Here it is, the end of September again and we're past the halfway point for the season. I still can't get used to the small school state meets being so early. It seems that they just get started racing and then it's all over. It's also a shame that the 3A-2A-A regionals are conflicting with the Chile Pepper CC Festival in Fayetteville. That's always been a favorite of mine and this year Oklahoma's best two teams won't get to go (Plainview girls and Watonga boys).

Speaking of great meets. The 64th Annual Cowboys Jamboree is being held in Stillwater September 30th on the Oklahoma State cross country course. This is the oldest consecutive cross country race in the nation and always draws a bunch of the top teams in the country. Over 3,000 runners last year from 250 teams. A great opportunity to see some great racing on a great course.

The Oklahoma Track Coaches Association will again be sponsoring an All-Star dual with Arkansas at the University of Arkansas' dedicated cross country facility (the same location for the Chile Pepper CC Festival) on Saturday, November 11. Coaches for the meet are David Morton, McGuinness (girls) and Mike McGarry, Mustang (boys). Nominations are open and should be made to either coach as soon as possible.

I'm happy to report that new subscriptions have shown a definite improvement so far and it gives me a reason to be encouraged about the future of *Oklahoma Track & Field News*. We're certainly not out of the woods - we're still a long way away from 800 subscribers - but it's a start. Who's on Top!?

The Power Rankings (see Rankings Section in this issue) make an attempt to combine all classes of schools and determine the top 10 teams. The OSSAA school size classification for cross country is listed below:

Class Designation	# of Larger Schools
5A - 32 largest schools	0-31
4A - next 32 largest schools	32-63
3A - next 64 largest schools	64-127
2A - next 64 largest schools	128-191
A - all remaining schools	192+

Because the 5A schools are larger than the 4A schools, they have a greater student population from which to procure athletes, and they should have more athletes than a 4A school. Having more athletes means a greater chance of having enough athletes out for cross-country to field a competitive team.

Therefore, just by the statistics, it is unlikely that a 4A team could be competitive with 5A teams in cross-country (or in any sport). As the table above shows, for a randomly chosen 4A school there are at least 32 and as many as 63 schools with a larger student population. The chances of a randomly chosen 3A school competing well with the larger schools is highly unlikely, because there are at least 64 and as many as 127 schools that are larger. And the odds against a 2A school competing successfully with the larger schools are very high indeed, because for any given 2A school there are between 128 - 191 schools with potentially more athletes.


Given these simple facts, it isn't hard to conclude that it is highly unlikely that any 2A school could ever be ranked among the top 10 high school cross-country teams in Oklahoma. And it would be virtually impossible for 2 teams in the 2A division to be ranked in the top 10.

Ok, by now a lot of you can see where I am going with all this buildup. Let's get right down to it; **Plainview** and **Watonga** are not only ranked among the best schools in the state, they are ranked on top! Plainview girls lead all schools in the power ranking, and the Watonga boys lead the boy's rankings. Plainview boys are ranked No. 7 in the Power Ranking. David has beaten Goliath, the mouse has beaten the elephant; this is big news.

The power rankings aren't easy to do, because the smaller schools and larger schools usually compete in different races, so you can question their validity. However, Plainview's girls beat the Jenks girls in the SMU meet, and if you "combine" the small school and large school races at the OBU meet, Plainview would have also won (though it would be very close).

Watonga's boys team recently beat Edmond Memorial at the Edmond Dog Pack run, and three of their runners finished ahead of Edmond's No. 1 runner. So, it appears that the Power Rankings are justified. How can two teams in 2A be ranked not only in the top 10 listing of all teams, but No. 1 in the state when there are so many schools larger than they are? That's a question that every cross-country coach in the state should be asking right now.

I don't know all the answers to Plainview's and Watonga's success, but as a casual observer I can see a few common elements. Many of their athletes participate in the USATF and AAU summer track programs. By so doing, they not only maintain their conditioning, they maintain their competitive edge. Most cross-country athletes train over the summer, but for

most the training consists of LSD (long slow distance). While this helps to establish a base, it does nothing to improve speed. Some would argue that LSD is just junk mileage and that running slow only teaches the athlete to run slow.

The Plainview athletes compete in the summer program through their own (Plainview) USATF/AAU club, while many of the Watonga athletes compete as part of the Jenks America USATF/AAU club. Obviously (at least it seems obvious to me), both Plainview and Watonga have a coaching staff that cares about the sport. This is of paramount importance; you cannot achieve at this high a level with a "part-time" coach.

Another element common to both programs is that each appears to have the backing of a strong parent support group. I don't know if they have "organized" parent booster clubs, but I do know that a lot of their parents attend the meets and care about the sport. Parental support is absolutely essential to any cross-country program in Oklahoma high school. Even

the 5A schools do not have enough money to fully fund a good meet schedule with a few overnight trips, and parent booster clubs are called on to make up the deficit. The combination of caring coaches and strong parental backing usually leads to an enhanced "status" level for the cross-country athletes, as they will get more hometown recognition for their success.

Let me be one of the first to congratulate both Plainview and Watonga for their success. Regardless of how the final Power Rankings end up at the end of the season, these two teams are already winners. I suggest that all of you offer your congratulations to the coaching staff, athletes, and parents of these two programs when you get a chance. And while you're at it, find out just what it is that makes them so good (and tell me, but no one else). I hope that their over-achievement is an example to other Oklahoma high schools.





Athletes will be selected for the team based on their performance during the high school cross-country season. To provide an unbiased selection mechanism, emphasis will be given to each athlete's comparative performance on the ORU cross-country course. All athletes have an opportunity to compete on this course October 6 at the ORU meet, and the larger schools will have a second opportunity at the state meet October 28. Consideration will also be given to outstanding athletes who are unable to compete at the ORU course this year. The final season cross country rankings contained in this magazine will be one of the primary factors used in team selection. Athletes selected for the team must be able to fulfill the following criteria: 1.) age - will be or is age 17 or 18 in 2000, cannot be 19 in 2000 2.) must be 1 of the overall top 10 cross-country athletes in Oklahoma (8 will be selected) 3.) willingness to continue workouts and be in top condition for the December 2nd race 4.) must join the AAU as a member of the Team Oklahoma club (cost \$10, can join at state AAU meet) 5.) must compete in the state AAU XC meet in Tulsa on Nov 11 as a member of the Team Oklahoma club 6.) must rent or purchase the team uniform 7.) must have signed permission from High School coach and parents for participation

Brian Yockers (Jenks High School) and Tracy Simmons (Union High School) have agreed to be the team's primary coaching staff. George Hall (Team Oklahoma Masters) is coordinating the team logistics. Additionally, the high school coach of each selected participant will be asked to be a team coach and to ensure their athlete(s) continue working out and are in top condition for the meet.

The team is planning for a course preview workout and time trial on Saturday November 18, to familiarize the team with the national meet course and to gauge the conditioning level of the athletes. Transportation will be provided from Tulsa, and team members will be strongly encouraged to attend.
