

RECRUITING: St. Gregory's University in Shawnee established a new track and cross country program this year under former Little Axe coach Barry Klein and they have been doing admirably well so far this season. Coach Klein has already signed three girls for next year's team: Susie Morford, Little Axe; Natalie Henry, Moore; and Carmen Zamora, Weatherford.

RANKINGS: the team and individual rankings in this issue were compiled from meets received by noon on Tuesday, September 28. As usual, there are still a number of meets that don't bother to send their results - especially in the eastern half of the state - which means some deserving runners don't get the recognition they deserve and some teams might not either. We could really use someone to take the responsibility of gathering results from this area, especially Tulsa, so, if you can help, give me a call.

TRIATHLON STARS: Alva's brother-sister duo of Ryan and Sarah Bickerstaff competed in the U.S.A. Triathlon Nationals held in St. Joseph, Missouri September 25 with Ryan knocking down the No. 1 spot and Sarah taking sixth in the junior elite divisions. Ryan was second in the state cross country meet last year and is currently ranked No. 3 in 2A boys. I was one of his coaches a few years ago at the Junior Olympic triathlon camp in Roswell, New Mexico.

Mid-Season Review

Teams Prepare for Two State Meets

How exciting! The 1999 cross country season has made it to the half way mark. By now everybody should have a few races under their belt and be aware of their competition individually, as well as team wise. This is the time of year that coaches look forward to. The competition is heating up, you know about where your team stands against the competition in your class, and as coach, you are now trying to sharpen your athletes mentally and physically so they will be able to compete at their best when the state meet rolls around. By the way, concerning the state championships, Oklahoma will have two state meets this year. The small classes A and 2A will compete at the Gordon Cooper Vo-Tech campus in Shawnee on October 23, while the large schools 3A, 4A, and 5A will compete on the Oral Roberts University campus in Tulsa on October 30. This is a new format for Oklahoma cross country, but with the sport growing and the heat

of competition, the state meets will be as exciting as ever.

Edmond Memorial is leading the way in 5A boys, with victories at Marlow, Sapulpa, UCO, and Mustang. David Sammons has produced some really good teams over the years, (9 state championships), and he has this team improving every week. Close behind, are the Jenks Trojans.

They are running really well and are coming off of an excellent third place finish at Southern Methodist University against some quality competition from Texas. Jenks is also the defending state champions. Also improving every week and staying in the hunt are Sapulpa and Mustang. Individually, Joey McNair of Bartlesville leads this class, but will be pushed by his teammate Blake Culp and Brady Schmiedeberg of Edmond Memorial.

In class 4A boys, the McGuinness boys are slowly coming together. They faired well in Dallas at the SMU Invitational and looked true to

form at the Putnam City North Invitational. This class has some new faces at the top and is a lot more balanced than in the past few years. Harrah has moved into the No. 2 spot with an outstanding showing at the OBU Invitational, but Bixby, Edmonson, and Guthrie are oh so close. For a change, this could be an exciting team race. Individually, McGuinness' Brett Lowry still holds down the No. 1 spot, but No. 2 runner Courtney Vasek of

Harrah gave Lowry a run for his money at the Putnam North Invitational.

In 3A boys, Lynn Bellamys' Anadarko Warriors are still holding on to the No. 1 spot but defending champion Elk City is closing in on them. One point victories seem to be common for these two teams. The Elks ended the '98 season with a one-point victory over the Warriors at the state meet but the Anadarko beat Elk City by one point at the Lexington Invitational recently. Individually there are a number of runners that could win the state title, but for now Elk City's Travis Johnson holds the No. 1 spot.

Class 2A is a virtual battlefield as Watonga and Plainview have duked it out twice this year with the Eagles getting the edge both times. Don't count Chisholm out either, they are improving every week. The individual race will be just as exciting with two defending state champions battling each other for one title. Plainview's Patrick McGuire, 3A state champion of '98 and Chisholm's Steve Sawyer, 2A state champion of '98 haven't met this year but both are running very impressive up to this point. They could possibly meet at the pre-state meet at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa on October 9. I can't wait to see this one, take your pick.

Class A is a growing class and each year it gains strength in talent. Carnegie still gets the No. 1 spot for now, but Beaver, Oklahoma Christian, and Velma-Alma are closing the gap. Carnegie's Lucian Bliss is the No. 1 runner and is still looking strong.

Now it is time to talk about the girls.

Class 5A is led by the Lady Trojans of Jenks. Martha O'Rourke is entering her fourth year as the cross-country coach, and will be trying to prepare her girls to win their first state championship under her leadership. They competed at SMU in Dallas and look really tough in finishing second to a strong Texas team with McGuinness a close third. They are definitely the

team to beat. Moore still holds the No. 2 position but Bartlesville is improving quickly and the Owasso Tigers are strong as well. Atalie Barber of Jenks holds the No. 1 spot and pushing her will be her teammate Brianna McLeod, Bartlesville teammate's Amy Webb and Ashley Enderlin, and Owasso's Jamie German.

In class 4A, the Lady Irish are looking to break their own record of seven consecutive state championships by taking an unprecedented eighth. David Morton does an excellent job of preparing his runners mentally and physically to win. A double victory for both the boys and girls at state would reward Coach Morton with his 19th state cross-country championship since 1984, a tremendous accomplishment. Grove is holding down No. 2 but will be pushed by Kelley. Individually, McGuinness two-time defending champion Amanda Jordan is healthy and back in her old form. With a victory at SMU in Dallas, she looks better than ever. Enough said.

Class 3A is going to be a war. The Little Axe Indians are the defending state champions, Marlow returns six of seven runners from last year's team, and Elk City has been on the verge of winning it all. Marlow held the No. 1 spot until Elk

City romped to a 30-point victory over the Lady Outlaws at the OBU Invitational. Elk City looks tough, but the Indians and Outlaws will be ready for battle on October 30. Individually, Jaicee Herron of Elk City holds on to the No. 1 position.

Plainview is leading class 2A with Watonga gaining slowly. Jerry Naylor of Plainview knows how to produce winners and he will be determined to get his girls back on the winners podium for the first time since 1995. Jesse Gordon of Plainview leads the individual race followed by freshman Kimbri Lettkeman of Watonga.

Velma-Alma has won the last four state championships in class A. But, while it will be tough for them to win a fifth title, it's not impossible. Standing in the way is current No. 1 Beaver and Canton could be a factor with Beth Hooten, the defending state champion and the current No. 1 individual.

After going through the classes, I am in awe. Cross-country is growing and is a very exciting sport. I encourage everyone to go to the state meets in Shawnee on October 23, and at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa on October 30. You won't be disappointed. Also, the OSU Jamboree in Stillwater will host the top high school teams in the state as will the Oral Roberts University Oklahoma Classic in Tulsa on October 9.




