The 1999 3A-4A-5A State Cross Country Championships were held at Oral Roberts University on October 30th again and I really think it was the worst weather I can remember at the state meet in eight years. This even takes into account the 22 degree day with snow in 1993 which, was by most standards, pretty bad. However, since my daughter Jessica won her second state crown that day, I kind of have rosy remembrances. Anyway, this year the drizzle never seemed to stop and course was an absolute mess - a true European style race. Not to mention the fact that it was almost impossible to sell copies of *Oklahoma Track & Field News* without getting them completely soaked.

Another thing I wasn't too crazy about—in spite of an initial favorable feeling last year—was the split of the meet into big and little schools. In years past it was a true spectacle to witness five classes competing on the same course under the same conditions. I suppose it's easier to put on a meet with fewer races and it gets the small school girls out for basketball (which is the real reason behind it) but I just can't buy into it being better for the athletes. I don't hold out much hope for the O.S.S.A.A. reverting to the old way but it's certainly the way I'd rather see it.

This issue is getting out really late—really, really late—due in part to waiting for the results of the Oklahoma vs. Arkansas All-Star dual held in Fayetteville, Arkansas November 11. Since this is the last issue that covers cross country I hate to not include these results, especially for seniors who have hopes of competing in college. Anyway, the next issue will be dated February 28, 2000 and will cover everything that happens between now and then, including the Foot Locker regional and national cross country meets as well as all the indoor meets—the O.S.S.A.A. allows teams to compete in three indoor meets. We will also begin our preview of the outdoor season. TEAM REPORTS will go out in January—coaches, please take the time to fill these out and return promptly and if you are not a member of the Oklahoma track Coaches Association, it is not too late to join—see the Coaches Corner in this issue for all the information.

I owe Jimmy Brackeen a big thanks for all his help during the cross country season and I hope he hangs around to do the same thing for track. I remember his comments after putting together the first set of rankings last September—"I didn't realize how much work this is!" Well, that was only the beginning. Fortunately, we have a solid group of coaches and interested fans who help out with the track listings so it's only a full time job for one person. We're spreading the load around and hopefully we can keep the *OT&FN* coming your way.


1999 3A-5A State Meet

What an enjoyle state championship. I was le to attend my first state cross-country championship as a spectator and not as a coach and it was fun. I was le to watch all the races and actually enjoy them, it was great.

The morning of the race was wet and a little misty, but it was still a great day for the 3A-4A-5A O.S.S.A.A. State High School Cross-Country Championships on October 30 at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa. Watching the runners compete and cross the finish line covered in mud reminded of me European Cross-Country.

Growing up, I remember reading running magazines and it always seemed like the Europeans had to race in the mud. The World Cross-Country Championships were always muddy, but that's just

What an exciting race! Elk City held the No. 1 ranking for most of the season and was le to hold off a serious challenge by runnerup

Marlow to claim its first girls cross country State Championship.

With Plainview dropping down to 2A this year, it looked to be a two team race between coach Mark Heard's Elks and the Outlaws. Throughout the season Elk City dominated the Outlaws, but the Marlow tried to prove different by going out quicker and making it a close race early. Through the first mile it was really close and looked as though Marlow would be le to pull off the upset, but in the end it was all Elk City as they put four runners in the top six to romp to a 20-point vic-

tory. Marlow and Elk City accounted for ten of the first twelve runners to cross the finish line.

Individually, it was a three person race between Susan Morford of Little Axe, Jaicee Herren of Elk City, and Lora Loy of Jay. In the end, Susan Morford came out on top and was le to win her first state title, while ending her high school career as a four time All-Stater. Herren finish second and Hoy was third. "When I was a freshman I got ninth then I was sixth and second last year," said Morford. "I said I would win in my senior year and I was striving for it."

3 A Boys

This was a tough race to pick, with three outstanding teams at the top. Elk City had won state the past three years, Anadarko had been ranked No. 1 most of the season and Little Axe is a team with an outstanding tradition.

Elk City looked good up front with Travis Johnson winning the individual state championship and his teammate Chris McHone finishing second with Little Axe's Chuck Staton in third. "It was a good race on the back side," said John-

son. "A bunch of us, out four guys, ran close together with spikes hitting all over the place. It was tight." Unfortunately for the Elks, they didn't have the depth needed to take the title again.

It came down to a two team race between Anadarko and Little Axe, with both teams putting three in the top ten. It was close throughout the race and looked like either team could win. In the end, Little Axe gave first year coach Shandi Trent his first state championship and Anadarko brought home a state runner-up trophy

for the third year in a row.

4 A Girls

Jordan of McGuinness won her third straight title with the fastest time of the day, leading Dave Morton's Irish to their eighth straight team and individual title. McGuinness dominated

the race with the lowest score in recent memory, placing five runners in the top seven and totaling a low score of 19 points to runnerup Grove's 111. Jordan was followed across the finish line by teammates Maggie Kelley in second and Christy Rogge in third. Tresy Ross of Carl Albert (fourth) and Guymon's Jamie Lucero (fifth) kept the Irish from recording a perfect score.

The Irish game plan was to send Jordan out fast. "I kind of died," said Jordan of her finish. "But that was going to happen. I was supposed to sprint at the beginning and take out all the girls that wanted to sprint to get them tired so our

teammates could get up there. And it worked."

The race here was for second and Grove was le to finish ahead of Edison and Kelley. This allowed Grove to bring home the state runner-up trophy, after finishing second to Kelley at last weeks East Regional.

4 A Boys

The Irish weren't as dominating this year as in years past, and the Eagles of Tulsa Edison were improving throughout the season and hoping to upset McGuinness. But in the end the Irish prevailed. This led to the McGuinness boys winning their fifth consecutive state championship,

giving coach Morton and McGuinness their fifth consecutive double boys and girls win.

The Irish were also le to keep a hold on the individual title with Brett Lowry winning his first state championship after a runner-up finish to teammate Kevin Connolly last season. Capitol Hill's Marco Jimenez was second with Edison's Michael Dixon third and Harrah's Courtney Vasek fourth

In the final team standings Edison finished in the runner-up spot, while Duncan edged Harrah out for third place.

This was an exciting race! Martha O'Rourke's Lady Trojans were ranked No. 1 all season. Laura Clay's Lady Jaguars were healthy and improving every week. They had upset on their mind.

Camille Herron of Westmoore led through the first mile until she was overtaken by Jenks freshman Brianna McLeod. McLeod ended up becoming the new state champion and also helped lead her Jenks team to a 15-point victory and their first state championship since 1994. Westmoore ran super by finishing runner-up and beating the Moore Lions who finished ahead of them at the West Regional the week before. This class is loaded with lots of individual talent and is always full of surprises. This was a very competitive race.

The Bulldogs did it. They won their tenth state championship and avenged a one-point loss to Jenks last year. This was the most exciting race of the day! David Sammons told his boys they better not start out fast. He wanted them to run a controlled, even-paced race.

Early on, it looked like they might not be le to do it, with Jenks running the first one and a half miles way up front. As the race progressed the Bulldogs just got stronger and stronger, and eventually ran off with the title. Their strategy worked perfect. In the race for second, Jenks faded badly and was overtaken by Mustang for the runner-up trophy.

Individually, this was no surprise. Joey
McNair of Bartlesville did as he has all year. He
led from start to finish to become the new 5A
state champion with the fasted boys time of the
day. "I was surprised that the first mile was not as
fast as I figured," said McNair. "Other than that, I
was glad I was up there by myself. I like that
cushion. I like to feel like I don't have to run as
hard all the time because on the hills and things it
is hard run with someone beside you." Edmond
Memorial's Brady Schmiedeberg ran well to capture second with Bartlesville's Blake Culp edging Edmond Memorial's Marc Shumate for third
in the same time.

Power Rankings

Jenks claimed the top spot in the final Girls Power Ranking, notching a 12:33.9 average team time over the ORU course to second place McGuinness' 12:40.5. Westmoore was a close third at 12:42.9 and Class 2A champion Plainview is fourth.

Edmond Memorial gets the nod for the boys with an average time of 16:59.9 with Mustang second at 17:15.7, Jenks third at 17:16.1 and McGuinness fourth with 17:23.3.

Both of the top team times, boys and girls, were out the sixth fastest times on the ORU course over the past 10 years.




