

Also in this issue are the results of the Junior High All Star meet along with a great bunch of photos shot by Roger Taylor.



# 1999 2A-A State Meet

It was a perfect day for running and a good day for sophomores as three of them defended state titles during the Class A-2A O.S.S.A.A. State High School Cross Country Championships October 23rd at the Gordon Cooper Technology Center in Shawnee.

All four individual winners set the stage for team titles. Plainview runners Jesse Gordon and Patrick McGuire gave coach Jerry Naylor a belated birthday present (his 61st was the day before), capturing their second state title each—both were 3A champs last year—while leading the Indians to a pair of 2A team crowns. Beth Hooten of Canton repeated in Class A girls as the Tigers dethroned four-time defending champ Velma-Alma. Senior Lucian Bliss of Carnegie was the only non-sophomore winner in leading the Wildcats to the Class A boys team title.

## 2A Boys

McGuire covered the 5 km course in 15:53 for the top boys time of the day, outdistancing runnerup Ryan Bickerstaff of Alva by 12 seconds. Chisholm's Steve Sawyer (last year's champion), Plainview's Randy Womack and Travis Pearman of Stroud rounded out the top five.

"Bickerstaff was strong the last mile and I tried to surge at two miles," said McGuire, who completed an undefeated season. "I wanted to follow the pack the first mile and see how it goes and it went exactly according to plan."

"Coming in I had some doubts about winning, but I felt pretty good and we had a great course and perfect weather. I would say 90 percent of cross country is mental. You've got to have it in your head you can do it."

Plainview lost in all three previous meetings with Watonga's No. 1-ranked boys, which put four runners in the top 10 but still couldn't pull off the win. It was the first ever state championship for the Indian boys who all ran in war paint and Mohawk hairdos. Plainview scored 32 points while Watonga had 49, defending champion Chisholm was third with 70 and Heritage Hall was fourth with 93.

"I knew it would be close," Naylor said. "When all five of our runners started running together, I knew we had a shot."

## 2A Girls

As expected, the top-ranked Plainview girls took home the team title. Four of the top six runners were Indians, led by the No. 1-ranked Gordon. Her time of 11:27 was the best of the day as she beat teammates Aja Clark by nine seconds in second, Stephanie Merlyn fourth and Jacie Jones sixth. It was all the Indians needed. Plainview scored 31 points to runnerup Watonga's 66 with Lindsay in third with 84, Lexington fourth at 126 and defending champ Tishomingo fifth with 146.

Gordon led from 300 meters on with Watonga's No. 2-ranked Kimbri Lettkeman finishing third and Amanda Moore in fifth.

"Kimbri went out with me and I just tried to keep going," said Gordon. "She was worrying me, but after the first 800 meters she started slowing down and I led the rest of the way."

"Last year we were second as a team and it feels good to be first. We were worried about Watonga, but we won every meet this year except the big meet at SMU. That's the only time I lost."

## A Boys


Carnegie's Bliss atoned for his regional loss to Oklahoma Christian's Erin Rooney with a 17-second margin of victory for the title. He led the top-ranked Wildcats of coach Keith Phillips to a 46-point win, 26-72, over Oklahoma Bible, putting five runners in the top 16. Defending champion Oklahoma Christian was third at 108, with Velma-Alma fourth at 123 and Okfaha fifth with 127.

"Last year I was running with a pulled hamstring," said Bliss. "This year I wanted to go out fast, set the pace and make everybody catch me. I was third and boxed in until about 700 meters. Then I got out and started putting distance between me and other people."

"I didn't have any problems, but I was hop-

ing to win by more, actually. I just ran on all guts because I've wanted this so much since the end of last track season.'

Boise City's Andy Hegwood finished third with Burlington's Jacob Davis fourth and Stratford's Cody Wood fifth.

## A Girls

Canton's one-two punch of defending champion Hooten and runnerup Nancy Gray gave the Tigers of coach Kris Gore their first-ever state championship with a 53-59 win over defending champion Velma-Alma. The win deprived the top-ranked Comets from claiming their fifth consecutive team title. Beaver was a distant third with 111, Timberlake fourth at 127 and Central Sallisaw fifth with 130.

Hooten, who won state crowns at 800 and 1600 meters as a freshman, led side-by-side with Gray for most of the race, pulling away for a two-second win in the end. Hooker's Jessi Robertson was third with Hydro-Eakly's Crystal Sweeney fourth and Buffalo's Cassie Prophet was fifth, becoming the first-ever Bison to finish in the top five at the cross country state meet.





# ORU Cross-Country Course

## Recent Best Performances

by George Hall

The state meet for 3A - 5A will be held at ORU again this year, for the 4th year in a row and the seventh time in the last eight years. It might be interesting to look at the best performances of previous teams and individuals, to use as a yardstick for comparison to the present crop of athletes.

Now, I know all the objections about the difficulty in comparing cross-country times from year to year, i.e. the course is only measured approximately, the course may change from year to year, the weather conditions may be different, athletes in the last race may have to slop through the muddy areas created from the first races, etc. Nonetheless, I think we can make a fair comparison for the races held on the ORU course.

The course has been wheeled each year to be sure it is close to the distances, and even though minor changes have occurred in the course the basic layout has not changed.. The course always starts and ends at the same approximate locations, and runs a loop that is constrained by the ORU property boundary. Because of this, there just isn't much room for variation in the overall scheme of the course.

While we can't compare performances as close as we can for track events, we can still rank the athletes by their performance and produce a list in rank order that is probably valid within a range of several seconds. If we assume that all the variations that could occur from year to year are equivalent to no more than a 40 meter difference, then the precision of this ranking should be within about 5-6 seconds.

So, if an athlete is listed with a time of five seconds faster than another athlete, then that athlete probably had a better performance on the ORU course even though they may have competed in separate years. Of course, if the comparison is between two athletes who competed the same year, or between two teams who competed the same year, then the listed ranking is certainly correct.

I only had limited data from the last eight years at ORU, which includes the ORU classic ("pre-state") meets held from 1993 - 1999, and the state meets held from 1992 - 1998 (1995 was at Norman). Just for comparison, the top three team times at Norman in 1995 were: (girls) 1. McGuinness, 11:55; 2. Velma-Alma, 12:04.4; and 3. Guthrie, 12:18.6. (boys) 1. Edmond Memorial, 16:59.4; 2. Jenks, 17:11.0; 3. McGuinness, 17:19.4.

If anyone can provide more details I will update this ranking. In the following lists, "ORU" refers to the ORU Classic ("pre-state") meet, while the state meet is simply listed as "state."

### Best Team Performances

The compilation of best team performances was obtained by averaging the times of

the top five runners from the winning teams. In some cases, a team may have placed high but the listed results did not go deep enough to allow me to have the times of all five of their scoring runners. Therefore, it may be possible to add to this list if previous year's results are available somewhere in their entirety. No team was listed more than once, even if separate teams from the same school would have made the list.

### XC Trivia; Does the Fastest Team Always Win?

Seems obvious that the team with the fastest average times would always win, right? WRONG! Cross-country scoring is based on the finish position of each of the five scoring runners, and sometimes the team with the faster average time loses because their five runners did not place as well as the other team.

It is rare, but can happen. It happened in 1998 when the Edmond Memorial boys averaged about 0.3 seconds per runner faster than Jenks, yet Jenks won by one point. But the most interesting occurrence of this was in 1997 when the Sapulpa girls won the state meet, but runnerup Westmoore averaged 3.0 seconds faster! Westmoore had a very fast #1 runner, but Sapulpa had better team depth and managed to get their five runners across the line before Westmoore's fifth runner crossed.

Cross-Country is indeed a team sport, and the performance of the fifth runner is often more important than the performance of the first runner.
