John David "J.D." Martin (born March 19, 1939) is an American former track and field athlete who competed in the pole vault and decathlon. His greatest achievement was a decathlon gold medal for the United States at the 1963 Pan American Games. He set a games record of 7335 points in the process, also a personal record. His personal record for the pole vault was 4.75 m (15 ft 7 in). His best finish nationally was third in the decathlon at the 1961 USA Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

Raised in Erick, Oklahoma, at collegiate level he competed for the Oklahoma Sooners and won the NCAA Men's Division I Outdoor Track and Field Championships in 1960. He quickly moved into coaching and served as the track and cross country running coach at the University of Oklahoma from 1964 to 1997. Over this period, he was coach to two Olympic gold medallists, 22 individual national champions and 171 collegiate All-Americans. He was inducted into the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame in 2005.

His alma mater set up the J.D. Martin Invitational track meet in 2006 in his honour.

Jill Lancaster just completed her 8th year at Northwestern. She spent first two years as the Cross-Country coach and her sixth year as the Women's Track & Field coach. Most recently finished 5th in the Great American Conference.

Lancaster was the Director of Men's and Women's Track and Field at Division I Troy University over the course of the 2008-2014 seasons.

Prior to her position at Troy, Lancaster was the Co-Head Men's and Women's Track and Field Coach at the University of Oklahoma from the year 1997 to 2005. Her first head coaching position came in 1988 when she held the position of Head Women's Track and Field and Cross-Country coach until 1993 at Toledo University. She also held two other assistant Track and Field or Cross-Country jobs at other major Division I schools including Kansas State and the University of Kansas.

Lancaster has coached several athletes throughout her illustrious Division I career who have advanced to the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. During her tenure as Co-Head Men's and Women's Track and Field Coach at the University of Oklahoma she assisted in coaching numerous Division I All-Americans as well as leading the Sooners to a fourth-place finish at the 2004 NCAA Midwest Regional, which stood as the highest finish at the event in program history.

In addition to her time as a collegiate coach, Lancaster also brings success to the Rangers at the national level as she coached two Olympic Trial qualifiers in the 100, 200 and long jump competitions. She has also had a hand in developing multiple individuals who have qualified for the NCAA Outdoor Track and Field Championships. A ground-breaking athlete in the state of Oklahoma herself, Lancaster was a three-time AIAW Division 1-A All-American Selection in the 600-meter dash, mile and two-mile relays. Lancaster still holds the all-time school record for the outdoor 400-meter hurdle with a time of 59.03.

Following her collegiate career for the Sooners, Lancaster placed 14th at the 1988 United States Olympic Trials in the Heptathlon. In 2009 she was named as one of the Top 10 Female Athletes of the Century by the Drake Relays. 1988 was a big year for Lancaster as she was also inducted into the Drake Relays Hall of Fame.

"Throughout my career the community has supported me in all my endeavors as a student, athlete and coach. The time is right and a good fit to get back to the sport I

love. It is a true homecoming for me. Ride, Rangers, Ride.

Bo Farrow

4 time State Champion at Broken Arrow and school record holder for both the Shot Put and Discus. 2018 graduate of Pittsburg State University. 12 time All-American in the Throws and Football. 2018 Division 2 Indoor National Champion in the Shot Put. Fifth year coaching. 11 state qualifiers. 8 State placers. 2 Runner-ups. 1 school record holder at Broken Arrow in the Girl's Discus.

Courtney Gougler

Courtney had a successful high school career in the discus winning the state championship both in 2003 & 2005 for Glencoe, OK. After high school Gougler competed for Cowley College where she was a 2-time National Champion in the Discus and Shot Put her freshman year, which led her to a full scholarship at the University of Wyoming and eventually she competed her senior year at Oklahoma State University, where she threw the Discus, Shot Put, & Hammer/Weight throw. After a successful NCAA career she went back to Cowley College to coach the throws. During her time at Cowley College, Gougler coached five national champions in the throws events and over 100 national qualifiers in the Discus, Shot Put, Hammer, Indoor Weight Throw and Javelin.

Gougler currently lives in Oklahoma City, working at Bishop McGuinness Catholic High School as the admissions and enrollment coordinator and freshmen counselor. She currently coaches and trains several athletes privately as well as competes in the Scottish Highland Games.

Jarret Kachel

Born and raised in Hooker, OK. Grew up in a Track and Field/Cross Country family running for my Dad, Stan Kachel, and the Hooker Bulldogs. Ran collegiately for Garden City Community College in Kansas and West Texas A&M. I have raced every distance from 400m to half marathon at a high level, though I was always best in the middle-distances. Stayed on to be the Graduate Assistant Coach at WT while I worked on my Master's degree. Came home to teach biology, and was the Assistant Coach for Dad for his last three years at Hooker and his last three State Championship teams. Became the Head Coach for Boys and Girls Cross Country and Track and Field in 2018. Since then, I have strived to maintain the excellence and tradition of our program at Hooker. Have now won 7 State Championships as the Head Coach of the Bulldogs (3 Girls' CC, 2 Boys' CC, 1 Girls' Track, 1 Boys' Track). My degrees are in Wildlife Biology, and I am an avid hunter, outdoorsman, and conservationist. I still run daily and feel the need to demonstrate the benefits of physical fitness and the virtue of discipline. Besides running, I love to climb, and am currently working my way through all of the Colorado 14,000ft peaks.

Andrew Pletan

This will be my second season as head coach for the boys track team at Edmond North High School, and I just completed my third season as the head boys coach for our Cross Country team.

I ran high school cross country and track at Owasso from 2004-2008, and I started coaching in 2017 at Cheyenne Middle School, a feeder to Edmond North. In 2020 I was given the opportunity to coach at the high school starting as an assistant cross country coach and middle distance track coach.

I have been lucky to coach a back-to-back state champion in the 800m, eight of the ten fastest 1600m runners in school history, 19 boys under five minutes, the school record holder in the 3200m, and the first 4x800m team at North to break 8:00 since 2007. Our boys cross country team won their first team championship in school history in 2022, and had the first individual champion in school history in 2023.
