
Admission was again charged by the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Activities Association at both regional meets and it seemed to work very well, again. The fee is collected at the parking entrance and I didn't hear any grumbling by fans used to getting their cross country free. This is important income—the only income—for the sport and helps to make cross country more self-sustaining.

The annual cross country All-Star meet sponsored by the Oklahoma Track Coaches Association will again be held on the University of Arkansas' course in Fayetteville on Saturday November 11. Coaches for the Oklahoma teams are Mustang's Mike McGarry (boys—405-375-7363 school or 787-2585 home) and McGuinness' David Morton (girls—405-842-6638 school or 341-0877 home). Nominations need to be phoned to either coach. Only runners whose coaches are members of the OTCA are eligible.

Rankings in this issue were updated following the 3A-2A-A regional meets last weekend. The 5A-4A rankings were not changed even though there were several meets. The next regular issue will contain full regional results for all classes, 3A-2A-A state meet results and the final 5A-4A team and individual rankings.

It has been a real challenge to get the rankings done this season by myself and there is no way I will be able to handle the track season without some help. We're looking for a paid staff person to help with both *OT&FN* as well as our main publication, *Amateur Wrestling News*. State Meet Preview

The first State Cross Country Championships of the new millennium will be held October 21 at Shawnee's Gordon Cooper Vo-Tech. Regionals were held at two sites (Lindsay and Chisholm) for classes 3A-2A-A with the top seven teams from each regional qualifying for the state meet along with the top seven non-team qualifying individuals.

The weather was a bit stormy with rain showers earlier in the day and most of the top-ranked teams can through the competition unscathed.

Four individual champs return to defend titles along with one 1998 champ. Plainview juniors Patrick McGuire and Jessie Gordon will each be favored to win their third state title while Canton two-time winner Beth Hooten is ranked No. 3. There should be some new team champions this year as

only half the field of defending champions will enter the fray as the No. 1 team in their division.

Class A Girls (1:00 p.m.)


Defending champion Canton beat Velma-Alma 53-59 to end the Comets four-year grip on the state title last year but coach Kris Gore's team has been soundly beaten by a newcomer to the top ranks. Oklahoma Bible Academy under coach Paul Dunbar has stormed to the top here behind a solid team led by freshman Heidi Schmidt. Schmidt was decisive in her regional win over defending champ Hooten and teammate Nancy Gray at Chisholm and will enter the meet with the No. 1 ranking.

Oklahoma Bible Academy won the regional handily from No. 2 ranked Canton, 39-65 while No. 3 Carnegie barely scraped by Sallisaw Central to win the south regional at Lindsay, 84-99. There are a lot of independent runners in this race and with no team claiming more than two runners in the top ten, you can expect a score of 75 points to be enough to win the race. Beaver seems to be the best of the rest with Sallisaw Central hot on their heels.

With Schmidt in the No. 1 slot she is followed by Hooten and Gray with teammate senior Melissa Dell and Carne-

gie's Kishia Sharp rounding out the rest of the top five. This is a class where there are always lots of surprises at the state meet and it shouldn't be any different this year.

Class A Boys (1:30 p.m.)

Carnegie won huge over Oklahoma Bible Academy last year, 26-72 and coach Keith Phillips looks to have a comfortable margin again this year over No. 2 Velma-Alma with four runners ranked in the top ten and six in the top fifteen. Oklahoma Bible slips to a distant third with Oklahoma Christian School and Beaver hoping to break into the team medals. Coach Jerry Loveall's Comets have been improving all season, moving into the No. 2 slot for the first time, but they probably lack the horsepower to dethrone the Wildcats after losing to them 23-51 at the south regional.

Individually this will be one of the best races of the day. Oklahoma Christian's Erin Rooney and Hooker's Luke Voth, both juniors, will be in a three-way heat with Boise City senior Andy Hegwood, last year's pre-meet favorite. Rooney took the north re-

gional with a margin of 21 seconds over Carnegie's Erick Nimsey while Hegwood edged Voth by one second in the south regional. Maysville's Jacob Deviney rounds out the top five.

2A Girls (2:00 p.m.)

You might as well mail the title to defending champion Plainview. Like I said in the last issue, the only way coach Jerry Naylor's team can be beat is if their team bus breaks down on the way to the meet and they don't make it to the starting line. I know this hurts the feelings of the Watonga fans but this Plainview team has been the top ranked team in the state all season, regardless of class. Coach Jim Coleman has built a really strong team at Watonga and the Eagles claim three of the top ten individual slots but the Indians are untouchable and could easily score 20 points or less in their stampede to the title. The Eagles are an easy No. 2 with Caney Valley—second in the south regional—leading the pack in the race for the leftovers—third.

Plainview junior, two-time champ Jessie Gordon, missed a meet or two with some foot problems but she was in good form at the south regional. Watonga's Kimbri Lettkeman is strong and capable but she will have her hands full with the rest of the Plainview team—Stephanie Merlyn, Sonja Peterson and Aja Clark—that would love to see a one through

five finish. The Eagles Amanda Moore rounds out the top five and will look to spoil the Indians perfect party.

2A Boys (2:30 p.m.)

The team order is reversed here with the Watonga boys being one of the top team in the state since a win over Edmond Memorial in the middle of the season. Coach Coleman has four runners ranked in the top ten. Plainview upset the Eagles last year, 32-49, after Watonga had been No. 1 most of the season, never losing to the Indians along the way.

It won't be likely that the Indians can pull that off again this year and they will truly have their hands full trying to hang on to second with Chisholm, winner of the north regional, a strong contender for the silver. Heritage Hall—second in the south regional— notched a win over Chisholm early in the season and the Chargers will be hoping to pick off a set of third place medals as the top three team beat each other up.

Patrick McGuire is the top runner in the state and is in a league by himself in this class. Watonga fields a group of strong contenders led by sophomores Marshall MedicineBear (winner of the north regional), Justin Edsall and Jason Coleman with Plainview's Michael Stewart rounding out the top five.

3A Girls (3:00 p.m.)

Marlow, one of the top programs in the state over the past decade, looks to unseat defending champion Elk City, winner over the Outlaws last year, 30-50. Coach Corey Holland has continued the Outlaw tradition and looks to have the No. 1 slot sewed up after a solid south regional win over Elgin. The Elks drop out of the top five, making room for some newcomers with Jay—winner of the north regional—leading the pack which includes Edmond Deer Creek and Elgin.

This will also be one of the better individual races with Marlow junior Chandra Huckabay getting the nod for the No. 1 slot over Jay's Lora Loy. Both were winners in their respective regional but Huckabay beat Loy at the pre-state meet two weeks ago to claim the spot. Outlaw Cheri Lemons, Classen's Magen Long and Elk City's Ashley Brimage round out the top five.

3A Boys (3:30 p.m.)

Elk City coach Mark Heard will be looking to grab a third state title here after watching Little Axe notch a 49-56 win over Anadarko last year with the

Elks a distant third at 73 after entering the meet ranked No. 1. This year the Elks—winners in the south regional—look to have a pretty good grip on the title with Anadarko—second in the south regional—and Little Axe—winner of the north regional—in a deal heat for the runnerup spot. Elgin finished second behind the Elks in the south regional and could sneak into third if someone slips up.

Last year Elk City defending champ Chris McHone was de-throned by teammate Travis Johnson after being ranked No. 1 all season. This year they go into the meet with the same ranking after finishing one-two in the regional and it should be a very interesting race. Anadarko teammates Jhavar Swift and Jesus Rubio join north regional winner Billy Barnum of Tuttle to round out the top five.




