

2000 3A-2A-A Cross Country State Meet

The rain waited until 15 minutes before the start of the first race at 1:00 p.m. and then continued on all day to make the first cross country state championships of the new millennium a very soggy affair. Held for the second year on the course at the Gordon Cooper Technology Center in Shawnee, October 21st, the rain didn't seem to dampen the crowd's enthusiasm as fans braved the continual drizzle to cheer for their runners.

All six of the No. 1 ranked teams easily claimed their titles with the Plainview girls and Elk City Boys turning in the top team average times of the day. Double winner Watonga was second in team times as they were the only school to claim both boys and girls titles this year.

Plainview juniors Jessie Gordon and Patrick McGuire each captured their third straight individual title and are now primed to join the very elite group of four-time winners next year. All six top-ranked runners claimed titles as well. The top ten finishers in each class are named All-Staters with the next five gaining honorable mention All-State honors.

In spite of the rain the meet was efficiently run by Oklahoma Baptist University coach Ford Mastin and his group of OBU runners and students.

A Girls

Oklahoma Bible Academy had been looking forward to this day all season as coach Paul Dunbar's runners held down the No. 1 ranking most of the year. Led by top-ranked freshman Heidi Schmidt, the Trojans dumped defending champion Canton by 45 points, 52-97, to claim their first ever cross country title. No. 8 ranked Depew was a bit of a surprise, finishing a solid third with 113 points.

Schmidt won in the second fastest time of the day—11:52—over the Canton duo of juniors Nancy Gray and two-time defending champion Beth Hooten. Woodland's McKale Davis was fourth and OBA's Melissa Dell was fifth.



A Boys

Carnegie put four runners in the top nine to easily repeat as champions here, beating Velma-Alma 39-75 for the gold. Oklahoma Christian school was third with 89. The Carnegie win was the second for the school and coach Keith Phillips.

Top-ranked junior Erin Rooney took top individual honors over Hooker's Luke Voth and Boise City's Andy Hegwood who finished third for the second straight year. Maysville's Jacob Deviney was fourth and Beaver's Jazz Carreon was fifth.

2A Girls

Plainview ran away with the title here, as expected, though the score got a little closer after the Indians' No. 5 ranked Aja Clark fell and was unable to complete the race. The Indians of coach Jerry Naylor still put five in the top nine to outpoint Watonga 23-42 for the gold.

Junior Jessie Gordon won her third state title with the fastest time of the day—11:24—while Watonga sophomore Kimbri Lettkeman finished a strong second, leading the Eagles to the silver team medals with three runners in the top ten. Plainview's Sonja Petersen and Stephanie Merlyn were third and fourth while Watonga's Amanda Moore finished fifth.

2A Boys

Plainview's Patrick McGuire claimed his third straight title here, notching the fastest time of the day with a 16:06, but the defending champion Indians slipped to third, losing a sixth runner tie breaker to

Chisholm for the silver medals. Watonga easily took the team title in spite of an injury to one of their top runners, Jason Coleman, ranked No. 4 but limping in at 22nd due to a stress fracture. Coach Jim Coleman's Eagles held the top spot in the Power Ranking during the middle of the season but Elk City claimed the fastest team title of the day with an average of 17:06 to the Indians 17:16.

A tight team race for second through fourth was forecast and in the end only four points separated second place Chisholm and fourth place Heritage Hall.

Finishing second and third in the individual race were Watonga's Justin Edsall and Marshall MedicineBear with Plainview's Matt Stewart fourth and Chisholm's Kyle Teft fifth.

3A Girls

Marlow's top ranked junior Chandra Huckabay led start to finish to pace the Outlaws of coach Corey Holland to their first title since 1996. They put three in the top ten to score 57 points to runner up Jays' 115. Glenpool won the sixth runner tie breaker with Victory Christian to claim the bronze medals.

Bristow's Krystal Billings edged Marlow's Cheri Lemons at the line for second with Mannford's Carrinne Harlan fourth and Jay's Lora Loy fifth.

3A Boys

Elk City claimed the top two spots again this year, only with the order reversed with seniors Chris McHone and Travis Johnson finishing one-two. McHone won as a sophomore but finished second to Johnson last year. The Elks put five in the top ten to claim their fourth title in five years for coach Mark Heard, beating runnerup Elgin 30-66 for the gold with Anadarko third at 89 points.

Anadarko's Jesus Rubio finished third with Marlow's Jon Davis fourth and Tuttle's Billy Barnum fifth.



The 2000 5A-4A State Cross Country Championships—the first the new millennium—will be held October 28 at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa for the eighth time in the last nine years. Regionals were held October 21 at two sites (Ponca City and Woodson Park in Oklahoma City) with the top seven teams from each regional qualifying for the state meet along with the top seven non-team qualifying individuals.

Two individual champs return to defend titles led by McGuinness senior Amanda Jordan who will be shooting to become only the second runner in state history to win four state cross country titles. She is joined by Jenks sophomore Brianna McLeod who won the 5A crown as a freshman and has come within one second of Jordan's Oral Roberts' course record this year.

Any of these teams could pull together an effort to share the podium with Jenks at the awards ceremony.


