for state championship number ten. They would have accomplished this feat in '98, but they lost their championship bid by a mere point. Edmond Memorial looks good early on and Jenks is right on their heels once again, trying to defend the title they stole from Edmond Memorial last year. Sapulpa is also looking good enough to possibly put themselves in contention for the title.



In this class there are many new individuals with Edmond Memorial's, Brady Schmeideberg and Marc Schumate heading the list. The loss of Kevin Connolly hurt McGuinness, but they still have the depth to win a fifth straight State Championship, and seventh in the last eight years. Pushing McGuinness will be Clay Tarter's Guthrie Bluejays. Guthrie could be recognized as the most consistent cross-country program in the State. Since 1983, Clay Tarter's Bluejays have finished no worse than third at State. That is an awesome accomplishment.

Individually, Brett Lowry gets the top nod, but this could be a class that will see the leader board change throughout the year.






